Extended forecast – A transition to a more humid and unstable airmass will begin to unfold across the Bahamas on Thursday with showers/T-storms becoming possible. A slow-moving front will then approach the Bahamas on Friday and linger over the region through the weekend. Timing out the highest chances for showers/T-storms remains tricky, so precipitation chances in the forecast will be capped at 40% each day Friday-Sunday until confidence increases. One or two of these day will likely see rain chances increased once timing of individual upper-level disturbances is solidified.
