## STORYLINES: THE OPEN CHAMPIONSHIP

The Old Course at St Andrews Links hosts this week's Open Championship, the 150th edition of the championship and the season's final major. This is the 30th time that St Andrews has hosted The Open. Most recently, Zach Johnson won a three-man playoff over Marc Leishman and Louis Oosthuizen in 2015, the most recent playoff in The Open Championship. Other notable past champions at the Old Course include Sam Snead (1946), Peter Thomson (1955), Jack Nicklaus (1970, 1978), Seve Ballesteros (1984), Nick Faldo (1990) and Tiger Woods (2000, 2005).

**Xander Schauffele** has wins in each of his last two PGA TOUR starts, taking titles at the Travelers Championship and last week's Genesis Scottish Open. The last player to win three consecutive PGA TOUR starts was Dustin Johnson in 2016-17 (The Genesis Invitational, WGC-Mexico Championship, WGC-Dell Technologies Match Play). Schauffele has now won three times on the season, including his victory with partner Patrick Cantlay at the Zurich Classic of New Orleans, moving to No. 3 in the FedExCup standings behind Scottie Scheffler (4 wins) and Sam Burns (3). Since making his major championship debut at the 2017 U.S. Open, Schauffele has six top-fives in majors, tied for second-most of any player in that span (most: 9/Brooks Koepka; 6: Rory McIlroy, Jon Rahm) and most among players without a win. Last player to win on TOUR and win a major the following week: Rory McIlroy, 2014 WGC Bridgestone Invitational, PGA Championship.

**Matt Fitzpatrick**, winner of the U.S. Open in June, has made six career starts in The Open Championship (best result: T20, 2019) and will compete in an Open at St Andrews for the first time. The last player to win consecutive majors was Jordan Spieth in 2015 (Masters Tournament, U.S. Open). Fellow 2022 major champions **Scottie Scheffler** and **Justin Thomas** attempt to become the first player to win multiple majors in a year since Brooks Koepka in 2018 (U.S. Open, PGA Championship). Fitzpatrick, the only player from England currently ranked in the top 25 of the Official World Golf Ranking (No. 10), has five top-10s in his last six starts on TOUR, including a T6 at last week's Genesis Scottish Open.

Defending champion **Collin Morikawa**'s most recent victory on TOUR came at the 2021 Open. Morikawa, a five-time TOUR winner, is winless in his last 19 starts, the longest drought of his PGA TOUR career (previous: 17). The last player to successfully defend a title in a major was Brooks Koepka at the 2019 PGA Championship, while the last player to do so at The Open was Pdraig Harrington in 2008.

82-time PGA TOUR winner and 15-time major champion **Tiger Woods** is making his first start on TOUR since the 2022 PGA Championship and 22nd in The Open (first since 2019/MC). Woods has won The Open three times (2000, 2005, 2006), with the first two coming at St Andrews. Woods is making his third start of the season, having made the cut in the first two majors. He finished 47th at the Masters Tournament and WD after the third round of the PGA Championship (74-69-79).

#### *Tiger Woods, with a win:*

Sets the PGA TOUR record for most career wins (83), breaking a tie with Sam Snead  
 Moves within two of Jack Nicklaus' record 18 major championship titles (with 16)  
 Becomes the 11th player to win four Open Championship titles  
 Becomes the fourth player to win four Open Championship titles since World War II  
 Becomes the first player to win three Open Championship titles at St Andrews

**Rory McIlroy** (2nd-8th-T5) and **Will Zalatoris** (T6-P2-T2) have finished in the top 10 at all three majors in 2022. Since 2004, eight players have finished in the top 10 in each of the season's four majors: Ernie Els (2004), Phil Mickelson (2004), Vijay Singh (2005), Tiger Woods (2005), Rickie Fowler (2014), Jordan Spieth (2015), Brooks Koepka (2019) and Jon Rahm (2021).

11 players qualified for The Open Championship via the Open Qualifying Series at PGA TOUR events this season: **Chris Kirk** and **Talor Gooch** at the Arnold Palmer Invitational presented by Mastercard; **Wyndham Clark** and **Keith Mitchell** at the RBC Canadian Open; **J.T. Poston**, **Christiaan Bezuidenhout** and **Emiliano Grillo** at the John Deere Classic; **Kurt Kitayama**, **Brandon Wu** and **Jamie Donaldson** at the Genesis Scottish Open; and **Trey Mullinax** at the Barbasol Championship. Mullinax earned the final spot in The Open with his win last week, which was the first of his PGA TOUR career. He also earned a spot in next season's Sentry Tournament of Champions, PLAYERS Championship and PGA Championship.

## PLAYER STORYLINES

World No. 1 and FedExCup leader **Scottie Scheffler** has four wins this season, including his first career major championship title at the Masters Tournament. 10 players (17 instances) have won five or more times in a season including multiple majors. Most recently, Jordan Spieth did so in 2014-15 (5, 2). The last player to win five times in a season on TOUR was Justin Thomas in 2016-17. Scheffler, who is making his 13th major start, finished T8 in his Open Championship debut in 2021.

