Things to Know

- Sebastian Munoz becomes the first player in PGA TOUR history with multiple rounds of 60 or better in the same season (60/R1/The RSM Classic) and ties 18-hole tournament record
- Munoz records eagles on holes 9 and 12 in the opening round for the second consecutive year at this event
- K.H. Lee shoots lowest first round by a defending champion at the AT&T Byron Nelson since 1983
- FedExCup leader and World No. 1 Scottie Scheffler and Dallas native Jordan Spieth sit T12 at 5-under

- 4 Largest 18-hole lead at AT&T Byron Nelson (Sebastian Munoz/2022)

- Records nine birdies, two eagles and one bogey (No. 8) en route to 12-under 60, his second round of 60 this season (60/R1/The RSM Classic), tying his career low; took a one-stroke penalty for an unplayable lie at No. 8
- Becomes first player in PGA TOUR history with multiple rounds of 60 or better in the same season; joins Phil
 Mickelson (3), Zach Johnson (2), Jim Furyk (2) and Brandt Snedeker (2) as players with multiple rounds of 60 or
 better on the PGA TOUR all-time
- Ties 18-hole tournament record (Sam Snead/1957/R2, Arron Oberholser/2006/R2, Keegan Bradley/2013/R1)
- Holds first-round lead/co-lead for seventh time on TOUR without converting any of previous six into a win (most recent: 2021 RSM Classic/3rd)
- Joins two players who held a first-round lead of four strokes or more on TOUR since 2018 (Justin Rose/4/65/2021 Masters Tournament, Brandt Snedeker/4/59/2018 Wyndham Championship)
- Shares low round of the season with Tyler McCumber, who also shot 60 at The RSM Classic (R4)

- 12-under marks his lowest score to par on TOUR; 11 holes with birdies or better marks his most in a single round on TOUR
- Was 10-under on his final 10 holes; played holes 9-12 in eagle-birdie-birdie-eagle; first player since Dustin Johnson to play a four-hole stretch in 6-under on TOUR (2020 FedEx St. Jude Invitational/R2/TPC Boston)
- In 2021, also recorded eagles on holes 9 and 12 en route to an opening-round 66 at AT&T Byron Nelson
- 28 (-8) on the back nine marks his lowest 9-hole score on TOUR and matches the lowest this season (Rory Sabbatini/Shriners Children's Open, Ryan Armour/Sony Open in Hawaii)
- Makes fourth appearance at AT&T Byron Nelson (T50/2017, T10/2019, T55/2021)
- Owns two top-10s in 15 starts this season (T4/ZOZO CHAMPIONSHIP, 3rd/The RSM Classic); lone missed cut in eight starts in 2022 was at The American Express
- Seeks second TOUR title in his 119th start (2019 Sanderson Farms Championship; defeated Sungjae Im in a playoff)
- Colombia native and Dallas resident played college golf at University of North Texas (2011-15)

Miscellaneous Notes

- K.H. Lee (T2/-8) shoots lowest first round by a defending champion at the AT&T Byron Nelson since 1983 (Tiger Woods/1998/-5); looks to join Sam Snead (1957-58), Jack Nicklaus (1970-71) and Tom Watson (1978-80) as players to successfully defend their AT&T Byron Nelson title
- In his 80th round on TOUR, Mito Pereira (T2/-8) cards eight birdies and an eagle (No. 12) for his career-low round
- **Peter Malnati** (T2/-8) makes two eagles in a round (Nos. 9 and 13) for the first time in his PGA TOUR career (593rd round); holed a 6-iron from 189 yards for eagle at par-4 13th hole
- PGA TOUR rookie **Justin Lower** (T2/-8) holed out from 154 yards for an eagle-2 at the par-4 10th hole in his first appearance at the AT&T Byron Nelson; 8-under 64 marks his career-low round on TOUR (previous, 65/R2/2022 Corales Puntacana Championship); notched three top-25s in 14 starts this season with lone top-10 coming at Zurich Classic of New Orleans (T10) while partnering with Dylan Wu
- Monday qualifier Kyle Wilshire (6th/-7) makes his third PGA TOUR start; Lexington, Kentucky native also Monday
 qualified for his two prior TOUR starts (MC/2021 RSM Classic, T62/2021 Butterfield Bermuda Championship);
 finished T43 at The Bahamas Great Exuma Championship in his lone Korn Ferry Tour start this year
- Trey Mullinax (T25/-4) began on No. 10 and was 6-under through five holes after posting back-to-back eagles (Nos. 12 and 13) for the first time in his PGA TOUR career; outward 29 (-7) marks his lowest 9-hole score in relation to par on TOUR; triple-bogey 7 at No. 1 contributed to inward 39 (+3)
- A total of 38 eagles were recorded in the first round, the most eagles in a single round this season (previous, 25/THE CJ CUP @ SUMMIT/R2, 25/The American Express/R1); six players recorded two eagles, while in 2021, five players scored two eagles in the opening round at the AT&T Byron Nelson
- C.T. Pan withdrew prior to the start of the opening round and was replaced in the field by Bo Hoag (T107/E)
