Today – Areas of fog will linger this morning across the region with clearing expected between 8-9am. Waves of dense fog will be possible during this time. Mostly sunny skies will be in place once the fog dissipates with temperatures this morning in the lower 50s climbing into the mid-70s by this afternoon. Light and variable winds this morning will trend S/SE peaking around 12-18 mph with gusts around 22 mph. A slight chance of showers will develop this evening ahead of a cold front moving into the area from the west.

Extended forecast – Thunderstorms will develop after 10pm tonight and will continue into Friday morning. Storms will be capable of hail and damaging wind gusts. An isolated tornado cannot be ruled out. Gradual clearing is expected tomorrow morning after 7am giving way to partly cloudy to mostly sunny skies for the afternoon. Dry conditions will then continue through this weekend. Low temperatures will be in the mid-60s tomorrow morning trending into the mid-40s over the weekend. High temperatures in the mid-70s tomorrow will trend into the mid to upper 60s Saturday before returning to the mid-70s on Sunday. The strongest winds of the period will be tomorrow afternoon behind the cold front generally W/SW to W around 15-20 mph with gusts around 25 mph.
