### Things to Know

- Sebastian Munoz holds 54-hole lead/co-lead for the fourth time on TOUR; in three prior 54-hole leads/co-leads, he failed to break 70 in the final round
- Jordan Spieth seeks second TOUR win in as many starts after claiming the RBC Heritage in a playoff last month
- Joaquin Niemann looks to become the sixth multiple winner his season
- James Hahn shoots 61 (-11), one shy of his career-low score
- Victory for Justin Thomas would mark at least one title in seven consecutive seasons, an active streak second only to Dustin Johnson (14)
- Defending champion K.H. Lee sits four strokes back in attempt to become event's first repeat winner since 1980
- FedExCup leader and World No. 1 Scottie Scheffler sits T9 at 16-under after a bogey-free 65

- Fires 6-under 66 following rounds of 60-69 for a 195 total, one stroke shy of the 54-hole tournament record (194: Loren Roberts/1999, Brooks Koepka/2016, Sung Kang/2019)
- Holds third-round lead/co-lead for fourth time on TOUR, converting one of prior three into victory (2017 Greenbrier Classic/T3, 2019 Sanderson Farms Championship/Won, 2021 John Deere Classic/T4); shot final round in the 70s with each of his three prior 54-hole leads/co-leads
- Makes fourth appearance at AT&T Byron Nelson (T50/2017, T10/2019, T55/2021)

- Owns two top-10s in 15 starts this season (T4/ZOZO CHAMPIONSHIP, 3<sup>rd</sup>/The RSM Classic); lone missed cut in eight starts in 2022 was at The American Express
- Seeks second TOUR title in his 119<sup>th</sup> start (2019 Sanderson Farms Championship; defeated Sungjae Im in a playoff)
- Colombia native and Dallas resident played college golf at University of North Texas (2011-15)

#### Miscellaneous Notes

- **Jordan Spieth** (2<sup>nd</sup>/-20) seeks second TOUR win in as many starts after claiming the RBC Heritage in a playoff last month; last time he won in back-to-back starts was 2017 (Travelers Championship, The Open Championship); in 10 prior appearances at AT&T Byron Nelson, has never posted four rounds in the 60s and only once posted four rounds under-par (2021/63-70-66-71); lone top-10 in 10 prior starts at this event: T9/2021 at TPC Craig Ranch
- **Joaquin Niemann** (3<sup>rd</sup>/-19) has converted 48 of 50 putts from inside 10 feet this week, holing 279'2" of putts; missed the cut in his only previous AT&T Byron Nelson (2018) appearance; only wire-to-wire winner this season (The Genesis Invitational) and seeks to become sixth multiple winner this season
- **James Hahn** (T4/-18) posts five birdies in a six-hole stretch to make the turn in 31 (-5) before adding an eagle (No. 12) and four additional birdies for 11-under 61, one stroke shy of his career-low score (60/R3/2021 Barbasol Championship); now owns eight rounds of 65 or better in 23 rounds at the AT&T Byron Nelson and two top-10s in six appearances (T5/2014, 3<sup>rd</sup>/2017); two-time TOUR winner (2016 Wells Fargo Championship, 2015 Genesis Invitational); made six cuts in 16 starts this season with T9 at last week's Wells Fargo Championship his lone top-10
- **Justin Thomas** (T4/-18) hits 13 of 18 greens in regulation for the third consecutive round and improves score by two shots each round (68-66-64); in his 190<sup>th</sup> TOUR start, seeks his 15<sup>th</sup> TOUR title and first since the 2021 PLAYERS Championship; a victory would mark at least one title in seven consecutive seasons, an active streak second only to Dustin Johnson (14), who has yet to win this season
- Second-round co-leader **Ryan Palmer** (T6/-17) posts five consecutive birdies on Nos. 9-13 for his longest birdie streak this season; has yet to post a top-10 result in 13 starts this season after notching four in the 2020-21 season; owns three top-10s in 17 starts at AT&T Byron Nelson, including runner-up in 2011
- With 22 each, **Charl Schwartzel** (T6/-17), **Scottie Scheffler** (T9/-16) and **Dustin Johnson** (T21/-13) share the most birdies by any player through 54 holes
- After opening with 72 (E), PGA TOUR rookie **Davis Riley** (T9/-16) posts back-to-back, bogey-free 64s in rounds two and three; finished T29 in his only prior appearance at AT&T Byron Nelson (2019); has recorded three top-5 finishes in his last five starts on TOUR (P2/Valspar Championship, T4/Zurich Classic of New Orleans/with Will Zalatoris as his partner, 5<sup>th</sup>/Mexico Open at Vidanta)
- Second-round co-leader **David Skins** (T21/-13) plays his last five holes 2-under en route to a 2-over 74
- **Pat Perez** (T42/-11) is one of four players with two eagles in round three, but the only player with both eagles at par-4 holes (Nos. 6 and 14)
