Field Overview (as of 10/13/21)

The race to the finish of the 2020-21 Super Season takes a stop in Cary, North Carolina for Wildcard Weekend at Prestonwood Country Club for the 21st-annual SAS Championship. This week's 83-man field includes 2020 SAS Champion and World Golf Hall of Fame member Ernie Els as well as six additional Hall of Famers. They will be joined by rookies Padraig Harrington and Stuart Appleby, as well as seven additional past tournament champions: Jerry Kelly (2019), Bernhard Langer (2018, 2012), Colin Montgomerie (2017), Tom Lehman (2015), Kirk Triplett (2014), Kenny Perry (2011) and Tom Pernice Jr. (2009).

Wildcard Weekend leads to Charles Schwab Cup Playoffs

Wildcard Weekend offers another opportunity for players to earn one of the 72 postseason berths into the fifth-annual Charles Schwab Cup Playoffs. The leading 72 players on the money list will advance to the playoffs. Should a player post a top-10 finish this week but finish the regular season outside the top-72 on the Charles Schwab Cup money list, he will earn the Wildcard and qualify for the playoffs.

This week's 83-player field includes 20 players that are currently outside the top 72 including **Corey Pavin** (74th), **Davis Love III** (75th), **Michael Allen** (77th), **Fred Funk** (78th), **Steve Pate** (80th) and **David Frost** (81st).

Defending Champion Returns

At last year's SAS Championship, **Ernie Els**'s final-round 66 earned him his second PGA TOUR Champions win with a one-shot victory over Colin Montgomerie after making a 40-foot birdie putt on the final hole. Els most recently finished T4 at Constellation FURYK & FRIENDS after carding rounds of 69-67-71. Entering this week, Els currently sits No. 4 in the Charles Schwab Cup standings after carding two wins (2020 Hoag Classic, 2020 SAS Championship) and 16 top-10s in 32 starts this season.

Staying Strong at No. 1

Two-time SAS Championship winner **Bernhard Langer** (2012, 2018) has led the Charles Schwab Cup standings for 18 weeks this season and most recently finished T7 last week at Constellation FURYK & FRIENDS. Langer has one win (2020 Cologuard Classic) and 22 top-10 finishes in 35 starts during the 2020-21 wraparound season. Since joining the PGA TOUR Champions full time in 2008, the five-time Charles Schwab Cup champion has led the standings 151 weeks and has surpassed \$1 million in winnings for the 10th consecutive year.

Playoffs! Did somebody say playoffs?

After the SAS Championship, the top-72 players will qualify for the Charles Schwab Cup Playoffs. This week's field includes 20 players who need to play their way into the Playoffs, which begins Oct. 18-20 at the Dominion Energy Charity Classic in Richmond, Virginia. For the 20 players outside the top-72, there are two ways to qualify for the Playoffs. First, they can earn enough money to finish the regular season in the top-72 on the money list. This scenario is most possible for **Corey Pavin**, **Davis Love III**, **Michael Allen** and **Fred Funk**.

The second way into the Charles Schwab Cup Playoffs is via the Wildcard, which would go to a player who posts a top-10 this week but finishes outside the top-72 on the money list after the SAS Championship. The field includes 15 players that trail the 72nd-ranked player by more than \$54,600 (money for a solo 10th-place finish).

Peaking for the Playoffs

- **Jim Furyk** Serving as tournament host, Furyk finished last week's Constellation FURYK & FRIENDS T4 after carding three consecutive 69s. He remains No. 2 in the Charles Schwab Cup standings after earning three wins (2020 The Ally Challenge, 2020 PURE Insurance Championship, 2021 U.S. Senior Open) and 14th top-10 in 22 starts this season.
- Padraig Harrington Harrington made his debut last week at the Constellation FURYK & FRIENDS after turning 50 on August 31. While on the PGA TOUR, he won five times, was named Player of the Year in 2008 and was the European Ryder Cup Team Captain last month at Whistling Straits.
- Miguel Angel Jimenez Jimenez finished 2nd last week at Constellation FURYK & FRIENDS and held onto his No. 5 spot on the Charles Schwab Cup standings. This season, Jimenez has earned two wins (2020 Mitsubishi Electric Championship at Hualalai, 2020 Sanford International) and 14 top-10 finishes in 28 starts.

21 Years

The SAS Championship at Prestonwood Country Club celebrates its 21st anniversary this week. Prior to the SAS Championship's first year in 2001, Prestonwood Country Club hosted a Korn Ferry Tour event from 1994-1997. Notable finishers from those Korn Ferry Tour events include **David Toms** (T3/1995), **Tom Byrum** (T19/1995), Joe Durant (T23/1996), **Steve Flesch** (T2/1997) and **Chris DiMarco** (T12/1997). Eight past champions will compete in this week's tournament including **Ernie Els** (2020), Jerry Kelly (2019), **Bernhard Langer** (2018, 2012), **Colin Montgomerie** (2017), **Tom Lehman** (2015), **Kirk Triplett** (2014), **Kenny Perry** (2011) and **Tom Pernice Jr.** (2009).

Race to the Charles Schwab Cup Playoffs

Entering the final tournament of the regular season, **Bernhard Langer** remains in the top slot of the Charles Schwab Cup standings for his second consecutive week and 18th overall week at No. 1 this season. No. 2 **Jim Furyk** is \$127,632 behind Langer and No. 3 **Jerry Kelly** sits \$95,659 behind Furyk. **Ernie Els** and **Miguel Angel Jimenez** round out the top five. This week's field includes eight of the top-10 players in the Charles Schwab Cup standings.

The Charles Schwab Cup Playoffs begin with the Dominion Energy Charity Classic (October 22-24) before the TimberTech Championship (November 5-7) and conclude with the Charles Schwab Cup Championship (November 11-14).
