- At 128, Seamus Power sets opening 36-hole tournament record and career-best opening 36-hole score
- Power holds the 36-hole lead/co-lead for the first time in his PGA TOUR career
- At T2, Tom Hoge and Adam Svensson seek first PGA TOUR title while Andrew Putnam seeks second victory
- Matthias Schwab shoots low round of the day on Pebble Beach Golf Links with a 10-under 62

- First 36-hole lead/co-lead on the PGA TOUR (previous-best 36-hole position: T2, twice; most recent: 2017 Wells Fargo Championship)
- 128 represents career-best opening 36-hole score; shot 131 through the opening two rounds of the 2022 Sony Open in Hawaii (T3)
- Ties largest 36-hole lead (to par) on the PGA TOUR this season (Keith Mitchell/THE CJ CUP @ SUMMIT)
- Through 36 holes posted a tournament and career-high 18 total birdies
- Leads the pro-am portion of the competition with partner Dermot Desmond at 20-under
- Making fifth start at the AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am (best: T38/2020)

- Earned his first career PGA TOUR victory last season at the 2021 Barbasol Championship
- Has two top-fives in nine starts this season (T4/The RSM Classic, T3/Sony Open in Hawaii)

Miscellaneous Notes

- Adam Svensson (T2/-11) hit all 18 greens in regulation for the first time in his PGA TOUR career
- Andrew Putnam (T2/-11) seeks second TOUR victory (2018 Barracuda Championship)
- First-round leader **Tom Hoge** (T2/-11) seeks first PGA TOUR title in 203rd start; last first-time winner at AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am was D.A. Points (2011)
- California native Patrick Cantlay (T5/-10), the reigning FedExCup Champion, trails by six following a 4-under 68
- Austria's Matthias Schwab's (T5/-10) second-round 10-under 62 included a career-high 11 birdies (previous: 9/2021 Butterfield Bermuda Championship/R2)
