TOURNAMENT STORYLINES

Dallas Stars: The 2022 AT&T Byron Nelson field is flush with star power, with 16 of the top 30 in the current FedExCup standings and nine of the top 20 in the Official World Golf Ranking. The field is headlined by Dallas natives Scottie Scheffler, FedExCup leader and World No. 1, and Jordan Spieth, AT&T ambassador who returned to the winner's circle in April at the RBC Heritage. The field also includes Justin Thomas, Dustin Johnson, Hideki Matsuyama, Xander Schauffele, Joaquin Niemann and Sam Burns. Korea's K.H. Lee returns as defending champion after topping Burns by three strokes in 2021.

Texas Two-Step: Jordan Spieth makes his first start since winning his 13th PGA TOUR title at the RBC Heritage as he returns to his home state of Texas. Spieth has 15 top-10 finishes in Texas since 2013, the most of any player in that time frame. Spieth is one of eight players with two wins in Texas during the FedExCup-era (established 2007): 2021 Valero Texas Open and 2016 Charles Schwab Challenge. Two players have four PGA TOUR wins in the state since 2007, including Zach Johnson and Adam Scott, the only player to complete the "Texas Slam," with wins at each of the TOUR's tournaments in Texas: Houston Open, Valero Texas Open, AT&T Byron Nelson and Charles Schwab Challenge.

Byron Nelson: The AT&T Byron Nelson honors the legacy of the tournament namesake, Byron Nelson, and was the first TOUR event to be named in honor of a professional golfer. Despite retiring at the age of 34 to work his ranch, he is considered among the greatest players of all time - with 52 career PGA TOUR wins including a record 18 titles (11 straight) in 1945. Nelson lent his name to what was previously known as the Dallas Open in 1968 and was instrumental in the tournament's growth until his passing in 2006.

Year two: The AT&T Byron Nelson returns to TPC Craig Ranch in McKinney, Texas after making its debut as a PGA TOUR host in 2021. TPC Craig Ranch will host the AT&T Byron Nelson for the next four years. The site has previously held Korn Ferry Tour events, including the circuit's season-ending championship in 2008 and 2012, as well as Qualifying School in years since.

Birdies bountiful: 2,007 birdies were recorded at the 2021 AT&T Byron Nelson, the most of any tournament last season.

PLAYER STORYLINES

Olympic Gold Medalist **Xander Schauffele** will make his first start since winning the Zurich Classic of New Orleans with teammate Patrick Cantlay. Schauffele will play at TPC Craig Ranch for the first time, having previously missed the cut in his tournament debut in 2017 at TPC Four Seasons Resort.

One of five multiple winners on the season, **Sam Burns**, who is No. 2 in the FedExCup, will make his third start at the AT&T Byron Nelson. His career-low round on TOUR came during the 2021 AT&T Byron Nelson second round at TPC Craig Ranch (62).

Dallas resident **Carlos Ortiz** has called Texas home for the last 13 years beginning with his college career at the University of North Texas. Ortiz will make his fifth start in the event (best: T12/2019). From Guadalajara, Mexico, Ortiz became the third player from Mexico to win on the PGA TOUR and first since 1978 when he won the 2020 Houston Open.

Dustin Johnson will make his ninth start of the season as he seeks his first PGA TOUR win in 2021-22 to extend his streak of consecutive seasons with at least one victory to 15. His last PGA TOUR win came at the 2020 Masters Tournament (in November 2020). Johnson will make his first start in the event since 2017, and first at TPC Craig Ranch.

Will Zalatoris will make his fourth start in the event after finishing T17 in 2021. The reigning PGA TOUR Rookie of the Year has five top-10s in 13 starts this season, and is one of 11 players with five or more top-10s in 2021-22 (most: 7/Scottie Scheffler).

Aaron Wise won the 2018 AT&T Byron Nelson en route to earning Rookie of the Year honors. Wise is coming off a T6 at the Mexico Open at Vidanta and has three top-10s on the season, one shy of his career-high set in his rookie season (4).

12-time PGA TOUR winner and Dallas native **Justin Leonard** is making his first start on the PGA TOUR since the 2017 Valero Texas Open (T58). Leonard, 49, will be eligible to compete on PGA TOUR Champions when he turns 50 on June 15. Leonard is competing on a sponsor exemption.

Seung-Yul Noh is making his last available start on his Major Medical Extension. Noh needs to earn 217,356 FedExCup points (2-way T2 or better) to be eligible to compete out of the Major Medical Extension category for the remainder of the season. If he does not reach that mark but earns 106,034 points (solo-5th, 4-way T4 or better), he will move to the 126-150 category.

Among the four Open Qualifiers is **Conrad Shindler**, who played collegiately at Texas A&M, was a member of the PGA TOUR in 2017-18, finishing the season No. 192 in the FedExCup standings. This is his first start on any TOUR since the 2021 Pinnacle Bank Championship on the Korn Ferry Tour.

FEDEXCUP and SEASON STORYLINES

Last time out: Max Homa picked up his fourth PGA TOUR victory in his 141st start at the Wells Fargo Championship. With wins in 2019 and 2022, Homa became the second player with multiple titles in tournament history (3/Rory McIlroy) and marked the fifth multiple winner of the season (won the season-opening Fortinet Championship).

Top players taking the title: 15 of the 29 PGA TOUR events this season have been won by players who began the tournament in the top 25 of the Official World Golf Ranking (most recent: Jon Rahm, No. 2, Mexico Open at Vidanta), including nine of the last 12. The highest ranking by a winner this season came at the Masters Tournament, where Scottie Scheffler became the first World No. 1 to win on TOUR since 2020.

No. 1: FedExCup leader and World No. 1 Scottie Scheffler has won four times in his last seven starts. Scheffler earned his first major championship title at the Masters Tournament, becoming the first player since Jason Day in 2015 to win four times in a six-start stretch. Scheffler joined Tiger Woods (eight times) as players to win four times in a PGA TOUR season, including a major and a World Golf Championships event. With his third TOUR victory at the WGC-Dell Technologies Match Play, Scheffler took over the No. 1 position in the Official World Golf Ranking on March 27 for the first time in his career. Scheffler is the 25th player to hold the World No. 1 title (est. 1986) and sixth-youngest. Scheffler also holds the lead in the FedExCup standings, becoming the first FedExCup leader to win on TOUR (outside of the TOUR Championship) since Justin Thomas at the 2020 WGC-FedEx St. Jude Invitational.

Youth movement: On March 6 (and March 13), all of the top five in the Official World Golf Ranking were younger than 30 for the first time (est. 1986). No. 5 Patrick Cantlay has since turned 30.

First-time winners: Nine players have earned their first PGA TOUR victory this season, including seven in the last 15 weeks. Most recently, J.J. Spaun won the Valero Texas Open, winning on TOUR for the first time in his 147th career start.
