Things to Know

- Beau Hossler, Andrew Putnam and Tom Hoge share the 54-hole lead at the AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am, the most 54-hole co-leaders in tournament history (72-hole events only) and the most on TOUR since the 2021 U.S. Open (3)
- Record when holding the 54-hole lead/co-lead: Hossler (0-for-2), Putnam (0-for-1), Hoge (0-for-1)
- Hossler and Hoge seeking their first TOUR win; last first-time winner of the event was D.A. Points (2011)
- AT&T brand ambassador and 2017 AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am champion Jordan Spieth trails by one stroke following his career-best round at the AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am (9-under 63)
- Reigning FedExCup Champion Patrick Cantlay trails by one following his 26th consecutive par-or-better round on TOUR
- Davis Riley/Matthew Flannery and Joel Dahmen/David Capobianco share the lead in the team competition at 24-under

- 11 Third-round leaders/co-leaders to win the AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am since 2000 (72-hole events) (most recent: Nick Taylor/2020)

Beau Hossler (T1/-15)

- Third 54-hole lead/co-lead on the PGA TOUR (0-for-2 to date: 2017 Shriners Children’s Open/T7, 2018 Hewlett Packard Enterprise Houston Open/2)
- Posts a bogey-free 7-under 65 at Pebble Beach Golf Links to move to 15-under 200, equaling his best opening 54-hole score on TOUR (2018 Travelers Championship)
- In search of first PGA TOUR victory in his 124th start (runner-up twice: 2018 Hewlett Packard Enterprise Houston Open, 2018 Travelers Championship)

Andrew Putnam (T1/-15)

- Second 54-hole lead/co-lead on the PGA TOUR (0-for-1 to date: 2018 FedEx St. Jude Classic/2nd)
- Sets career-best birdie streak with five in a row on Nos. 4-8 en route to a 4-under 68 at Pebble Beach Golf Links; previously had four birdies in a row on four occasions, most recently during the second round of the 2020 Workday Charity Open
- In search of second PGA TOUR victory in his 134th start (2018 Barracuda Championship)
- Finished T38 in 2019 for his best finish in four prior starts at the AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am
- Currently ranked No. 151 in the Official World Golf Ranking; Luke List entered last week's Farmers Insurance Open with the same ranking and went on to win

Tom Hoge (T1/-15)

- Second 54-hole lead/co-lead on the PGA TOUR (0-for-1 to date: 2018 Sony Open in Hawaii/3rd)
- Career-most birdies (20) through three rounds of a TOUR event
- Seeking first PGA TOUR title (best finish: 2nd/2019 A Military Tribute at The Greenbrier, 2nd/2022 American Express)
- T2 entering the final round of the 2021 AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am before finishing 12th, his best result in seven previous starts at the event
- Held the outright first-round lead for the first time in his career earlier this week; 0-for-6 when holding the 18-hole co-lead on TOUR and did not finish in the top 25 in any of those instances (most recent: 2020 Wyndham Championship/T27)

Jordan Spieth (T4/-14)

- AT&T brand ambassador and 2017 AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am champion birdies four of his last five holes for 9-under 63, his best score in 39 rounds at the event
- Trails by one stroke after entering the third round 11 shots back; largest come-from-behind win in the final 36 holes at the AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am is nine strokes (Davis Love III/2001)
- Has five top-10s at the event since 2014, second-most in that span (Jason Day/6)
- In nine prior event starts, has finished outside the top 25 just once (T45/2019)

Patrick Cantlay (T4/-14)

- California native and reigning FedExCup Champion trails by one stroke following a 4-under 68 at Pebble Beach Golf Links
- Currently has 26 consecutive par-or-better rounds on TOUR, trailing only Jon Rahm (29)
- Finished T3 in 2021 for his best finish in five prior starts at the AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am

- Third-round leader **Seamus Power** (7th/-13) trails by two strokes following a 3-over 74 at Monterey Peninsula Country Club
