Things to Know

- First-round leader Sebastian Munoz follows opening-round 60 with 69 to retain a share of the lead
- Amarillo, Texas native Ryan Palmer shoots his lowest score in 54 rounds at the AT&T Byron Nelson
- 40-year-old PGA TOUR rookie David Skinnis posts his career-low score on TOUR
- 33-year-old PGA TOUR rookie Justin Lower sits fourth, his best position after any round on TOUR
- Jordan Spieth seeks second TOUR win in as many starts after claiming the RBC Heritage in a playoff last month
- Defending champion K.H. Lee sits three strokes back in attempt to become event's first repeat winner since 1980
- FedExCup leader and World No. 1 Scottie Scheffler sits T20 at 9-under, despite a triple bogey
- Players within four strokes of the lead represent nine different countries (USA, England, Colombia, South Africa, Chile, Korea, Japan, Ireland, Sweden)
- 5-under cut matches lowest this season in relation to par (fourth time)

Ryan Palmer (T1/-15)

- Makes 10 birdies en route to 10-under 62, marking his 10th round on TOUR with 10 or more birdies or better (1,475 rounds); most recent of nine previous: 2020 Farmers Insurance Open/R2/62
- Holds 36-hole lead/co-lead for the 10th time on TOUR in individual strokeplay events, converting two of previous nine into wins (most recent: 2022 Valero Texas Open/T48); NOTE: held 36-hole lead at 2019 Zurich Classic of New Orleans (with Jon Rahm as his partner) before going on to win in the official team event
- Marks his lowest score in 54 rounds at AT&T Byron Nelson and one stroke shy of his career low on TOUR (61/R2/2015 American Express)
- Owns three top-10s in 17 starts at AT&T Byron Nelson, including runner-up in 2011
- Has yet to post a top-10 result in 13 starts this season after notching four in the 2020-21 season

David Skinns (T1/-15)

- Making his first appearance at the AT&T Byron Nelson, 40-year-old PGA TOUR rookie records 10 birdies, his most in a single round on TOUR, en route to 9-under 63, his career-best score on TOUR (previous: 64/R1/2021 RSM Classic)
- Holds his first lead/co-lead after any round on TOUR (previous-best position: T4 after rounds one and two at 2021 Butterfield Bermuda Championship/T34)
- Five consecutive birdies on Nos. 7-11 marks his longest birdie streak on TOUR
- 15-under total marks his lowest 36-hole score in relation to par on TOUR
- Making his 21st start on TOUR, but yet to record a top-25 finish
- Entered this week No. 208 in the FedExCup standings

Sebastian Munoz (T1/-15)

- Follows his opening-round 60 (-12) with a 3-under 69; the best round following a 60 or better by any player on TOUR is 7-under 64 (twice: Mark Calcavecchia/2001 WM Phoenix Open, Dustin Johnson/2020 FedEx St. Jude Invitational)
- Holds second-round lead/co-lead for third time on TOUR without converting either of previous two into a win
- Proximity to the hole was 52'8" compared to 28'0" in round one; took 30 putts compared to 23 putts in round one
- Makes fourth appearance at AT&T Byron Nelson (T50/2017, T10/2019, T55/2021)
- Owns two top-10s in 15 starts this season (T4/ZOZO CHAMPIONSHIP, 3rd/The RSM Classic); lone missed cut in eight starts in 2022 was at The American Express
- Seeks second TOUR title in his 119th start (2019 Sanderson Farms Championship; defeated Sungjae Im in a playoff)
- Colombia native and Dallas resident played college golf at University of North Texas (2011-15)

Miscellaneous Notes

- PGA TOUR rookie **Justin Lower** (4th/-14) follows his career-low 8-under 64 in the opening round with 6-under 66 to sit fourth; notched three top-25s in 14 starts this season with lone top-10 coming at Zurich Classic of New Orleans (T10) while partnering with Dylan Wu
- **Charl Schwartzel** (5th/-13) sits two strokes better through 36 holes than he did last year at this event when he went on to finish T3; also finished third at the 2013 AT&T Byron Nelson
- **Joaquin Niemann** (T6/-12) missed the cut in his only previous AT&T Byron Nelson (2018) appearance
- **Jordan Spieth** (T6/-12) seeks second TOUR win in as many starts after claiming the RBC Heritage in a playoff last month; last time he won in back-to-back starts was 2017 (Travelers Championship, The Open Championship); has been under par through 36 holes in 10 of 11 appearances at the AT&T Byron Nelson (2017/68-75—143/+3/MC); lone top-10 in 10 prior starts at this event was T9 at TPC Craig Ranch in 2021
- **Ryan Armour** (No. 8/169 yards) became the fourth player this week to hole a shot from 140 yards or longer for eagle on a par-4 hole; **Peter Malnati** (No. 13/189 yards), **Justin Lower** (No. 10/154 yards) and **Trey Mullinax** (No. 13/143 yards) all achieved the feat in the opening round
- **Jonas Blixt** withdrew with illness during the second round
