Things to Know

- The 2022 Korn Ferry Tour schedule continues with the Simmons Bank Open for the Snedeker Foundation, the 11th tournament of the 26-event schedule
- This year marks the sixth edition of the Simmons Bank Open for the Snedeker Foundation, which made its first appearance on the Korn Ferry Tour schedule in 2016
- The Grove is hosting the Simmons Bank Open for the Snedeker Foundation for the second consecutive year, as the tournament's previous four installments were played at Nashville Golf & Athletic Club
- Reigning champion Austin Smotherman eventually finished No. 25 on the 2020-21 Korn Ferry Tour Regular Season Points List and earned his first PGA TOUR card for the 2021-22 season
- Carl Yuan, who finished T2 at last year's Simmons Bank Open for the Snedeker Foundation, is the only player to achieve #TOURBound status this season, having crossed the 900-point threshold the Korn Ferry Tour is currently using as its fail-safe threshold for players to finish among The 25 and earn a PGA TOUR card at regular season's end (see The Chase for PGA TOUR Cards section for more details)
- Yuan enters this week at No. 1 on the Regular Season Points List, a position he took over and has held since his win at the Chitimacha Louisiana Open presented by MISTRAS (concluded March 20)
- **Seonghyeon Kim**, currently No. 2 on the Regular Season Points List, could become the second player to cross the #TOURBound threshold with a made cut (and completion of the tournament) this week
- 49-year-old Timothy O'Neal is playing via Korn Ferry's sponsor exemption, which was awarded for his
 runner-up performance at the <u>APGA Tour at Farmers Insurance Open this past January</u>; he won three
 times on PGA TOUR Latinoamérica (twice in 2013, once in 2016), was the 2020 APGA Tour Player of the
 Year, and has two victories on the APGA Tour this season as he prepares for a run at PGA TOUR
 Champions once he turns 50 this August
- Notable PGA TOUR players who enjoyed success at the Simmons Bank Open for the Snedeker Foundation:
 - Scottie Scheffler (2019 runner-up) No. 1 in Official World Golf Ranking, four-time PGA TOUR winner (all in 2021-22 season), including a victory at the 2022 Masters Tournament
 - o Cam Davis (2018 Champion) won 2021 Rocket Mortgage Classic
 - Lanto Griffin (2017 Champion, T2 in 2018) won 2019 Hewlett Packard Enterprise Houston Open
 - Abraham Ancer (2017 runner-up) won the 2021 FedEx St. Jude Championship
 - Mito Pereira (T3 in 2017, T9 in 2021) earned the Three-Victory Promotion to the PGA TOUR with three victories during the 2020-21 season

- o Joel Dahmen (T3 in 2016) won 2021 Corales Puntacana Championship
- o Ryan Brehm (T6 in 2019) won 2022 Puerto Rico Open

Local Ties

- Five Tennessee natives are in the field: Eric Axley (Athens), Grant Hirschman (Memphis), Braden
 Thornberry (Germantown), and sponsor exemptions Jason Millard (Murfreesboro) and Nolan Ray
 (Nashville)
- Four Tennessee residents are in the field: **Dawson Armstrong** (Brentwood), Axley (Knoxville), and open qualifiers **Blake Maum** (Chattanooga) and **Cody proveaux** (Murfreesboro)
 - Since July 2020, proveaux has served as an assistant coach for the Middle Tennessee State
 University men's golf program; he will make his third career Korn Ferry Tour start this week, and
 his younger brother, Caleb proveaux, will make his sixth start of the season this week and gained
 entry into the field Tuesday afternoon
- Seven players played collegiately in the state of Tennessee: Armstrong (Lipscomb), John Augenstein (Vanderbilt), Axley (East Tennessee State), Erik Barnes (Austin Peay State), Will Gordon (Vanderbilt), Millard (Middle Tennessee State), and Ray (Tennessee)

Field Notes (as of 5/3/22)

