Things to Know

- Russell Henley records a second-round 64, extends lead to four strokes
- Henley's 36-hole score of 126 ties Stewart Cink (RBC Heritage) for the lowest on TOUR this season
- Rickie Fowler (MC) fails to qualify for the FedExCup Playoffs for the first time in his 12-year PGA TOUR career
- Four players at T5 or better entered the week outside the top 125 in the FedExCup standings and three are currently projected to qualify for the FedExCup Playoffs: Rory Sabbatini (T2), Scott Piercy (T2) and Justin Rose (T5)
- Three players that entered the week between Nos. 122-125 in the FedExCup standings missed the cut and are currently projected to miss the FedExCup Playoffs: Ryan Armour, Patrick Rodgers, Bo Hoag

- Third player with multiple 36-hole scores of 126 or better in his career (first: 2013 Sony Open in Hawaii), joining Matt Kuchar and Steve Stricker
- One stroke shy of tournament record for 36-hole score (125, Carl Pettersson, 2008)
- Second 36-hole lead/co-lead of the season and sixth of his PGA TOUR career (1-for-5 to date)

- Three-time PGA TOUR winner (2013 Sony Open in Hawaii, 2014 The Honda Classic, 2017 Houston Open)
- Entered the week No. 46 in the FedExCup standings and will qualify for the Playoffs for the ninth consecutive season

Miscellaneous Notes

- Making his first start on TOUR since earning the silver medal in the Olympic Men's Golf Competition, Rory Sabbatini
 (T2/-10)ties his career-low 36-hole score on the PGA TOUR with rounds of 66-64; Sabbatini also carded 130 through
 two rounds on TOUR at the 1999 BellSouth Classic and 2003 Shriners Children's Open
- 2011 Wyndham Championship winner **Webb Simpson** (-T2/10) has finished T3 or better in each of the last four years at the event (3rd/2017, T2/2018, 2nd/2019, T3/2020)
- Sedgefield member and Duke graduate **Alex Smalley** stands T8 playing on a sponsor exemption; Smalley is making his fourth start on TOUR this season and has made all four cuts (best result this season: T14/2020 Corales Puntacana Championship)
- Charlotte resident and Virginia Tech graduate **Johnson Wagner** made birdie on each of the last four holes to make the cut on the number
- Two players who entered the week outside the top 125 in the FedExCup standings and stood T2 after the first round went on to miss the cut (Michael Thompson/64-74, Ted Potter, Jr./64-77)
- Rickie Fowler misses the cut and fails to qualify for the FedExCup Playoffs for the first time in his 12-year PGA TOUR career
- Defending champion Jim Herman misses the cut after rounds of 72-68
- Matthew Wolff (MC) plays the par-5 15th in 1-under for the week (par-birdie) to clinch the Aon Risk Reward Challenge title for the 2020-21 season
