Second-Round Notes - Friday, October 29, 2021

Weather: Partly cloudy. High of 78. Wind WNW 10-15 mph, gusting to 20 mph. Play was suspended due to darkness at 6:34 p.m. on Thursday with 13 players yet to complete their round. The first round resumed at 8:15 a.m. Friday and was completed at 9:12 a.m. The second round began as scheduled at 7:35 a.m.

Things to Know

- At 10-under 61, Taylor Pendrith sets 18-hole Butterfield Bermuda Championship scoring record
- Pendrith holds his first career lead/co-lead after any round on the PGA TOUR
- Patrick Rodgers cards a second-round 64, marking his best round since the 2019 Wyndham Championship
- Danny Lee and David Skinns turn in back-to-back rounds of 4-under 67 and sit T3
- Defending champion Brian Gay makes the cut on the number with scores of 75-67

Taylor Pendrith (1st/-11)

- Set the best score in Butterfield Bermuda Championship history with a career-low 10-under 61 in tournament debut (previous: 62/Brendon Todd/R4/2019, 62/Scottie Scheffler/R1/2019)
- Equals season's lowest 18-hole score (most recent: 61/Robert Streb/R1/THE CJ CUP @SUMMIT, Emiliano Grillo/R4/ THE CJ CUP @SUMMIT)
- 30-year-old holds his first career lead/co-lead after any round on the PGA TOUR
- His previous-low score on TOUR was 65 (set three times; most recently at the 2021 Shriners Children's Open/R1)
- Second-round 61 included nine birdies, his career-best total in a round
- At 11-under 131, cards 36-hole tournament record (previous: 131/Harry Higgs, Brendon Todd, Scottie Scheffler/2019) and carries a one-stroke lead into the third round
- Posts a career-best two eagles this week, both on the Par-5 17th
- Best finish in 12 PGA TOUR starts is T11 at the 2021 Barbasol Championship
- Canada native is a two-time Mackenzie Tour-PGA TOUR Canada winner
- Finished the 2020-21 combined season No. 7 in the Korn Ferry Tour points; recorded four runner-up finishes and 21 top-25s across 37 starts

Patrick Rodgers (2nd/-10)

- Cards a second-round 64, marking his best round since the 2019 Wyndham Championship (63/R1)
- Began this season with a T6 at the Fortinet Championship and followed with a missed cut at Sanderson Farms Championship
- Making third consecutive start at the Butterfield Bermuda Championship (2019/MC, 2020/T59)
- Seeking first PGA TOUR victory in his 194th start; owns three runner-up finishes (most recent: 2018 The RSM Classic)
- Finished last season at No. 128 in the FedExCup standings, failing to qualify for the FedExCup Playoffs for the first time in his sixth season as a TOUR member

Additional Notes

- Vincent Whaley (3rd/-9) seeks third top-10 on TOUR (T9/2021 Barracuda Championship, T9/2020 Puerto Rico Open); missed the cut with 70-76 in 2020 at his only previous start in this event
- Danny Lee (T4/-8) advances to the weekend for the first time in five starts (previous made cut: 2021 Palmetto Championship/T19); playing on a Minor Medical Extension with three tournaments remaining (including this week) to earn 289 FedExCup points (solo 2nd) to regain full PGA TOUR status, or 135 points (solo 4th) to play out of the 126-150 category for the remainder of the season
- PGA TOUR rookie David Skinns (T4/-8) turns in back-to-back rounds of 4-under 67
- Monday qualifier Patrick Flavin (T6/-7) advances to the weekend in second PGA TOUR start (MC/2020 Waste Management Phoenix Open); posted two top-10s in 13 starts on 2020-21 Korn Ferry Tour season (T5/2021 Evans Scholars Invitational, T10/2021 Wichita Open)
- Past major champions Patrick Reed and Graeme McDowell sit T17 at 5-under 137 in their tournament debuts
- **Jim Knous** (T63) followed a 5-over 76 in round one with a 5-under 66; making his last start on his medical extension and needing a solo 67th or better to retain PGA TOUR status
- Defending champion **Brian Gay** makes the cut on the number with scores of 75-67
- Callum Tarren was disqualified for signing an incorrect scorecard
- Matt Every withdrew during the second round with a wrist injury
