TOP STORYLINES

The 3M Open, which is being contested for the fourth time since its inception in 2019, is the 42nd of 44 events during the FedExCup Regular Season. With only three weeks remaining until the start of the FedExCup Playoffs, the 3M Open provides an opportunity for players looking to secure one of the 125 spots in the FedExCup Playoffs.

Three-time PGA TOUR winner **Cameron Champ** returns to the 3M Open to defend his title. Champ is in his fourth season on the PGA TOUR and has won in each of his first three seasons (2018 Sanderson Farms Championship, 2019 Fortinet Championship, 2021 3M Open). With a win, he would become the fourth player with a win in each of the last four seasons (including the current season), joining Rory McIlroy, Jon Rahm and Justin Thomas. Four defending champions have won this season, the most in a season since 2016-17 (4).

2021 Masters Tournament champion **Hideki Matsuyama** is the highest-ranked player in the field at No. 14 in the Official World Golf Ranking. Matsuyama has won twice on TOUR this season (ZOZO CHAMPIONSHIP, Sony Open in Hawaii) and with a victory, would become the fifth player to win three times this season. The last time five players won three or more times in a PGA TOUR season was 2003: Tiger Woods (5), Davis Love III (4), Vijay Singh (4), Kenny Perry (3), Mike Weir (3).

Four PGA TOUR rookies are currently in the top 40 of the FedExCup standings, and two of them are in the field this week: **Davis Riley** (No. 23 in the FedExCup standings) and **Sahith Theegala** (No. 38). The Rookie of the Year as voted on by PGA TOUR membership at the end of the season will receive the Arnold Palmer Award.

World No. 40 **Joohyung Kim**, competing on a sponsor exemption, joined the PGA TOUR this week as a Special Temporary Member. A native of South Korea, Kim is now eligible for unlimited sponsor exemptions for the remainder of the season as he attempts to earn his TOUR card for the 2022-23 season. To earn full status for the 2022-23 season, Kim must earn as many or more non-member FedExCup points as the final eligible player from the 2021-22 FedExCup standings to qualify for the FedExCup Playoffs. Kim currently has 296 points, which would fall between Nos. 131 and 132 in the standings.

Former professional tennis player and Edina, Minnesota, native **Mardy Fish**, winner of six ATP Tour titles and silver medalist at the 2004 Olympic Games, is competing on a sponsor exemption. Fish is making his PGA TOUR debut and is the first professional athlete from another sport to receive a sponsor exemption since former Dallas Cowboys quarterback Tony Romo at the 2019 Fortinet Championship. Romo has made four starts on TOUR and missed the cut in each of them. Fish defeated Romo in a playoff to win the celebrity competition at the 2022 ClubCorp Classic on PGA TOUR Champions and has won the Diamond Resorts Tournament of Champions celebrity tournament three times.

Chez Reavie won last week's Barracuda Championship, moving to No. 49 in the FedExCup standings. Reavie became the eighth player to win in the 2000s, 2010s and 2020s (2008 RBC Canadian Open, 2019 Travelers Championship, 2022 Barracuda Championship) and is the only player to win exactly once in each of those decades.

Tony Finau, the second-highest ranked player in the field at No. 17 in the Official World Golf Ranking, is making his fourth start at the 3M Open. Finau finished T3 at the event in 2020 and is coming off a T28 in 2021. At last week's Open Championship, Finau made birdie at No. 18 in the second round to make the cut on the number and went on to finish T28 after rounds of 70-66.

Sungjae Im, who enters the week No. 19 in the FedExCup standings, has qualified for the TOUR Championship in each of his first three seasons on TOUR and looks to extend the streak to four this season. Im won the Shriners Children's Open in the fall and has six top-10s on the season (one shy of his career-high).

PGA TOUR rookie **Austin Smotherman** finished eighth at last week's Barracuda Championship, recording his first career top-10 on TOUR. With the result, Smotherman moved to No. 134 in the FedExCup standings as he attempts to qualify for the FedExCup Playoffs in his first season.

2019 American Express winner **Adam Long** has two runner-up finishes on TOUR, including one at the 3M Open in 2020. Long has tied his career-high with nine top-25s this season, but has not yet recorded a top-10 (at least two in each of the last three seasons).

Adam Hadwin has finished in the top-10 in each of his two prior starts at the 3M Open (4th/2019, T6/2021). Hadwin has five top-10s this season, tying his career-high.

Jeff Overton is competing on a sponsor exemption and making his first start since the 2017 Honda Classic. Overton has made 293 career starts on the PGA TOUR and earned \$12,790,635 in his career, but has not won a PGA TOUR event (four-time runner-up).

FEDEXCUP and SEASON STORYLINES

Last time out: Cameron Smith won The Open Championship by one stroke over Cameron Young, earning his first career major championship title and third win of the season. Smith became the second player to win THE PLAYERS Championship and The Open Championship in the same season and the first to do so since Jack Nicklaus in 1978. Smith also became the fourth player with three or more victories this season, joining Scottie Scheffler (4), Sam Burns (3) and Xander Schauffele (3). Chez Reavie won the Barracuda Championship, becoming the eighth player to win in the 2000s, 2010s and 2020s (2008 RBC Canadian Open, 2019 Travelers Championship, 2022 Barracuda Championship).

No. 1: World No. 1 and FedExCup leader Scottie Scheffler finished T21 at The Open Championship and has now earned 13,176,910, the most in a season in PGA TOUR history (previous: \$12,030,465/Jordan Spieth/2014-15).

Rookie watch: Four PGA TOUR rookies are currently in the top 40 of the FedExCup standings as they attempt to qualify for the TOUR Championship in their first season on TOUR. There has not been in a season in the FedExCup era in which more than two rookies qualified for the TOUR Championship (seasons with 2: 2015-16, 2016-17, 2019-20). Only one rookie has won this season: Chad Ramey, Corales Puntacana Championship.
