Things to Know

- Beginning the final round five strokes off the lead, Tony Finau earns his third PGA TOUR title
- Finau sets largest final-round comeback by a winner in 3M Open history
- Sungjae Im earns his third career runner-up finish, while Emiliano Grillo collects his sixth on TOUR
- Scott Piercy, who held at least a share of the lead after each of the first three rounds, plays the final round 5-over and finishes T4
- Defending champion Cameron Champ finishes T16 in bid to become tournament's first repeat winner
- TPC Twin Cities records the most balls in the water on TOUR this season with 303

- Wins his third career PGA TOUR victory in his 212th start at the age of 32 years, 10 months, 10 days
- Collects 500 points and moves from No. 30 to No. 17 in the FedExCup standings
- Entered the final round five-strokes back to set the 3M Open record for largest final-round comeback
- Marks the largest comeback win on TOUR since Sam Burns came from seven back at the 2022 Charles Schwab Challenge
- Three-shot victory is the largest margin of victory in tournament history (previous: 2 strokes, Cameron Champ/2021, Michael Thompson/2020)
- Led the field in Strokes Gained: Tee to Green (16.651)
- Wins in his fourth 3M Open start and marks second event top-five (T23/2019, T3/2020, T28/2021, Won/2022)
- Fourth top-10 in 21 starts this season (T2/Mexico Open at Vidanta, T4/Charles Schwab Challenge, 2nd/RBC Canadian Open)
- Three-time PGA TOUR winner: 2016 Puerto Rico Open, 2021 FedEx St. Jude Championship, 2022 3M Open
- Has reached the TOUR Championship five consecutive seasons and qualified for the FedExCup Playoffs seven times in as many seasons as a member

Miscellaneous Notes

Sungjae Im (T2/-14) collects third runner-up of PGA TOUR career and seventh top-10 this season

- In search of his second PGA TOUR title and first since the 2015 Fortinet Championship, **Emiliano Grillo** (T2/-14) finishes runner-up for the sixth time on TOUR and second this season (T2/John Deere Classic); marks second top five in third appearance at the 3M Open (T3/2020, MC/2021)
- With a final round 6-under 65, **James Hahn** (T4/-13) earns best finish on TOUR since runner-up at the 2018 Sony Open in Hawaii
- After setting the 3M Open 54-hole scoring record with 18-under 195, **Scott Piercy** (T4/-13) falls to 2-for-6 when holding the third-round lead/co-lead; earns first top-10 of the season
- In his bid to become the fifth player to successfully defend a TOUR title this season, and first since Rory McIlroy at the RBC Canadian Open, **Cameron Champ** finishes T16 at 7-under 277
- At 303, TPC Twin Cities marks the most balls in the water on the PGA TOUR this season
