#### Things to Know

- The Wichita Open Benefitting KU Wichita Pediatrics is one of four tournaments played every season since the Korn Ferry Tour's inaugural 1990 season, with this year marking the 33rd playing of the event
  - The other three events with such distinction are the Visit Knoxville Open, Price Cutter Charity
    Championship presented by Dr Pepper, and the Albertsons Boise Open presented by Chevron
  - Only the Wichita Open Benefitting KU Wichita Pediatrics, Price Cutter Charity Championship, and Albertsons Boise Open are set to enter their 33rd playing, as the Visit Knoxville Open was only contested once (2021) amid the 2020-21 combined season
- This will be the event's 21st consecutive year at Crestview Country Club
- Two of the most notable past champions of the Wichita Open Benefitting KU Wichita Pediatrics are Tom Lehman (1990) and David Duval (1993), who were both World No. 1s during their careers and won the 1996 and 2001 Open Championship, respectively
  - Earlier this year, Scottie Scheffler (T7 in 2019) joined Lehman, Duval, Jason Day, and Justin Thomas as the only Korn Ferry Tour graduates in history who rose to No. 1 in the Official World Golf Ranking
- Major championship winners David Toms (1995) and Jason Dufner (2001) also won in Wichita; Toms went on to win the 2001 PGA Championship, while Dufner won the 2013 PGA Championship
- Aaron Wise set tournament scoring records for 36-hole score (124), 54-hole score (tied Scott Piercy and Kevin Yu with 191), 72-hole score (259), and margin of victory (five strokes) in his 2017 victory, which he followed with 2017-18 PGA TOUR Rookie of the Year honors
- Harry Hall won his first career Korn Ferry Tour title at the 2021 Wichita Open Benefitting KU Wichita Pediatrics, holding off a late charge by Curtis Thompson for a one-stroke victory
- Hall, who won three weeks ago at the NV5 Invitational presented by Old National Bank will not defend his title, as he qualified for this week's U.S. Open at The Country Club
- Two past champions are in the field this week Brady Schnell (2018) and Rob Oppenheim (2015)
- Seven players have achieved #TOURBound status this season, having crossed the 875-point threshold the Korn Ferry Tour is currently using as its fail-safe threshold for players to finish among The 25 and earn a PGA TOUR card at regular season's end (see The Chase for PGA TOUR Cards section for more details)
  - Brandon Matthews, who will also play this week's U.S. Open, and Ben Griffin were the latest to cross the fail-safe threshold last week, joining Carl Yuan, Seonghyeon Kim, Byeong Hun An, and U.S. Open qualifiers Erik Barnes and MJ Daffue

#### **Local Ties**

- **Brad Hopfinger** played the 2007-08 season at the University of Kansas before he transferred to University of Iowa; he led the Jayhawks in scoring average and finished T7 at the 2008 Big 12 Championship
- Harry Hillier, who played collegiately for five seasons (2018-22) at University of Kansas, Monday qualified into this week's field
- Sponsor exemption **Gage Ihrig**, a Goodland High School graduate who played four seasons (2014-18) at Wichita State University, will make his third career Korn Ferry Tour start and first since 2019

### Field Notes (as of 6/14/22)

- Field is headlined by 14 of the top 25 players on the Korn Ferry Tour Regular Season Points List, currently led by **Carl Yuan** 
  - Five of the top 12 players on the Regular Season Points List are playing this week's U.S. Open –
    No. 4 MJ Daffue, No. 5 Brandon Matthews, No. 7 Erik Barnes, No. 8 Taylor Montgomery, No. 12
    Harry Hall while No. 2 Ben Griffin is an alternate
- Yuan is also the only player in the field ranked in the top 200 of the Official World Golf Ranking (No. 138)
- Field includes 44 past Korn Ferry Tour winners with 61 total victories, led by **Daniel Chopra** and last week's winner, **Robby Shelton**, with three apiece
- Field Includes past 10 PGA TOUR winners with 17 total victories, led by Aaron Baddeley with four
- Eight players gained entry into the field via Monday's open qualifier, including **Chip McDaniel**, who successfully open qualified for the third time this season, as well as **Ryan Grider** and **Norman Xiong**, both of whom successfully open qualified for the second time this season

- Following the conclusion of the 23-event regular season at the Pinnacle Bank Championship presented by Aetna (August 11-14), 25 PGA TOUR cards will be awarded to the top 25 players on the <u>Korn Ferry Tour</u> <u>Regular Season Points List</u>, making those players "The 25"
- Another 25 PGA TOUR cards will be awarded through the three-event Korn Ferry Tour Finals at the conclusion of the Korn Ferry Tour Championship presented by United Leasing & Finance (September 1-4)
- Leading points earners of The 25 and Korn Ferry Tour Finals Points Lists receive fully exempt status for the 2022-23 PGA TOUR season and an exemption into the 2023 THE PLAYERS Championship, while The 25's leading points earner (regular season and Finals combined) receives the added bonus of an exemption into the 2023 U.S. Open Championship
- With seven events remaining in the regular season, the Korn Ferry Tour is currently using 875 points as its fail-safe threshold for players to finish inside the top 25 of the Regular Season Points List and become #TOURBound (see above for the latest points list)

- Harry Hall, a rookie last season, earned his first Korn Ferry Tour win, overcoming a two-stroke 54-hole deficit with a 3-under 32 on the front nine and 3-under 67 in the final round
- Hall held the 36-hole lead, but was overtaken in the third round by PGA TOUR University Class of 2021 alum **Kevin Yu**, who tied the course record in the third round with a 9-under 61
- Entering the week, Hall had not finished higher than T41 since March 2021
- Curtis Thompson recorded his first top-five finish since winning the 2020 NV5 Invitational presented by Old National Bank and eventually earned his first PGA TOUR card via a No. 21 finish on the 2020-21 Korn Ferry Tour Regular Season Points List
- Brett Drewitt also earned a PGA TOUR card at regular season's end

- **Robby Shelton** carried a five-stroke lead into the final round, but fell into a playoff with Ben Griffin as the two carded an even-par 71 and 5-under 66, respectively, in the final round; Shelton defeated Griffin with consecutive pars in a sudden-death playoff, which was played on the par-4 18th
- Shelton earned his third career win and first since 2019
- The last 15 Korn Ferry Tour players who held a lead of five-plus strokes through 54 holes have gone on to win, a streak which dates back to 2010
- Shelton went without a bogey through 54 holes, and his three bogeys for the week (all in the final round) were tied for the fewest scores of bogey or worse in the field
- Griffin recorded his third runner-up finish of the 2022 season
- Augusto Núñez recorded the second-highest finish of his career, only behind a solo second at the 2017 Coarles Puntacana Championship
- In his second professional start, PGA TOUR University presented by Velocity Global Class of 2022 graduate **Jacob Bridgeman** rose to a top-10 finish with a 6-under 65 final round; he led the field with 29 total birdies (28 birdies, one eagle), three more than any other player in the field
