Things to Know

- Tom Hoge wins the AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am by two strokes over Jordan Spieth, earning his first PGA TOUR victory in his 203rd career start
- Hoge becomes the fourth first-time winner of the season on TOUR and 13th in tournament history (first since D.A. Points in 2011)
- Last time two players earned first PGA TOUR title in consecutive weeks on the schedule: Tyrrell Hatton (2020 Arnold Palmer Invitational presented by Mastercard) and Sungjae Im (2020 Honda Classic)
- 2017 winner Jordan Spieth finishes solo-second, his sixth top-10 in 10 starts at the AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am and 16th career runner-up on TOUR

- Wins the AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am by two strokes over Jordan Spieth, earning his first career PGA TOUR victory in his 203rd career start
- Moves to No. 2 in the FedExCup standings, tying his career-high position in the standings (after 2019 Military Tribute at The Greenbrier); trails leader Hideki Matsuyama by 113 FedExCup points
- Becomes the fourth first-time winner on TOUR this season and second in the last two weeks

- Last time two players earned first PGA TOUR title in back-to-back weeks on the schedule: Tyrrell Hatton, 2020 Arnold Palmer Invitational presented by Mastercard and Sungjae Im, 2020 Honda Classic; note: Abraham Ancer (World Golf Championships-FedEx St. Jude Invitational) and Erik van Rooyen (Barracuda Championship) did so in the same week in 2021

- Becomes the 13th player to earn his first PGA TOUR title at the AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am and first since D.A. Points in 2011

- Third top-five in last five starts on TOUR (T4/The RSM Classic, 2nd/The American Express, Won/AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am)
- No wins and one runner-up in his first 200 starts on TOUR (2nd/2019 Military Tribute at The Greenbrier); one win and one runner-up in his last three starts
- Improves to 1-for-2 with the 54-hole lead/co-lead on TOUR (2018 Sony Open in Hawaii/3rd)
- 12th third-round leader/co-leader to win the AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am since 2000 and first since Nick Taylor in 2020
- Fifth third-round leader/co-leader to win on TOUR in 2021-22 and first since Cameron Smith at the Sentry Tournament of Champions
- Improves to 1-for-7 with the 18-hole lead/co-lead on TOUR (1-for-1 with the outright 18-hole lead)
- Seventh first-round leader/co-leader to win the AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am since 2000 and first since Nick Taylor in 2020
- Second first-round leader/co-leader to win on TOUR in 2021-22 and first since Cameron Smith at the Sentry Tournament of Champions

Miscellaneous notes

- Jordan Spieth finishes solo-second, his 16th career runner-up on TOUR and first since the 2021 Open Championship; an AT&T ambassador, Spieth has a win (2017), six top-10s and nine top-25s in 10 starts at the AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am
- PGA TOUR rookie **Taylor Moore** and partner Kyle Adams win the team portion of the competition at 33-under
