# Second-Round Notes - Friday, July 22, 2022

**Weather:** Partly cloudy. High of 92. Wind WSW 12-16 mph, with gusts to 20 mph. Due to severe weather forecasted Saturday afternoon, third-round tee times will feature threesomes off split tees from approximately 6:50 - 8:50 a.m. CT.

**36-hole cut:** 75 professionals at 1-over 143 from a field of 155 professionals and one amateur

Things to Know

- Scott Piercy's 36-hole 129 total is one stroke shy of his career-best on TOUR and one stroke shy of the tournament record
- Emiliano Grillo posts his eighth round of 65 or better this season
- PGA TOUR rookie Callum Tarren cards his best 18-hole score on TOUR (59 rounds)
- Top three players on the leaderboard represent different countries: USA, Argentina, England
- Grillo and Tony Finau both finished T3 at the 3M Open in 2020
- Robert Streb is the only player without a bogey through 36 holes
- Marks first time in tournament history that the 36-hole cut is not under par (2019/-3, 2020/-2, 2021/-2)
- Defending champion Cameron Champ birdies four of his last five holes to make the cut on the number

- Second-round leader/co-leader to win the 3M Open (2020/Michael Thompson)
- Second-round leaders/co-leaders to win individual stroke-play events on TOUR this season (most recent: Cameron Smith/The Open Championship)

- Follows opening-round 65 with bogey-free 64 to post 129 (-13), one stroke shy of his lowest 36-hole total on TOUR (128/2013 Sony Open in Hawaii) and one stroke shy of the 3M Open 36-hole record (Bryson DeChambeau/2019)
- Three-stroke lead through 36 holes marks largest in 3M Open history (2/Bryson DeChambeau/2019)
- Holds 36-hole lead/co-lead for fifth time on PGA TOUR, 1-for-4 to date converting to victory (2012 RBC Canadian Open)
- Ranked T137th in Strokes Gained: Putting for this season entering the 3M Open and ranks No. 1 this week; total feet of putts made: 276 feet, 6 inches (R1/151' 4", R2/125' 2")
- Making fourth 3M Open start (T15/2019, MC/2020, T71/2021)
- Best finish in 24 TOUR starts this season: T11/Fortinet Championship

- Seeks a fifth career PGA TOUR title and first since 2018 Zurich Classic of New Orleans, partnering with Billy Horschel
- At No. 138, seeks to qualify for the FedExCup Playoffs for the 13<sup>th</sup> time; ended last season at No 116 in the FedExCup standings
- Entered this week after making swing changes and adding a new coach and caddie prior to the Barracuda Championship; also added a new driver and new putter to his bag recently

# Emiliano Grillo (2<sup>nd</sup>/-10)

- Mixes one eagle (No. 6) and one bogey (No. 13) with five birdies for his eighth round of 65 or better this season
- Makes third appearance at 3M Open (T3/2020, MC/2021), shooting 64-65—129 on the weekend en route to T3 in 2020
- Best finish this season is T2 at John Deere Classic, his lone top-10 in 25 starts
- Currently sits No. 92 in the FedExCup standings; seeks to advance to FedExCup Playoffs for the seventh time in as many seasons on TOUR
- Argentina native has represented his country at the World Cup (2013), Olympic Games (2016) and Presidents Cup (2017) and owns one win on each of the following: PGA TOUR Latinoamerica (2014), Korn Ferry Tour (2015), PGA TOUR (2015)

# **Miscellaneous Notes**

- England's **Callum Tarren** (3<sup>rd</sup>/-8), a PGA TOUR rookie, who made his first cut in his 10<sup>th</sup> TOUR start, seeks his third top-10 in his 24<sup>th</sup> start (T5/2022 Puerto Rico Open, T6/2022 John Deere Classic); hit 18 of 18 greens in regulation en route to bogey-free 63 (-8), bettering his career-low round on TOUR by two strokes
- Callum Tarren joins Tom Hoge (R1) and Lee Hodges (R2) as players this week to hit 18 of 18 greens at TPC Twin Cities in the first three years of the 3M Open (2019-2021), just seven players hit every green in regulation in a round at TPC Twin Cities during the 3M Open (1,361 rounds)
- Tony Finau (T4/-7), the highest ranked player in the field (No. 17 OWGR), posts 12<sup>th</sup> score in the 60s (14 rounds) at this event (72/+1/R1/2021, 70/-1/R4/2021); makes his fourth start at the 3M Open (T23/2019, T3/2020, T28/2021)
- Robert Streb (T4/-7) is the only player without a bogey through 36 holes
- **Sungjae Im** (T4/-7), who won the Shriners Children's Open earlier this season, seeks to become the eighth player to win multiple titles this season; finished T15 in his only 3M Open start in 2019
- Sponsor exemption **Chris Gotterup** (T46/E), who finished T4 at the John Deere Classic three weeks ago, follows an opening-round 75 with a 4-under 67 to advance to the weekend; in his most recent start at the Barbasol Classic two weeks ago, he opened with 75-67 to miss the cut by three strokes
- 2021 3M Open winner, **Cameron Champ** (T63/+1) birdies four of his last five holes to make the cut on the number and seeks to become the fifth player to successfully defend a title this season
- 58-year-old **Paul Goydos** (T63/+1), who won the PGA TOUR Champions 3M Championship at TPC Twin Cities in 2017, makes his first cut on TOUR since 2018 Arnold Palmer Invitational presented by Mastercard (T69)
- **Kevin Chappell** (T63/+1) shoots 29 (-6) on his closing nine holes (front nine) to make the cut on the number and equal the 9-hole scoring record at the 3M Open
- Following an opening-round 81, former professional tennis player and Minnesota native **Mardy Fish** (149<sup>th</sup>/+13) makes five birdies en route to 3-over 74 in his PGA TOUR debut
- D.A. Points withdrew before the start of the second round; Arjun Atwal was disqualified for signing an incorrect scorecard
