Summary: Doug Barron birdied each of the last three holes to shoot 30 on the back nine and win the Shaw Charity Classic by two strokes over Steve Flesch.

Doug Barron, 64-64-64 – 192 (-18)

- Barron, who held a one-stroke lead entering the final round, posted 6-under 64 for the third consecutive day, matching his lowest round on PGA TOUR Champions.
- After bogeying No. 1, Barron made back-to-back birdies on Nos. 4 and 5 to post 34 on the front nine. After eagling the par-5 11th, Barron birdied each of the last three holes to fire 5-under 30 on the back nine.
- This is Barron's second win on PGA TOUR Champions (38 starts). He won his second event on Tour, the 2019 DICK'S Sporting Goods Open, as an open qualifier.
- With his win, Barron is exempt through the 2022 season on PGA TOUR Champions and earns a spot into the 2022 Mitsubishi Electric Championship at Hualalai.
- Barron led the field in eagles (3): No. 4 (Round 1), No. 18 (Round 2) and No. 11 (Round 3).

- Barron improves to 2-for-3 when holding a lead/co-lead entering the final round on PGA TOUR Champions. He also led entering the final round of his victory at the 2019 DICK'S Sporting Goods Open.
- For the first time in his PGA TOUR Champions career, Barron recorded all three rounds in the 60s.
- In 28 starts this season on PGA TOUR Champions, Barron has five top-10s, including a pair of third-place finishes.
- This was Barron's second appearance at the Shaw Charity Classic (T22, 2019). While on the PGA TOUR, Barron made seven starts at the RBC Canadian Open, most recently in 2006. His best finish was T44 in his debut in 1997.
- During his PGA TOUR career (1996-2009), Barron recorded 12 top-10 finishes, and his best was T3 at the 2005 AT&T Byron Nelson.

Steve Flesch, 64-65-65 – 194 (-16)

- Flesch made six birdies and no bogeys on his first 15 holes, but bogeyed the par-3 16th en route to 5-under 65.
- His runner-up finish marks the second time during his PGA TOUR Champions career he has placed second (2020 Sanford International).
- Flesch led the field in birdies (18).
- This is the first time Flesch has broken 70 in all three rounds during a tournament on PGA TOUR Champions.
- Flesch's 194 (-16) is his lowest three-round total score since joining PGA TOUR Champions in 2017.
- Flesch was seeking his second win on PGA TOUR Champions (2018 Mitsubishi Electric Classic).
- The Shaw Charity Classic marked Flesch's 27th tournament this season. He has two runner-up finishes and four top-10s.

Other Notes

- **Billy Andrade** and **Brandt Jobe** finished T3 at 13-under 197, marking each player's best finish this season on PGA TOUR Champions.
- **Billy Mayfair**, who held the first-round lead, earned his best finish of the 2020-21 season (5th).
- Canadian **Stephen Ames** finished T6 at 11-under 199.
- Making his debut at the Shaw Charity Classic, Canadian **Mike Weir** finished T9 at 9-under 201. During the final round, Weir shot a bogey-free 2-under 68.
 - Other Canadians in the field: **David Morland IV** (T16), **Dennis Hendershott** (T47)
- **Keith Clearwater** posted the round of the day with a bogey-free 8-under 62, one shy of tying the course record. It matched the low round of the week (Billy Mayfair, R1). Clearwater finished T37.
