Things to Know

- Russell Henley maintains lead at Wyndham Championship following third-round 1-under 69; represents his third 54-hole lead/co-lead of the season
- Henley would become the first wire-to-wire winner of the event since Brandt Snedeker in 2018 (sixth since 1941)
- All three players who held the outright lead after each of the first three rounds of an event this season failed to win
- Projected to move into the top 125: Scott Piercy (T3), Roger Sloan (T3), Rory Sabbatini (T3)
- Projected to fall out of the top 125: Ryan Armour (MC), Patrick Rodgers (MC), Bo Hoag (MC)
- Justin Rose, one of nine players to qualify for the FedExCup Playoffs each season of the FedExCup era, is currently projected No. 126

- Holds third 54-hole lead/co-lead of the season and fifth of his career; converted one of those instances into a win (Won/2013 Sony Open in Hawaii, T2/2014 Dell Technologies Championship, T3/2020 THE CJ CUP @ SHADOW CREEK, T13/2021 U.S. Open, TBD/2021 Wyndham Championship)
- Would become the first wire-to-wire winner on TOUR since Nick Taylor at the 2020 AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am
- Would become the sixth player since 1941 to win the Wyndham Championship in wire-to-wire fashion; first since Brandt Snedeker in 2018
- All three players who led outright after each of the first three rounds of an event this season failed to win (Sam Burns/The Genesis Invitational, Louis Oosthuizen/The Open Championship, Harris English/World Golf Championships-FedEx St. Jude Invitational)
- Finished T9 at the 2020 Wyndham Championship, his best result in four prior starts at the event
- Three top-20s in his last four starts, highlighted by a T11 at the John Deere Classic (has not played since The Open Championship)
- Best result this season: T3, twice (THE CJ CUP @ SHADOW CREEK, The Honda Classic)
- Three-time PGA TOUR winner (2013 Sony Open in Hawaii, 2014 The Honda Classic, 2017 Houston Open)
- Entered the week No. 46 in the FedExCup standings and will qualify for the Playoffs for the ninth consecutive season

Miscellaneous Notes

- After entering the week with six straight missed cuts, Tyler McCumber (2nd/-12) trails by three strokes following a
 third-round 66; currently No. 98 in the FedExCup standings, guaranteed to advance to the Playoffs for the first time
 in his sophomore season; finished runner-up at the 2020 Corales Puntacana Championship for his best finish in 45
 career TOUR starts
- 2021 Puerto Rico Open champion **Branden Grace** (T3/-11) is set for a return to the FedExCup Playoffs for the fifth time in six seasons (No. 165/2019-20); third-round 64 marked best round since closing with the same score at The RSM Classic in November (T30)

- Roger Sloan (T3/-11) posts his career-low 54-hole score at 11-under 199; has posted 200 on three occasions, most recently at the 2020 Wyndham Championship (finished T31)
- **Kevin Kisner** (T3/-11) has top-10 finishes in three of his last four starts at the Wyndham Championship (T8/2014, T10/2016, *T42/2017*, T3/2020) and has yet to miss a cut in seven starts; after entering the week No. 69 in the FedExCup standings, currently projected No. 55 in bid for sixth trip to the TOUR Championship in the last seven seasons
- Kevin Na (T3/-11) seeks third-consecutive top-10 finish at the Wyndham Championship (T10/2016, T4/2017)
- One week following a third-place finish at the Barracuda Championship, **Scott Piercy** (T3/-11) in search of fifth PGA TOUR title (most recent: 2018 Zurich Classic of New Orleans/with teammate Billy Horschel)
- Making his first start on TOUR since earning the silver medal in the Olympic Men's Golf Competition, **Rory Sabbatini** (T3/-11) poised for fourth top-10 finish in eight starts at the Wyndham Championship
- Adam Scott (T9/-10) is projected to move from No. 121 to No. 106 in the FedExCup standings following a third-round 6-under 64; seeking to advance to the Playoffs for the 15th straight season
- 2011 Wyndham Championship winner **Webb Simpson** (T9/-10) has finished T3 or better in each of the last four years at the event (3rd/2017, T2/2018, 2nd/2019, T3/2020); third-round 70 snapped a streak of 18 straight rounds in the 60s at the event and included his first triple bogey in 49 rounds at Sedgefield Country Club (par-4 14th)
- Needing a win to advance to the FedExCup Playoffs, Will Zalatoris (T15/-9) cards a bogey-free 6-under 65, his eighth
 consecutive round in the 60s