- Field is headlined by 23 of the top-25 players on the Korn Ferry Tour Regular Season Points List, currently led by **Carl Yuan**
- Seonghyeon Kim (No. 140) and Yuan (No. 185) are the field's top players in the Official World Golf Ranking
- Nine of the first 10 champions of the 2022 season are in the field, with the lone exception being Brandon Matthews, who is playing this week's Wells Fargo Championship via a sponsor exemption
- Field includes 44 past Korn Ferry Tour winners with 59 total victories, led by Daniel Chopra and Heath
 Slocum with three apiece
- Field Includes nine PGA TOUR winners with 22 total victories, led by Ben Crane with five
- Eight players gained entry via Monday qualifying, led by Greystone Golf Club medalist Will Dickson, who
 previously Monday qualified for the Club Car Championship at The Landings Club this season, and Old Fort
 Golf Course co-medalists Lukas Euler, who previously Monday qualified for the LECOM Suncoast Classic
 this season, and Blake Maum, who qualified for the second consecutive week
 - Wes Homan qualified via the Greystone Golf Club site and will make his first PGA TOUR-sanctioned start since the 2019 Rocket Mortgage Classic, and his first Korn Ferry Tour start since the 2017 Chitimacha Louisiana Open presented by MISTRAS; he won on PGA TOUR Canada in 2014 and the 38-year-old's last full season on a PGA TOUR-sanctioned tour was 2015, after which he took a full-time job outside of golf to support his three children
 - o Riley Elmes, who qualified via the Greystone site, will make his first PGA TOUR-sanctioned start
- **Chip McDaniel** successfully Monday qualified into last week's Huntsville Championship and finished T13 for a spot in this week's field

- In the eighth event of the 2022 season, the Club Car Championship at The Landings Club, **Carl Yuan** became the first player to cross the 900-point threshold the Korn Ferry Tour is currently using as its fail-safe threshold for players to finish among The 25 and earn a PGA TOUR card at regular season's end
 - Upon receiving his PGA TOUR card later this year, Yuan will join Zecheng Dou and Xinjun Zhang
 as the only mainland Chinese players in history to earn PGA TOUR cards; Dou and Zhang both
 earned PGA TOUR membership for the first time as members of The 25 following the 2017 Korn
 Ferry Tour regular season
- Following the conclusion of the 23-event regular season at the Pinnacle Bank Championship presented by Aetna (August 11-14), 25 PGA TOUR cards will be awarded to the top 25 players on the <u>Korn Ferry Tour</u> <u>Regular Season Points List</u>, making those players "The 25"
- Another 25 PGA TOUR cards will be awarded through the three-event Korn Ferry Tour Finals at the conclusion of the Korn Ferry Tour Championship presented by United Leasing & Finance (September 1-4)
- Leading points earners of The 25 and Korn Ferry Tour Finals Points Lists receive fully exempt status for the 2022-23 PGA TOUR season and an exemption into the 2023 THE PLAYERS Championship, while The 25's leading points earner (regular season and Finals combined) receives the added bonus of an exemption into the 2023 U.S. Open Championship
- With 13 events remaining in the regular season, the Korn Ferry Tour is currently using 900 points as its fail-safe threshold for players to finish inside the top 25 of the Regular Season Points List and become #TOURBound (see above for the latest points list)

- Austin Smotherman led or co-led all four rounds en route to his first Korn Ferry Tour win, which propelled him to the final spot in The 25 at regular season's end
- Smotherman shared the 54-hole lead with **Brent Grant**, but closed with a 3-under 69 for a three-stroke victory; he was the only player in the field who posted four rounds in the 60s
- Smotherman followed a three-putt bogey at the par-4 16th with a chip-in birdie from the collection area left of the par-4 17th green, effectively sealing the victory
- Smotherman led last year's field in greens in regulation (59 of 72) and tied for second in fairway accuracy (49 of 56)
- Paul Haley II recorded his second runner-up finish of the season and fourth of his career; he has since logged a fifth runner-up finish at the season-opening 2022 The Bahamas Great Exuma Classic at Sandals Emerald Bay
- Carl Yuan recorded his third T2 finish of the 2020-21 season

Birdies on two of his final five holes moved David Skinns up to solo fourth, a season-high finish at the
time; he later rattled off four top-10s in the final five regular season events, punctuated by a win in the
regular season finale to secure his first PGA TOUR card

- Harrison Endycott earned his first professional victory (he turned professional in fall 2017) and became the ninth first-time winner through the first 10 Korn Ferry Tour events
- Endycott co-led after 18 holes and held a five-stroke lead after the third round, the largest 54-hole lead in a Korn Ferry Tour event since April 2019, making him the first player this season to lead or co-lead after 18, 36, or 54 holes and win the tournament
- Endycott's five-stroke margin of victory was the largest in a Korn Ferry Tour event since Cameron Young's five-stroke win at the 2021 NV5 Invitational presented by Old National Bank
- **Ben Taylor** posted his highest finish in PGA TOUR-sanctioned play since a T2 at the 2019 Nationwide Children's Hospital Championship on the Korn Ferry Tour
- **Erik Barnes** recorded his fourth top-five finish of the season; he remains the only player with made cuts in each of the first 10 events this season
- **Kris Ventura** led the field with 22 birdies and recorded his highest finish in a PGA TOUR-sanctioned event since a T4 at the 2020 Korn Ferry Challenge at TPC Sawgrass
- Rookie Quade Cummins logged a career-high finish in his eighth career Korn Ferry Tour start
