Today – Mostly sunny to partly cloudy with a slim (10%) chance of a pop-up shower or thunderstorm after 4pm. Southerly winds are expected to become breezy after 10-11am, becoming sustained at 12-18 mph this afternoon with gusts in the 20-24 mph range. Confidence is beginning to increase that a round of scattered thunderstorms may push across North Texas after 11pm tonight.

Extended forecast – Confidence is starting to increase that that a band of thunderstorms will develop across Oklahoma this evening and push into North Texas after 11pm tonight. Should these storms occur tonight, expect that they would likely be east of the area by 5-6am Saturday. Cannot rule out an isolated strong thunderstorm overnight capable of producing wind gusts of 40-45 mph. Dry conditions are then expected for the remainder of the morning on Saturday, but a low coverage of showers and thunderstorms may redevelop after 2pm Saturday afternoon. There will be very slim (5-10%) chance of a pop-up shower or thunderstorm after 3pm on Sunday.
