Things to Know

- Reigning FedExCup champion and No. 1 seed Dustin Johnson eagles the par-5 16th and birdies the par-3 17th on his way to a tie with Scotland’s Robert MacIntyre
- Defending champion Kevin Kisner defeats Justin Thomas, 2 and 1; at 2-0-0 for the week, Kisner has now won his last eight matches in the WGC-Dell Technologies Match Play, which represents the longest current streak (Tiger Woods owns the tournament record with 13)
- Two of the 22 players making their first appearance at the event are undefeated through two rounds of group play: Mackenzie Hughes (48) and Dylan Frittelli (64)
- Largest margin of victory in the second round: 5 and 4 (Matt Fitzpatrick over Corey Connors)
- Ten players are undefeated through two rounds of group play (by seed): Jon Rahm (3), Patrick Cantlay (10), Ryan Palmer (24), Abraham Ancer (27), Kevin Kisner (34), Sergio Garcia (39), Mackenzie Hughes (48), Matt Kuchar (52), Ian Poulter (60) and Dylan Frittelli (64).

Group Format

- The 64-player field is divided into 16 four-player groups for round robin competition
- Players receive one point for a win in group play and half a point for a tie
- The player in each group with the highest point total at the end of group play advances to the 16-player, single-elimination matches; in the event two or more players are tied for the lead in their group following group play, there will be a hole-by-hole playoff starting on No. 1
- Saturday morning: Round of 16; Saturday afternoon: Quarterfinals; Sunday morning: Semifinals; Sunday afternoon: Championship Match and Consolation Match

- Reigning FedExCup champion Dustin Johnson eagled the par-5 16th and birdied the par-3 17th to pull even with Scotland’s Robert MacIntyre before the two matched pars on No. 18, resulting in a tie; Johnson, the 2017 tournament champion, failed to advance out of group play in 2018 and 2019
- Making his tournament debut and just the second WGC start of his career, Adam Long held off a late charge from Kevin Na (won Nos. 14 and 16) to secure a 2-and-1 victory

Scenarios

- If MacIntyre and Johnson each win or each tie, it will force a playoff between those two
- If MacIntyre wins and Johnson ties or loses, MacIntyre advances
- If Johnson wins and MacIntyre ties or loses, Johnson advances
- If Johnson loses and Long wins, Long advances
- If Johnson ties and Long wins, it will force a playoff between those two
- Na is eliminated

- Defending champion Kevin Kisner was 4-up through seven holes against 2021 PLAYERS Champion Justin Thomas before securing a 2-and-1 victory; Kisner has now won his last eight matches in the WGC-Dell Technologies Match Play, which represents the longest current streak (Tiger Woods owns the tournament record with 13)
- 2013 champion Matt Kuchar defeated Louis Oosthuizen 1-up to finish two rounds of group play at 2-0, marking just the second time in his career (2019) he's done so in the tournament's group play format

- After falling 2-down through three holes, Jon Rahm reached a 3-up lead on Shane Lowry through 15 holes and held on for a 2-up victory; making his third start at the event, Rahm finished runner-up to Dustin Johnson in 2017, but failed to advance out of group play in 2018 and 2019; he is making the 15th WGC start of his career this week
- After earning his second match victory in the event and first since 2011 on Wednesday, Ryan Palmer defeated Sebastian Munoz, 2 and 1, to reach 2-0-0 on the week

- Lowry and Munoz are eliminated.

- After winning the 18th hole to finish tied with Collin Morikawa in the first round of group play, J.T. Poston defeated Billy Horschel 4 and 2 on Thursday to reach the top of his group with a 1-0-1 record
- In a match of Cal-Berkeley alumni, Max Homa and Collin Morikawa squared off in the second round of group play, with Homa overcoming a 3-down deficit through seven holes to secure a 2-and-1 victory; Homa entered the week with three top-10 finishes on the PGA TOUR in his last five starts, including a win at The Genesis Invitational

- After losing to No. 58 seed Antoine Rozner in the first round of group play, 2-up, Bryson DeChambeau defeated Si Woo Kim (2 and 1) on Thursday despite losing holes 9, 10 and 11 to fall 1-down
- With a 4-and-3 victory over Rozner, Tommy Fleetwood is looking to advance to the Round of 16 for the first time since 2015; he failed to advance past group play in 2017, 2018 and 2019

- Xander Schauffele won Nos. 16 and 17 on his way to a 2-and-1 defeat of two-time tournament champion Jason Day; Schauffele has not advanced out of group play in two prior appearances at the event (2016, 2018); this marks the fourth time in group play that Day has failed to win one of his first two matches (2015, 2017, 2019)
- Dallas native and former University of Texas golfer Scottie Scheffler bogeyed the final hole to finish tied with Andy Sullivan; Scheffler was 2-up with two holes to play

- Patrick Reed has advanced out of group play twice since the format changed in 2015 (2016, 2018) and has never made it past the Round of 16 in six prior starts at the event
- Reed won the opening hole versus Christiaan Bezuidenhout and remained at least 1-up through the remainder of their match on his way to a 2-and-1 victory

- Bubba Watson was 3-down to Joaquin Niemann through 13 holes before winning 14, 15 and 16 to tie the match; Watson lost the par-3 17th to Niemann, but won the final hole to finish in a tie

- In his 48th career match at the WGC-Dell Technologies Match Play, Sergio Garcia never trailed against Tyrrell Hatton, defeating him 3 and 2; the victory was the 27th of his tournament career
- Lee Westwood, who entered the week with two runner-up finishes in his last three starts on the PGA TOUR, was tied with Matt Wallace through nine holes before winning Nos. 10, 11, 12 and 13 on his way to a 5-and-3 victory.

- Making his tournament debut, Canada's Mackenzie Hughes moved to 2-0-0 for the week with a 4-and-3 win over Webb Simpson in the second round of group play; Hughes, who won The RSM Classic in 2017, posted top-10 finishes in two of his first five starts in the PGA TOUR's 2020-21 season, but has yet to notch one since
- With a 3-and-2 victory over Talor Gooch, Paul Casey secured the 28th win of his career at the WGC-Dell Technologies Match Play – good for fourth all-time in tournament history, tied with Rory McIlroy

- Rory Mcllroy earned the 28th win of his WGC-Dell Technologies Match Play career with a 4-and-3 victory over Lanto Griffin; the win came one day after a 6-and-5 loss to Ian Poulter, which marked his second-largest margin of defeat in tournament history (in 2011, lost to Ben Crane, 8 and 7, in Round of 32)
- Ian Poulter converted a 15'3" birdie putt on the 18th hole to beat Cameron Smith, 1-up; Poulter has now won 31 matches in his WGC-Dell Technologies Match Play career, putting him two behind the all-time record of 33 (Tiger Woods)
