Final-Round Notes – Sunday, July 10, 2022

Weather: Mostly sunny. High of 85. Wind NE 10-15 mph. Delayed third-round resumed at 7:45 a.m. Sunday and was completed at 12:25 p.m. Preferred lies were used in the final round, which began at 10:40 a.m. with players remaining in the same groupings as round three, with the final grouping starting at 12:50 p.m.

Things to Know

- Trey Mullinax birdies 72nd hole to win first PGA TOUR title in his 106th start and earns final spot in the field at The Open Championship at St. Andrews this week
- Kevin Streelman earns 50th top-10 of his PGA TOUR career with runner-up result
- Mark Hubbard claims second top-3 finish of his PGA TOUR career
- Hurly Long was attempting to become the second player in TOUR history to win in his first TOUR start
- 54-hole leader Matti Schmid drops to T8 with final-round 77
- The winning margin has been one stroke or less in all but one of seven Barbasol Championships (2015/3 strokes)
- Final-round groupings stayed the same as round three for the first time on TOUR since 2019 World Wide Technology Championship at Mayakoba
- As part of the Strategic Alliance with the PGA TOUR and DP World Tour, the field included the top 50 available players from the DP World Tour priority ranking

- Plays a blemish-free back nine, including a final-hole birdie from 15 feet to shoot 6-under 66 for his first PGA TOUR victory in his 106th start at 30 years, 11 days
- After making birdie on the final hole, watched Kevin Streelman miss birdie attempt from nine feet that would have forced a playoff
- Wins 300 FedExCup points, is fully exempt on PGA TOUR and DP World Tour through the end of 2024 and earns
 a spot in this week's Open Championship at St. Andrews, a championship he has never played; earns starts in
 the Sentry Tournament of Champions, THE PLAYERS, the PGA Championship and multiple Invitational events in
 2023
- Joins Grayson Murray (2017) as second player to make Barbasol Championship their first TOUR title
- Becomes 11th first-time winner this season and first since Matt Fitzpatrick (U.S. Open)
- Led the field in Strokes Gained: Tee To Green (13.682) and Strokes Gained: Approach The Green (8.660)

- Previous-best result was T2 at 2018 Valero Texas Open; T4 at Sanderson Farms Championship was his lone top-10 in 23 prior starts this season
- Finishes one stroke shy of tournament record 262 (-26/Jim Herman/2019)
- Played three seasons on the PGA TOUR (rookie season: 2016-17) before being placed on a minor medical exemption to start the 2019-20 season after an errant shot during the 2019 Charles Schwab Challenge pro-am led to a series of medical issues
- Regained his TOUR card for the 2021-22 season by finishing in the top 50 on the Korn Ferry Tour after a win (his second on the Korn Ferry Tour) at the Orange County National Championship presented by Knight 39 in 2020
- Was on the 2013 and 2014 NCAA Championship teams at the University of Alabama where he was teammates with Justin Thomas

Additional Player Notes

- Making his first appearance at the Barbasol Championship, Kevin Streelman (2nd/-24) misses a 5-foot par putt at 16 before making a 9-foot birdie putt at 17; missed 9-foot birdie putt at 18 which would have forced a playoff; earns 50th top-10 of his career; was seeking his third TOUR title and first since 2014 Travelers Championship, where he birdied the final seven holes to claim the title; one of just nine players on TOUR successfully qualifying for the FedExCup Playoffs in each of the last 14 seasons; has played six Open Championships, including St. Andrews in 2015 (MC), with T19 in 2021 his best result
- In his fourth appearance at the Barbasol Championship, **Mark Hubbard** (3rd/-22) has improved his position each time (MC/2015, T42/2017, T20/2021, 3rd/2022); his 7-under 65 marks the low round of the day and one of five bogey-free final rounds; claims second top-3 finish of his TOUR career (T2/2019 Houston Open)
- In his PGA TOUR debut, Germany's **Hurly Long** (4th/-21) was seeking his first PGA TOUR win; only one player has won on the TOUR in his first start (Jim Benepe/1988 BMW Championship)
- For the 11th time in his 67 starts on TOUR, and fifth time this season, **Vince Whaley** (5th/-20) completes a tournament with all four rounds under-par; moves to No. 103 in the standings while attempting to advance to the FedExCup Playoffs for the first time in his career
- First-round leader **Adam Svensson** (6th/-19) posts his third top-10 this season and his best finish on TOUR (T7/Sony Open in Hawaii, T9/The Honda Classic); climbs to No. 88 in the FedExCup while attempting to reach the FedExCup Playoffs for the first time in his career
- Former University of Louisville golfer and 36- and 54-hole leader/co-leader **Matti Schmid** (T8/-17) led the field in birdies (28), but failed in his attempt to become the fourth player from Germany to win on TOUR (Bernhard Langer, Martin Kaymer, Alex Cejka) when he posted two double bogeys (Nos. 6 and 14) and five bogeys for 77
- T5 and four back through 54 holes, **Sean O'Hair** (T8/-17) was attempting to repeat something he did in 2005 when he won the John Deere Classic to qualify for The Open Championship at St. Andrews the following week, eventually finishing T15 at the Old Course
- Kentucky native and sponsor exemption **Josh Teater** (T63/-7) plays all four rounds for the fifth time in as many starts at the Barbasol Championship; 16 of his 20 rounds have been under-par scores
