**Things to Know**

- Scott Piercy sets 3M Open 54-hole tournament record in bid for fifth career PGA TOUR win and first individual stroke-play title since the 2015 Barbasol Championship
- Following his T2 at the John Deere Classic three weeks ago, Emiliano Grillo seeks second TOUR title and first since 2015
- With one bogey through 54 holes (No. 1/R2), Doug Ghim’s score of 200 marks his lowest 54-hole score on TOUR
- Two years removed from his T3 finish at the 3M Open, Tony Finau in position for third career TOUR title
- PGA TOUR rookie Greyson Sigg birdies seven of his last 11 holes for a 7-under 64 in bid for first TOUR title (36<sup>th</sup> start)

- 2 Third-round leaders/co-leaders to win the 3M Open (2019/Matthew Wolff, 2020/Michael Thompson)
- 16 Third-round leaders/co-leaders to win individual stroke-play events on TOUR this season (most recent: Xander Schauffele/Genesis Scottish Open)

- After pars on his first two holes, one-putted each of the next five for birdies (Nos. 3-7) en route to a 5-under 66; began the second round with four straight birdies on Nos. 10-13
- Began the week T137 in Strokes Gained: Putting for this season; leads this week’s field in that category after a total of 371’ 8” of made putts (R1: 151’ 4”, R2: 125’ 2”, R3: 95’ 2”)
- Sets the 3M Open 54-hole tournament record with 18-under 195 (previously: 15-under 198/five players)
- Is 2-for-5 when attempting to convert a 54-hole lead/co-lead into victory on the PGA TOUR (2011 Barracuda Championship, 2015 Barbasol Championship)
- Previous starts/finishes at the 3M Open: 2019/T15, 2020/MC, 2021/T71
- Best finish in 24 TOUR starts this season: T11/2021 Fortinet Championship

- Seeks a fifth career PGA TOUR title and first since 2018 Zurich Classic of New Orleans, partnering with Billy Horschel; last individual stroke-play title was the 2015 Barbasol Championship
- At No. 138 in the FedExCup, seeks to qualify for the Playoffs for a 13<sup>th</sup> time; ended last season No. 116 in the FedExCup

#### Miscellaneous Notes

- Making his third appearance at the 3M Open (T3/2020, MC/2021), **Emiliano Grillo** (2<sup>nd</sup>/-14) followed a 6-under 65 in round two with a 4-under 67; is 5-under on the par-5 sixth hole (birdie-eagle-eagle); after a T2 finish at the John Deere Classic three weeks ago, seeks his second top-10 of the season; lone TOUR victory came at the 2015 Fortinet Championship
- With one bogey through 54 holes (No. 1/R2), **Doug Ghim** (T3/-13) posted a 6-under 65 in his third 3M Open (T18/2020, MC/2021)
- **Tony Finau** (T3/-13), the highest ranked player in the field (No. 17 OWGR), carded a 6-under 65 in bid for his third career TOUR title (2016 Puerto Rico Open, 2021 FedEx St. Jude Championship; making fourth 3M Open start (T23/2019, T3/2020, T28/2021)
- Fargo, North Dakota's **Tom Hoge** (5<sup>th</sup>/-12) birdied his last three holes to sign for a 5-under 66 in his fourth 3M Open start; seeks a second TOUR title (2022 AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am)
- PGA TOUR rookie **Greyson Sigg** (T6/-11) birdied seven of his last 11 holes for a 7-under 64 in bid for first TOUR title (36<sup>th</sup> start); best finish this season was T16 at the John Deere Classic three weeks ago
- In his bid to become the fifth player to successfully defend a TOUR title this season, and first since Rory McIlroy at the RBC Canadian Open, **Cameron Champ** sits T41 at 3-under 210
