**Summary:** Cameron Beckman overcame a three-stroke deficit to defeat **Ernie Els** by one stroke and claim his first PGA TOUR Champions victory at the 2021 Dick's Sporting Goods Open. With the victory, Beckman becomes the eighth rookie to win during the 2020-21 season.

#### Cameron Beckman, 67-69-68 – 204 (-12)

- Starting the day three back, Beckman carded five consecutive birdies on the back nine en route to a one-shot victory over Ernie Els.
- The victory was Beckman's first in a PGA TOUR-sanctioned event since the 2010 Mayakoba Golf Classic– a span of 11 years, 4 months and 13 days.
- His five consecutive birdies on Nos. 10-14 matches his career-record set at the 2008 Walt Disney World Golf Classic.
- The 51-year-old becomes the eighth rookie to win during the 2020-21 season, joining Brett Quigley, Ernie Els, Shane Bertsch, Jim Furyk, Phil Mickelson, Alex Cejka and Mike Weir.
- Beckman has now recorded three top-10s in 15 starts in his 2020-21 rookie season on PGA TOUR Champions.
- The San Antonio, Texas resident made 428 starts on the PGA TOUR and won three times:

- 2001 Sanderson Farms Championship
- 2008 Safeway Open
- 2010 Mayakoba Golf Classic
- With the victory, Beckman earned an exemption on PGA TOUR Champions through the end of the 2022 season. He also earned a berth into next week's U.S. Senior Open Championship in Omaha, Nebraska and a two-year exemption into the season-opening Mitsubishi Electric Championship at Hualalai.
- Beckman earns a check for \$307,500 and moves from No. 65 to No. 39 in the Charles Schwab Cup standings.

#### **Ernie Els, 68-65-72 – 205 (-11)**

- After starting the day with a three-shot lead, Els carded three birdies and three bogeys to finish with an even-par 72 in the final round.
- It's the second consecutive top-5 for the World Golf Hall of Fame member who finished fifth at last week's Bridgestone SENIOR PLAYERS Championship in Akron, Ohio.
- Through 24 events this season, Els has recorded 13 top-10s and two victories (2020 Hoag Classic, 2020 SAS Championship).
- Els is currently ranked No. 2 in Charles Schwab Cup standings with \$2,115,079 (\$76,588 behind leader Jerry Kelly).

#### **Other Notes**

- Defending champion **Doug Barron** made the only eagle of the week on the par-5 No. 3 and posted a 1-under 71 on Sunday (T16).
- **Brandt Jobe** (T13) matched the lowest round of the week with a 7-under 65 on Sunday.
- At age 70, **Dick Mast** bettered his age with a final-round 2-under 70. It was Mast's second start of the year after gaining entry via the open qualifier, where he carded a 7-under 65.
- **Kevin Sutherland**, who made history when he carded a 13-under 59 in the second round of the 2014 DICK'S Sporting Goods Open, posted a 3-under 69 on his birthday (July 4) and finished the week T42.
- Two-time B.C. Open winner (1985, 1987) and Horseheads, New York native **Joey Sindelar** finished the week T66 (+5).
