Things to Know

- Collin Morikawa wins fourth PGA TOUR title, carrying a 54-hole lead/co-lead onto victory for the first time
- Morikawa joins Tiger Woods as the only players to win a major and WGC before turning 25
- Viktor Hovland moves to No. 2 in the FedExCup, 38 points behind leader Patrick Cantlay
- No player has won multiple tournaments through 20 weeks, the longest streak to start a season since 1994 (Nick Price won his second tournament in the 21st week of the season)
- Scottie Scheffler finishes highest among the five players in the field who competed at the 2015 NCAA Division I Men's Championship at The Concession Golf Club
- Seven bogey-free rounds recorded during the week, but none in the final round

- Wins fourth PGA TOUR title in his 41st TOUR start at the age of 24 years, 22 days (2019 Barracuda Championship, 2020 Workday Charity Open, 2020 PGA Championship, 2021 World Golf Championships-Workday Championship at The Concession)
- Joins Tiger Woods as the only player to win a major and WGC before turning 25
- Four PGA TOUR wins is the most by a player currently under 25
- Seventh player to win four (or more) PGA TOUR events, including a major championship, under the age of 25 (Tiger Woods, Jack Nicklaus, Jordan Spieth, Rory McIlroy, Justin Thomas, Jerry Pate)
- Wins 550 FedExCup points and moves to No. 14 in the FedExCup; marks his 10th career week inside the top 15 of the FedExCup standings
- Secures the win after holding his second 54-hole lead/co-lead on TOUR (2019 3M Open/T2)

- Becomes 12th 54-hole leader/co-leader at WGC-Workday Championship to win (since 1999) and eighth third-round leader/co-leader to win on TOUR in 2020-21
- Third WGC appearance this week (Won/2021 Workday Championship, T42/2020 Workday Championship, T20/2020 FedEx St. Jude Invitational); becomes eighth player to win first World Golf Championships title in three or fewer WGC starts (most recent: Russell Knox/2015 HSBC Champions)
- First American player to win in the state of Florida since 2019 The Honda Classic (Keith Mitchell); previous five winners in Florida: Tyrrell Hatton, Sungjae Im, Paul Casey, Rory McIlroy, Francesco Molinari
- Three top-10s in nine starts this season (Won/Workday Championship, T7/Sony Open in Hawaii, T7/Sentry Tournament of Champions)
- Made 27 birdies, most of any player in the field; most birdies in a WGC stroke-play event is 29, by three players (Scott McCarron/2002 Workday Championship/6th, Martin Kaymer/2013 HSBC Champions/T8, Hideki Matsuyama/2016 HSBC Champions/Won,)
- Led the field in Strokes Gained: Approach The Green (9.544) and Strokes Gained: Tee to Green (12.526)

Miscellaneous Notes

- Two-time TOUR winner **Viktor Hovland** (T2/-15), the only player to start birdie-birdie in the final round, moves to No. 2 in the FedExCup, 38 points behind leader Patrick Cantlay; was attempting to become first player since Adam Scott (2016 The Honda Classic) to make a quadruple bogey en route to a PGA TOUR victory; marks his second WGC start (T59/2020 FedEx St. Jude Invitational)
- 36-hole leader **Brooks Koepka** (T2/-15) was looking to become first multiple winner this season (2021 Waste Management Phoenix Open); no player has won multiple tournaments through 20 weeks, the longest streak to start a season since 1994 (Nick Price won his second tournament in the 21st week of the season)
- 2014 FedExCup champion **Billy Horschel** (T2/-15) came up short in his search for his first individual stroke-play title since the 2017 AT&T Byron Nelson; now owns three top-10s in 19 WGC appearances (T2/2021 Workday Championship, T9/2020 Workday Championship, T9/2019 FedEx St. Jude Invitational)
- Scottie Scheffler (5th/-14) finishes highest among the five players in the field who competed at the 2015 NCAA Division I Men's Championship at The Concession Golf Club: Bryson DeChambeau (T22/-6), Thomas Detry (T28/-5), Jon Rahm (T32/-4), Xander Schauffele (T39/-1)
- Rory McIroy's (T6/-12) bid to join Dustin Johnson as the second player to win all four World Golf Championships titles in his career faded after a front-nine 37; played the front nine even for the week and the back nine 12-under
- Defending champion **Patrick Reed** (T9/-11) came up short in his attempt to win the WGC-Workday Championship at a different course for the third time (2014/Trump National Doral, 2020/Club de Golf Chapultepec)
- Cameron Smith (T11/-10), who sat T2 through 36 holes, followed a Saturday 77 with a Sunday 67
- Tony Finau (14th/-9) entered the week searching for his career-best fourth consecutive top-10 in a standard strokeplay event on TOUR; had recorded three in a row on two previous occasions, most recent: 2nd/2018 THE NORTHERN TRUST, T4/2018 WGC-Dell Technologies Match Play, T8/2018 BMW Championship
- Carlos Ortiz (T15/-8) chipped in for eagle at the par-5 17th before holing a birdie putt from 82 feet, 7 inches, his longest putt of his career, en route to a 6-under 66, the low round of the day; marks his fifth final-round of 66 or better in his last eight starts
- **Hideki Matsuyama**'s (T15/-8) TOUR-leading streak of 225 holes without a three-putt came to an end at hole No. 5 when he missed from 6 feet, 1 inch
- With a pair of eagles (Nos. 3 and 12), **Bryson DeChambeau** (T22/-6) records two eagles in a round for the second time this season (R2/Shriners Hospitals for Children Open)
- Xander Schauffele (T39/-1) ended his streak of 16 consecutive top-25 results on the PGA TOUR; since 1990, only two players have longer streaks in this category (Tiger Woods/four times, most: 38, Rory McIlroy/17)
- World No. 1 and reigning FedExCup champion **Dustin Johnson** (T54/+5) posts a 6-over 78 and his first finish outside the top-12 on TOUR since withdrawing from the 2020 3M Open following a first-round 78