**Jon Rahm** is in search of his second career major championship title and second TOUR win this season. Rahm, who became the first player from Spain to win the U.S. Open when he won in 2021, finished T3 at the 2021 Open Championship. The only player from Spain to win The Open Championship is Seve Ballesteros (1979, 1984, 1988). Rahm enters the week having made the cut in each of his last 14 starts, the longest active streak on TOUR (last MC: season-opening Fortinet Championship).

**Rory McIlroy**, a four-time major champion, has not won a major since the start of 2015. McIlroy won the final two majors of 2014 (The Open Championship, PGA Championship) and has 16 top-10s in majors since then, the most of any player in that span. McIlroy recently moved into a tie for 31st on the all-time PGA TOUR wins list with his 21st career title at the 2022 RBC Canadian Open.

Reigning FedExCup Champion **Patrick Cantlay** is the highest-ranked player in the Official World Golf Ranking (No. 4) without a major championship title.

The only player to win THE PLAYERS Championship and The Open Championship in the same year is Jack Nicklaus (1978); 2022 PLAYERS winner **Cameron Smith** can join him with a win.

**Jordan Spieth** has three top-fives at The Open Championship: T4 at St Andrews in 2015, a win in 2017, and a solo-second in 2021.

**Will Zalatoris** has finished runner-up in each of the last two majors, falling in a playoff to Justin Thomas at the PGA Championship and losing by one stroke at the U.S. Open. The last player to finish runner-up in three majors in a year was Ernie Els in 2000.

**Kurt Kitayama**, runner-up at last week's Genesis Scottish Open, is making his eighth career start in a major (best result: T51/2020 PGA Championship) and third at The Open (MC in 2019 and 2021).

**Mackenzie Hughes** finished T6 in his Open Championship debut in 2021, his only top-10 in 13 major appearances.

### TOURNAMENT STORYLINES

The Barracuda Championship field, like last week's Barbasol Championship, is comprised of players from both the PGA TOUR and DP World Tour. There are 50 places available for the top players from the DP World Tour priority ranking. The Barracuda Championship winner will receive benefits on each Tour:

- FedExCup points: 300
- DP World Tour Rankings points: 710
- PGA TOUR exemption (for current PGA TOUR members): thru 2024
- PGA TOUR exemption (for non-members): thru 2022-23
- DP World Tour exemption: thru 2024

The last six winners of the Barracuda Championship were first-time PGA TOUR winners, the longest active streak on TOUR (2016/Greg Chalmers, 2017/Chris Stroud, 2018/Andrew Putnam, 2019/Collin Morikawa, 2020/Richy Werenski, 2021/Erik van Rooyen).

Four weeks remain in the FedExCup Regular Season, with the Barracuda Championship providing an opportunity for players to make a run towards one of the 125 spots in the FedExCup Playoffs. Six players have qualified for the FedExCup Playoffs in each season since the inception in 2007, including **Charley Hoffman**, who is currently outside the top 125 at No. 173 in the FedExCup standings.

Eight players who finished in the top 10 at last week's Barbasol Championship are in the field, including **Mark Hubbard**, who finished third for his best performance on TOUR since a T2 at the 2019 Houston Open. Hubbard is currently No. 92 in the FedExCup as he seeks to qualify for the FedExCup Playoffs for the first time since 2020 and third time overall (other: 2015-16, Finished No. 115). 25 players are making the trip from the Genesis Scottish Open to the Barracuda Championship, led by **Rasmus Hojgaard** (T10).

Eight-time PGA TOUR winner **Geoff Ogilvy** is making his first start on the PGA TOUR since the 2018 Barracuda Championship, competing on a sponsor exemption. Ogilvy's most recent TOUR win came at the 2014 Barracuda Championship.

**Joe Highsmith**, a recent graduate of Pepperdine University, finished No. 10 in the 2022 PGA TOUR University Velocity Global Ranking and will compete on a sponsor exemption. Highsmith is making his first PGA TOUR start as a professional (MC/2021 U.S. Open as an amateur) and has made five starts on PGA TOUR Canada via PGA TOUR University, finishing in the top five both times (T2/ATB Classic, T4/Prince Edward Island Open).

## FEDEXCUP and SEASON STORYLINES

**Last time out:** Xander Schauffele won the Genesis Scottish Open, earning his seventh PGA TOUR title and winning on TOUR in back-to-back starts for the second time in his career (won the Travelers Championship in his most recent start). Trey Mullinax earned his first title at the Barbasol Championship, defeating Kevin Streelman by one stroke.

**No. 1:** World No. 1 and FedExCup leader Scottie Scheffler finished T2 at the U.S. Open to set the PGA TOUR record for most official money earned in a season at \$12,896,849 (previous: \$12,030,465/Jordan Spieth/2014-15). With his third runner-up finish of the season, the four-time TOUR winner became the fourth player (eighth instance) since the start of the 2000 season to record four or more wins and three or more runner-up finishes in a season, joining Tiger Woods (4), Phil Mickelson (2) and Jordan Spieth.
