Things to Know

- K.H. Lee closes with a career-low 63 to successfully defend his title and claim his second TOUR victory
- Lee becomes the event's first repeat winner since 1980 (Tom Watson)
- Jordan Spieth heads to this week's PGA Championship following a win and runner-up in last two starts in bid to complete the Career Grand Slam
- Hideki Matsuyama posts his second-lowest round on TOUR, one stroke shy of 61 at Firestone Country Club
- Xander Schauffele plays last 49 holes in 26-under to finish T5; made 36-hole cut on the number (-5)
- FedExCup leader and World No. 1 Scottie Scheffler finishes T15 at 19-under

- Holes a clutch 12-foot putt for par at No. 17, before a two-putt birdie at the final hole en route to bogey-free 9-under 63, his lowest score on TOUR (64/seven times, most recent: R1/2022 AT&T Byron Nelson)
- Picks up his second PGA TOUR victory in his 107th start at the age of 30 years, 8 months, 15 days
- Collects 500 points and moves from No. 116 to No. 28 in the FedExCup standings; also earns a spot in the 2023 Sentry Tournament of Champions and exemptions into invitational events
- PGA TOUR victories (2): 2021 AT&T Byron Nelson, 2022 AT&T Byron Nelson
- Joins Sam Snead (1957-58), Jack Nicklaus (1970-71) and Tom Watson (1978-80) as players to successfully defend their AT&T Byron Nelson title
- Becomes first player to successfully defend a title on TOUR since Sam Burns (2022 Valspar Championship)
- Becomes first player to earn first two wins on TOUR in the same event in back-to-back seasons since Daniel Berger (2016 and 2017 FedEx St. Jude Classic)
- Becomes eighth player since 2000 to earn his first two TOUR titles at the same event (most recent: Robert Streb/2021 RSM Classic)
- Joins Sungjae Im (Shriners Children's Open) as second player from Korea to win this season and the 21st Korean to win on TOUR

• Prior to victory, best result in 16 starts this season was T14 at Shriners Children's Open, posting 17-under

Miscellaneous Notes

- **Jordan Spieth** (2nd/-25) posts four rounds in the 60s for the first time at the AT&T Byron Nelson in his 11th appearance; owns two top-10s in 11 starts at AT&T Byron Nelson, both at TPC Craig Ranch (T9/2021); heads to this week's PGA Championship seeking a win to complete the Career Grand Slam
- **Hideki Matsuyama** (T3/-24) posts his second-lowest round on TOUR, one stroke shy of 61 at Firestone Country Club (R4/2017 WGC-Bridgestone Invitational); posts his best result in four starts at AT&T Byron Nelson
- **Sebastian Munoz** (T3/-24), who held the lead/co-lead after 18, 36 and 54 holes, posts 3-under 69, his first sub-70 score in a final round while holding a 54-hole lead/co-lead
- Xander Schauffele (T5/-23) sat T149 and 18 strokes off the lead through three holes on Friday and went on to make the cut on the number (-5); played his last 49 holes in 26-under; when he reached 22-under through 70 holes he held the solo lead for the first time (final grouping was on No. 8 at the time)
- **James Hahn** (T9/-21), who held a share of the lead early in the final round, required a victory to earn a spot in this week's PGA Championship; posts second top-10 in as many weeks (T9/Wells Fargo Championship)
- Marc Leishman (T51/-13) aced No. 15 with a 7-iron from 213 yards for his second hole-in-one on TOUR and the
 first at the AT&T Byron Nelson since 2018 (Tyler Duncan); was 5-under on Nos. 14-17 with scores of 3-1-3-2;
 becomes the 16th player on record (since 1983) to record an eagle on a par-3, -4 and -5 hole in the same
 tournament (most recent: Steve Marino/2019 American Express)
- **Justin Lower** (T46/-14) made his first hole-in-one on TOUR, holing a 9-iron from 135 yards at No. 17; with the ace, becomes the 17th player on record (since 1983) to record an eagle on a par-3, -4 and -5 hole in the same tournament (most recent: Marc Leishman/2022 AT&T Byron Nelson)
- The field made 2,228 birdies this week, the most on record (since 1983) at any single-course event on TOUR
- 104 eagles were posted by the field this week, the second-most on record (since 1983) at an event on TOUR (114/2019 Barbasol Championship)
