Things to Know

- For a third consecutive Charles Schwab Challenge, an 18-hole leader/co-leader also leads/co-leads after 36 holes (Beau Hossler, Scottie Scheffler/2022; Jordan Spieth/2021; Harold Varner III/2020)
- Since 1990, the second-round leader/co-leader has won the Charles Schwab Challenge 11 times
- World No. 1 and FedExCup leader **Scottie Scheffler** posted a second consecutive bogey-free round, carding a 5-under 65 Friday to retain a share of the lead; he is the only player in the field without a bogey
- Making his 10th start and playing his 26th round at the Charles Schwab Challenge, **Scott Stallings** cards a bogey-free 6-under 64, his lowest score at the event and ties **Danny Lee** for the low round of the day
- Co-leaders are 1-2-3 in Strokes Gained: Approach the Green this week (Hossler/1st; Stallings/2nd; Scheffler/3rd)
- Three of the top four players on the leaderboard have less than three bogeys through 36 holes: Scheffler (T1/zero), Hossler (T1/two), **Patrick Reed** (4th/two)
- Outside majors, only the 2021 ZOZO CHAMPIONSHIP (-8) and 2022 PLAYERS Championship (-7) had higher 36-hole leads on TOUR this season
- Seventh over-par cut this season, and the first outside a major championship since THE PLAYERS (+2)

Second-Round Lead Notes

- Second-round leaders/co-leaders to win the Charles Schwab Challenge since 1990 (most recent: Justin Rose/2018)
- 8 Second-round leaders/co-leaders to win individual stroke-play events in the 2021-22 season (most recent: Jon Rahm/Mexico Open at Vidanta)

Scott Stallings (T1/-9)

• First 36-hole lead/co-lead on TOUR; previous career-high 36-hole position on TOUR was T2 at 2012 Memorial Tournament presented by Workday (finished T25)

- Season-high 36-hole position prior to Friday was T3 at 2022 Valspar Championship (finished T16)
- Ties his lowest opening 36-hole score on TOUR (131); previously posted 13-under 131 at 2013 American Express (finished T4) and 11-under 131 at 2022 Valspar Championship (finished T16)
- In his 10th appearance and 26th round at the Charles Schwab Challenge, carded a bogey-free 6-under 64 for his lowest round at the event
- Prior to this week, carded seven sub-par rounds at the event but had not recorded multiple sub-par rounds in the same Charles Schwab Challenge since 2013, when he finished T4 with rounds of 69-65-69-66
- Leads field with 14 birdies through 36 holes, three more than the No. 2 player in the category (Cam Davis)
- Three made cuts and one finish higher than T63 in nine previous starts in the event (T4/2013)
- Two top-10s in 21 starts this season (T6/Fortinet Championship; T5/Butterfield Bermuda Championship)
- Seeks a fourth PGA TOUR title and first since 2014 Farmers Insurance Open
- Qualified for third U.S. Open earlier this week via Final Qualifying in Dallas, finishing solo-11th and 8-under par across 36 holes at Royal Oaks Country Club and Lakewood Country Club

Beau Hossler (T1/-9)

- Maintains a share of the lead with a bogey-free 5-under 65, his sixth round of 65 or better this season and his second-lowest score in a Charles Schwab Challenge (64/2018 round 1/finished T64)
- Three previous 36-hole leads/co-leads on TOUR were all in 2018 (AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am/T43; Houston Open/P2; 2018 Quicken Loans National/T6)
- Ties his lowest opening 36-hole score on TOUR (131); previously posted 9-under 131 at 2018 Quicken Loans National (T6)
- One of seven players in the field with fewer than three scores of bogey or worse this week; he bogeyed
 Nos. 5 and 8 in the first round
- Prior to this week, carded two sub-par rounds in 12 rounds played at the event but had not recorded multiple sub-par rounds in the same Charles Schwab Challenge
- Best finish in four previous Charles Schwab Challenge starts was T40/2019
- Two top-10s in 16 starts this season (3rd/AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am; T4/Valero Texas Open)
- Best PGA TOUR finishes in 135 starts: P2/2018 Houston Open, T2/2018 Travelers Championship

Scottie Scheffler (T1/-9)

- World No. 1 and Dallas resident carded a second consecutive bogey-free round and maintained a share of the lead with a 5-under 65; he is the only player in the field without a bogey through two rounds
- 1-for-4 when holding a 36-hole lead/co-lead on TOUR (won 2022 Masters Tournament)
- Has finished no worse than T7 when leading/co-leading after 36 holes on TOUR
- Of his three stroke-play wins on TOUR, sat T20 or lower through 36 holes in two of them (T44/2022 WM Phoenix Open; T20/2022 Arnold Palmer Invitational presented by Mastercard)
- Second made cut in three appearances at Charles Schwab Challenge (T55/2020)
- Prior to this week, lowest score in six rounds at Charles Schwab Challenge was 2-under 68 (round 1/2020)
- Bidding to post the first five-win season on TOUR since Justin Thomas won five times in 2016-17

Additional Player Notes

- Of the eight 18-hole co-leaders, six remain in the top 10: **Beau Hossler** (T1), **Scottie Scheffler** (T1), **Patrick Reed** (4th) **Chris Kirk** (T5), **Cam Davis** (T7), **Harold Varner III** (T7), **Webb Simpson** (T12), **Nick Taylor** (T23)
- Jordan Spieth cards a bogey-free 4-under 66 with opening birdies at Nos. 10 and 11, a birdie at No. 14 for the second consecutive day, followed by 12 consecutive pars and a closing birdie at No. 9; he stands T12 and opens the Charles Schwab Challenge with consecutive sub-par rounds for a third consecutive year and the seventh time in 10 career appearances
- In his 12th start at the event, 2015 Charles Schwab Challenge winner **Chris Kirk** posts a 3-under 67 to open the event with back-to-back sub-par rounds for the first time since his 2015 win (68-69)
- At solo-fourth, **Patrick Reed** is inside the top five for the second time since in his last four starts (T3 through 36 holes at Mexico Open at Vidanta, finished T42)
- **Justin Thomas**, winner of last week's PGA Championship, played Nos. 7-10 at 6-over par Friday, including a triple bogey at the par-4 ninth, ending the longest active streak of made cuts on TOUR at 21, dating to the 2021 Charles Schwab Challenge
 - o **Jon Rahm** now has the longest active streak with 11 consecutive made cuts
- Thomas is the third consecutive PGA Championship winner to miss the cut in their first start following the win
- Defending champion **Jason Kokrak** slips to T51 following a 1-over 71 in the second round; Ben Hogan (1946-47, 1952-53) is the only player to successfully defend a Charles Schwab Challenge title
