Field Overview (as of 9/15/21)

PGA TOUR Champions heads to Sioux Falls, South Dakota this week for the Sanford International at Minnehaha Country Club. All three past champions are in the 81-player field: **Miguel Angel Jiménez** (2020), **Rocco Mediate** (2019) and **Steve Stricker** (2018).

The field also includes 26 of the top 30 players in this week's Charles Schwab Cup standings. After this week, there are three tournaments remaining in the regular season before the start of the three-event Charles Schwab Cup Playoffs.

2020 Recap

During a final round that saw as many as five players tied for the lead, **Miguel Angel Jiménez** eagled and birdied the par 5s on the back nine to post 5-under 65 and a one-shot victory at the 2020 Sanford International. With the win, he became the 39th player with at least 10 wins on PGA TOUR Champions. **Steve Flesch**, who fired 63 in the final round, took runner-up honors, while **Bernhard Langer** and **Steve Stricker** finished T3.

Straight to the Straits

This week's Sanford International field includes several Ryder Cup connections for the U.S. Team and Team Europe, as next week both teams head to Whistling Straits in Wisconsin for the 43rd playing of the biennial event.

U.S. Team Captain **Steve Stricker** is one of five players who have a role in next week's Ryder Cup. U.S. Vice Captains **Fred Couples**, **Jim Furyk** and **Davis Love III** will tee it up in Sioux Falls this week, along with Europe Vice Captain **Robert Karlsson**.

Eight players have served as captain for either the U.S. Team or Team Europe in a previous Ryder Cup, including the U.S. Captain from five of the last seven Ryder Cups.

O Captain! My Captain!

The week before serving as captain for the U.S. Ryder Cup Team, 2018 Sanford International champion **Steve Stricker** will make his first start since late June on PGA TOUR Champions. He won that tournament, posting a six-shot triumph over **Jerry Kelly** at the Bridgestone SENIOR PLAYERS Championship. Stricker, who also won the Chubb Classic in April, has nine top-10s in 11 starts on PGA TOUR Champions this season. He has finished in the top five on seven occasions during the 2020-21 Champions Tour season.

Stricker, making his third start at the Sanford International, finished T3 last year after winning the event in 2018. In six rounds at Minnehaha Country Club, he has a 65.83 stroke average and has shot 67 or better every time.

Jimenez Set to Defend Title

Reigning Sanford International champion **Miguel Angel Jimenez** will make his first start since The Senior Open Championship presented by Rolex in July, when he finished runner-up. He enters the week with three consecutive top-10 finishes on PGA TOUR Champions and has 12 top-10s in 26 starts this season. Jimenez has at least one win in each of his seven seasons on PGA TOUR Champions, including an active streak of three consecutive two-win seasons.

Furyk Goes for Win No. 4

Fresh off three consecutive top-10 finishes, **Jim Furyk** looks to pick up the fourth win of his rookie season on PGA TOUR Champions when he tees it up this week. Furyk is the only player with three wins this season, capturing The 2020 Ally Challenge, 2020 PURE Insurance Championship and 2021 U.S. Senior Open. Furyk, currently No. 3 in the Charles Schwab Cup standings, has 13 top-10s in 20 starts.

Langer Looks for Another 'W'

Bernhard Langer enters the week with back-to-back top-10 finishes and sits atop the Charles Schwab Cup standings. During the 2020-21 season, Langer has 20 top-10s in 32 starts, including a victory at the 2020 Cologuard Classic. In all,

Langer owns 41 wins on PGA TOUR Champions, second-most all-time behind Hale Irwin (45). Making his third start at the Sanford International this week, Langer's best finish is T3 (2020).

Couples Back in Action

Fred Couples, a 13-time winner on PGA TOUR Champions, aims for his first victory since 2017. This season, Couples has three runner-ups and has finished in the top 10 in five of his last six events. He has 12 top-10s in 17 starts during the 2020-21 season.

Local Connections

Two players in this week's field have ties to South Dakota. **Tom Byrum**, who was born in Onida, South Dakota, is making his fourth start at the Sanford International. His best finish was T7 in 2019. Byrum, who joined PGA TOUR Champions in 2010, owns three runner-up finishes on Tour. **Rich Beem**, who won the 2002 PGA Championship, is making his 12th start on PGA TOUR Champions this week. He was an assistant professional at The Country Club of Sioux Falls before joining the PGA TOUR.

Charles Schwab Cup Race Tightens

The top three players in the Charles Schwab Cup standings are separated by less than \$9,000 with two months to go before the champion is crowned. **Bernhard Langer** holds the top spot, while **Jerry Kelly** and **Jim Furyk** round out the top three. **Ernie Els** and **Miguel Angel Jimenez** represent Nos. 4 and 5, respectively.

After this week's event, three tournaments remain in the regular season: PURE Insurance Championship (September 24-26), Constellation FURYK & FRIENDS (October 8-10) and SAS Championship (October 15-17). After the regular season concludes, the Charles Schwab Cup Playoffs will begin, consisting of the Dominion Energy Charity Classic (October 22-24), TimberTech Championship (November 5-7) and the Charles Schwab Cup Championship (November 11-14).
