TOURNAMENT STORYLINES

The BMW Championship, the second event of the FedExCup Playoffs, determines the 30 players who will qualify for the Playoffs finale, the TOUR Championship. The BMW Championship is the oldest non-major on the PGA TOUR schedule, dating back to 1899. The Wilmington Country Club will play host, marking the PGA TOUR's first-ever event in the state of Delaware and the 10th different venue to host the BMW Championship since the inception of the FedExCup in 2007.

Defending FedExCup Champion and 2021 BMW Championship winner **Patrick Cantlay** sits at No. 7 in the FedExCup standings. Cantlay seeks to become the first player to defend his BMW Championship title since the tournament became a FedExCup Playoffs event in 2007. If Cantlay goes on to win the FedExCup title, he would be the first to win the season-long race in back-to-back years and third player to win it multiple times (Tiger Woods, Rory McIlroy). There have been four occasions where a player has won the BMW Championship en route to capturing the FedExCup: Tiger Woods (2007, 2009), Billy Horschel (2014) and Patrick Cantlay (2021).

World No. 1 **Scottie Scheffler** is making his third appearance in the FedExCup Playoffs, advancing to the TOUR Championship in each of his first two seasons on TOUR (No. 5 in 2019-20, No. 22 in 2020-21) with top-25 finishes in both BMW Championship starts (T20/2020, T22/2021). Scheffler has won four times this season, including the Masters Tournament, and looks to become the second player to win the Masters and the FedExCup in the same season (Jordan Spieth, 2014-15).

With his win at FedEx St. Jude Championship, **Will Zalatoris** moved to No. 1 in the FedExCup standings for the first time in his PGA TOUR career. Since the points structure changed prior to the 2009 season, two players occupying the No. 1 position in the standings entering the BMW Championship have gone on to win the FedExCup: Henrik Stenson (2013) and Dustin Johnson (2020). Zalatoris became the first player since Camilo Villegas at the 2008 BMW Championship to make a FedExCup Playoffs event his maiden PGA TOUR title. Villegas went on to win the TOUR Championship in his next start.

Eight rookies have advanced to the BMW Championship: **Joohyung Kim, Taylor Moore, Taylor Pendrith, Mito Pereira, Davis Riley, Alex Smalley, Sahith Theegala** and **Cameron Young**, with four of the eight sitting inside the top 30 in the FedExCup standings: Young (13), Kim (25), Riley (26) and Theegala (27).

There has not been a season in the FedExCup era in which more than two rookies qualified for the TOUR Championship (seasons with 2: 2015-16, 2016-17, 2019-20). Two rookies have won this season (Chad Ramey/Corales Puntacana Championship, Joohyung Kim/Wyndham Championship).

There are seven players ranked inside the top 30 of the FedExCup standings without a win on the PGA TOUR this season. Five-time runner-up **Cameron Young** (No. 13) is the highest-ranked player without a win this season.

The Wilmington Country Club played host to the 2013 Palmer Cup competition, where the United States team led by **Justin Thomas** and **Daniel Berger** defeated the European team, 20.5-9.5.

The finish listed next to a player's name is the minimum finish required for that player to have a chance to move inside the top 30 and qualify for next week's TOUR Championship.

ADDITIONAL STORYLINES

Two-time FedExCup Champion **Rory McIlroy** enters the week No. 9 in the FedExCup standings and looks to become the first player to win the season-long race three times. McIlroy has five wins in FedExCup Playoffs events, the second-most of any player (6, Dustin Johnson).

Three of the last four BMW Championships have been won in a playoff, including when **Jon Rahm** defeated Dustin Johnson in 2020. Rahm has four top-10s in five starts at the second FedExCup Playoffs event and has qualified for the TOUR Championship for five consecutive seasons.

Hideki Matsuyama has qualified for the TOUR Championship in each of the last eight seasons, the longest active streak among players in the field. **Justin Thomas** (6), **Tony Finau** (5), **Jon Rahm** (5) and **Xander Schauffele** (5) are the only other players in the field with active streaks of five seasons or more.

2017 BMW Championship winner **Marc Leishman** has advanced to the event 13 times in the FedExCup era, tied for second-most of any player in that span (most: 14, Phil Mickelson).

Four players played their way into the BMW Championship following the FedEx St. Jude Championship: **Lucas Glover** (T3/No. 34), **Adam Scott** (T5/No. 45), **Andrew Putnam** (T5/No. 47) and **Wyndham Clark** (T28/No. 70).

Cameron Smith, who enters the week No. 3 in the FedExCup standings withdrew from the BMW Championship due to hip discomfort, while **Tommy Fleetwood** (No. 56) will also not be participating.

FEDEXCUP and SEASON STORYLINES

Four defending champions have won this season, the most in a season since 2016-17 (4). Players to successfully defend a title this season:

Rory McIlroy, RBC Canadian Open K.H. Lee, AT&T Byron Nelson
 Sam Burns, Valspar Championship Viktor Hovland, World Wide Technology Championship at Mayakoba

Scottie Scheffler received a \$4 million bonus via the Comcast Business TOUR TOP 10 for holding the top spot in the FedExCup standings at the end of the FedExCup Regular Season and a \$1 million bonus for winning the Aon Risk Reward Challenge. The bonuses do not count towards his official money total of \$13,176,910 million, the largest in a single season in PGA TOUR history. His total of 3,556 FedExCup points during the Regular Season was the second-highest since the points format changed in 2009 (most: 4,169, Jordan Spieth, 2014-15).

With Will Zalatoris winning the FedEx St. Jude Championship last week, Cameron Young moved No. 1 for most official money earned in a single season without a victory and has earned \$6,387,098 this season, which is also the most by a rookie in PGA TOUR history (previous: \$4,312,674, Xander Schauffele, 2016-17).
