Things to Know

- Lucas Herbert picks up his first PGA TOUR victory in his 20th start
- The PGA TOUR rookie entered the final round trailing by four strokes; marks the third come-from-behind win at the event
- The Australian becomes the fourth international winner on the PGA TOUR in as many weeks
- World No. 24 Patrick Reed finishes T2 to record seventh runner-up on TOUR
- Playing on a Minor Medical Extension, Danny Lee secures conditional PGA TOUR status with a runner-up finish
- After holding the outright lead after the second and third rounds Taylor Pendrith shoots 5-over76 and finishes T5
- Three players finish T7 to become exempt for next week's World Wide Technology Championship at Mayakoba: Davis Riley, Curtis Thompson and Vincent Whaley
- In the final start under his Major Medical Extension, Jim Knous earns enough FedExCup points to retain conditional PGA TOUR and full Korn Ferry Tour status

- Picks up his first PGA TOUR victory in his 20th start; previous-best career finish: T18/2021 the Memorial Tournament presented by Workday
- At 25 years, 10 months, 26 days, becomes the youngest winner of the Butterfield Bermuda Championship
- Becomes the first player to pick up his first PGA TOUR victory at the Butterfield Bermuda Championship and first first-time winner of the season
- Records the third come-from-behind win at the event; entered the final round trailing Taylor Pendrith by four strokes and closed with a 2-under 69,
- Four-strokes marks largest come-from-behind win of the season (previous: 3/Sungjae Im/Shriners Children's Open)

- Collects 500 FedExCup points and moves to T5 with Rory McIlroy in the FedExCup standings; projected to move from No. 57 to within the top 45 in the Official World Golf Ranking
- Australian becomes the first international winner of the Butterfield Bermuda Championship
- Records the fourth win by an international player on the PGA TOUR in as many weeks (Sungjae Im/Korea/Shriners Children's Open, Rory McIlroy/Northern Ireland/THE CJ CUP @ SUMMIT, Hideki Matsuyama/Japan/ZOZO CHAMPIONSHIP)
- With second European Tour title at the 2021 Dubai Duty Free Irish Open earlier this year, becomes the first Aussie since Adam Scott in 2008 (Qatar Masters, AT&T Byron Nelson) to win individual titles on both the European Tour and PGA TOUR in the same year
- Becomes the 10th PGA TOUR player to win on Halloween and first since 2004 (Vijay Singh/Valspar Championship)
- Earned PGA TOUR membership for this season via Korn Ferry Tour Finals, highlighted by a T4 finish at 2021 Albertsons Boise Open

Additional Notes

- The highest-ranked player in the field at No. 24 on the Official World Golf Ranking, **Patrick Reed**, closes with a 6-under 65 to finish T2 (-14) and record his seventh runner-up result on TOUR; marks best finish since fifth at 2021 the Memorial Tournament presented by Workday
- Playing in the final group, New Zealander **Danny Lee** (T2/-14) was in search of his first PGA TOUR win since the 2015 Greenbrier Classic; playing on a Minor Medical Extension secured conditional PGA TOUR status and has two tournaments remaining to earn 44 FedExCup points to regain full PGA TOUR status
- **Patrick Rodgers** (4th/-13) improves results with each start in Bermuda (MC/2019, T59/2020, 4th/2021); marks second top-10 finish of the season (T6/Fortinet Championship)
- **Scott Stallings** (T5/-12) started the day 14-strokes (T50) off the lead and recorded nine birdies en route to 9-under 62, the low round of the day and his lowest round in an individual stroke play event on TOUR since the 2017 Barbasol Championship (60/R3)
- PGA TOUR rookie **Taylor Pendrith** (T5/-12) held the outright lead after the second and third rounds before shooting a final-round 5-over 76; marks best finish of his TOUR career (previous: T11/2021 Barbasol Championship); week highlighted by matching the Butterfield Bermuda Championship 36-hole scoring record and tying the 54-hole tournament record
- With T7 (-11) results, **Davis Riley**, **Curtis Thompson** and **Vincent Whaley** post career-best results and earn a start in next week's World Wide Technology Championship at Mayakoba
- **Peter Malnati** (T7/-11) earns his second top-25 finish of the season (T22/Sanderson Farms Championship)
- Defending champion **Brian Gay** finished T12 at 10-under; first player to record 100 putts or less in a tournament this season
- In the final start under his Major Medical Extension, **Jim Knous** (T56/-2) earns enough FedExCup points to retain conditional PGA TOUR and full Korn Ferry Tour status for the remainder of the season; entered the week needing 3.516 points (solo 67th) to do so and earned 5 points with the five-way T57
