### Things to Know

- Taylor Pendrith's 196 total matches the 54-hole tournament record
- The leading three players are from Canada, New Zealand and Australia; a non-American winner on Sunday would mark the fourth in as many weeks on the PGA TOUR
- 12 of the 16 players at T10 or better seek their first PGA TOUR victory
- Both previous winners of the Butterfield Bermuda Championship, Brendon Todd and Brian Gay, came from two back after 54 holes to win
- Defending champion Brian Gay fires bogey-free 64 to sit T22 after making the cut on the number

## Taylor Pendrith (1st/-17)

- Birdies three of the four par-3 holes en route to 6-under 65 to take a three-stroke lead into the final round while searching for his first TOUR title
- 17-under 196 total matches the Butterfield Bermuda Championship 54-hole record (Harry Higgs/2019)
- Following his 36-hole lead/co-lead yesterday, holds his second career lead/co-lead after any round on the PGA TOUR

- Three-stroke lead is largest 54-hole margin in tournament history and largest on TOUR since the 2021 Wyndham Championship when Russell Henley led by three
- He and wife, Meg, got married two weeks ago (October 16)
- Best finish in 12 PGA TOUR starts is T11 at the 2021 Barbasol Championship
- Canada native is a two-time Mackenzie Tour-PGA TOUR Canada winner
- Finished the 2020-21 combined season No. 7 in the Korn Ferry Tour points; recorded four runner-up finishes and 21 top-25s across 37 starts

## **Danny Lee (2<sup>nd</sup>/-14)**

- Records eight birdies and two bogeys en route to 6-under 65, his lowest round on TOUR since 64/R2/2020 THE NORTHERN TRUST
- New Zealander seeks second TOUR title in his 272<sup>nd</sup> start, with his first coming in his 98<sup>th</sup> start at the 2015 Greenbrier Classic in a four-man playoff over David Hearn, Robert Streb and Kevin Kisner
- A win Sunday would mark a period of 6 years, 3 months, 26 days and 174 PGA TOUR starts between victories
- Playing on a Minor Medical Extension with three tournaments remaining (including this week) to earn 289
   FedExCup points (solo 2<sup>nd</sup>) to regain full PGA TOUR status, or 135 points (solo 4<sup>th</sup>) to play out of the 126-150 category for the remainder of the season
- Advanced to the FedExCup Playoffs in seven consecutive seasons before finishing No. 183 in 2020-21 season
- Currently ranked No. 314 in the Official World Golf Ranking having reached his high of No. 34 in 2016

#### Lucas Herbert (3<sup>rd</sup>/-13)

- Making 19<sup>th</sup> start on TOUR and first in Bermuda, posts back-to-back rounds of 65
- Finished T18 at 2021 the Memorial Tournament presented by Workday, his best result in 18 prior starts
- World No. 57 earned PGA TOUR membership for this season via Korn Ferry Tour Finals, helped by a T4 finish at 2021 Albertsons Boise Open
- Australian claimed his first title on European Tour in 2020, on Australia Day, defeating Christiaan Bezuidenhout in a playoff for the Omega Dubai Desert Classic; won his second European Tour title, on Independence Day, at the 2021 Dubai Duty Free Irish Open
- Represented Australia as an amateur at the 2014 Eisenhower Trophy, finishing T2 (individual), three strokes behind Jon Rahm

#### **Additional Notes**

- Patrick Rodgers (T4/-12) seeks first PGA TOUR victory in his 194th start; owns three runner-up finishes (most recent: 2018 The RSM Classic); finished last season at No. 128 in the FedExCup standings, failing to qualify for the FedExCup Playoffs for the first time in his sixth season as a TOUR member
- Vincent Whaley (T4/-12) seeks third top-10 on TOUR (T9/2021 Barracuda Championship, T9/2020 Puerto Rico Open); missed the cut with 70-76 in 2020 at his only previous start in this event
- Should Monday qualifier **Patrick Flavin** (T8/-10) stay inside the top-10 he would earn a start in next week's World Wide Technology Championship at Mayakoba
- After posting a double bogey at No. 14, 2021 Palmetto Championship at Congaree winner Garrick Higgo (T10/-9) closed with four consecutive birdies; his 10 birdies in the third round marks his most on TOUR and matches the most in tournament history
- Graeme McDowell (T10/-9) seeks his first top-10 since T4 at the 2021 Corales Puntacana Championship in March
- Patrick Reed (T17/-8), the highest-ranked player in the field at No. 24 on the Official World Golf Ranking, notches a double bogey on his card for the third consecutive round, this time at the par-5 17<sup>th</sup> where he posted eaglebirdie in the first two rounds
- After finishing eagle-birdie on Friday to make the cut on the number, Ben Kohles (T22/-7) fires a bogey-free, career-low 64
- After a pair of 68s to make the cut in his PGA TOUR debut, Texas Tech's Ludvig Aberg (T43/-4) followed with a 2over 73
- **Jim Knous** (T56/-2) is making his last start on his medical extension and requires a solo 67th or better to retain PGA TOUR status
- A non-American winner on Sunday would mark the fourth in as many weeks on the PGA TOUR (Sungjae Im/Korea/Shriners Children's Open, Rory McIlroy/Northern Ireland/THE CJ CUP @ SUMMIT, Hideki Matsuyama/Japan/ZOZO CHAMPIONSHIP)
