**Things to Know**

- Beginning the final round seven strokes off the lead, Sam Burns ties the low round of the day (Danny Lee) with a 5-under 65, then sinks a 38' 2" putt for birdie on the first playoff hole to beat World No. 1, Scottie Scheffler
- Burns ties Nick Price (1994) for the largest final-round comeback by a winner in Charles Schwab Challenge history
- With his third win of the season, Burns becomes the second player (Scottie Scheffler) to win more than twice in the 2021-22 season
- Burns moves to 2-1 in PGA TOUR playoffs, while Scheffler drops to 1-1
- Scheffler was seeking to become the third player in TOUR history to record his first five wins in the same season
- Brendon Todd finishes solo-third, marking his best finish since winning the 2019 World Wide Technology Championship at Mayakoba
- Scoring averages: R1:70.783, R2: 69.824, R3: 70.609, R4: 72.275

- Beginning the final round seven strokes back, made just three pars on his first 12 holes (seven birdies, two bogeys) en route to a 5-under 65, tying the low round of the day (Danny Lee)
- After finishing his round at 3:47 p.m. CT, watched as World No. 1 Scottie Scheffler finished with a 2-over 72 and finish in a tie with Burns at 9-under 271
- On the first extra hole, the par-4 18<sup>th</sup>, sank a 38' 2" putt for birdie from the fringe to clinch his fourth career PGA TOUR title, and third of the season, at the age of 25 years, 10 months, 6 days in his 102<sup>nd</sup> start
- Becomes the first player to hole a shot from off the green to win since Matthew Wolff at the 2019 3M Open
- With the win at Colonial Country Club, moves to No. 2 in the FedExCup with 2,101 points (1,041 behind Scheffler)

- With the win, ties Nick Price (1994) for the largest final-round comeback by a winner in Charles Schwab Challenge history
- For the second week in a row, the winner has emerged via a playoff after beginning the day seven strokes back (Justin Thomas/PGA Championship)
- Becomes the second player with more than two wins this season, joining Scottie Scheffler (4)
- PGA TOUR titles: 2021 Valspar Championship, 2021 Sanderson Farms Championship, 2022 Valspar Championship, *2022 Charles Schwab Challenge*
- In two previous Charles Schwab Challenge starts, missed the cut in 2018 and finished T31 in 2019

#### **Scottie Scheffler (P2/-9)**

- Made two bogeys and no birdies for a 2-over 72, marking the second occasion to not card at least one birdie or better in a round (2016 U.S. Open Rd 2)
- After holding a share of the 18- and 36-hole lead, World No. 1, FedExCup leader and Dallas resident moved into sole possession of the lead following a 2-under 68 in round three
- Drops to 1-for-4 when holding a 54-hole lead/co-lead on TOUR (won 2022 Masters Tournament)
- Would have become the first FedExCup leader to win the Charles Schwab Challenge
- Was looking for the first five-win season on TOUR since Justin Thomas in 2016-17
- Would've become the fourth player (fifth instance) since 1960 to net five TOUR wins in a season before the June 1 (Arnold Palmer/1960/1962, Johnny Miller/1974, Tom Watson/1980)
- Was making his third appearance at the Charles Schwab Challenge (T55/2020, MC/2021, P2/2022)

#### **Additional Player Notes**

- In search of his fourth career PGA TOUR title and first since the 2019 World Wide Technology Championship at Mayakoba **Brendon Todd** closed with a 1-over 71 to finish third at 8-under 272; marks his second top-10 finish of the season (T8/Valero Texas Open); maiden TOUR title came at the 2014 AT&T Byron Nelson in the Dallas area; comes off a T8 finish in last year's Charles Schwab Challenge
- **Davis Riley** birdied six of his first 11 holes before following a bogey at the par-3 14<sup>th</sup> with a double bogey at the par-4 15<sup>th</sup> and finishing T4 at 7-under 273; was looking to become the sixth player to win the Charles Schwab Challenge in his debut and first since Sergio Garcia in 2001
- Angling for his fourth career PGA TOUR title and first since the 2014 Farmers Insurance Open, **Scott Stallings** closed with a 2-over 72 to tie his best finish in 10 starts at the Charles Schwab Challenge of T4 (2013)
- In an effort to claim his first career PGA TOUR title in his 182<sup>nd</sup> start, **Harold Varner III** was tied for the lead through 11 holes, before playing Nos. 12-18 in 10-over par, resulting in an 8-over 78 and T27 at even-par 280
- Seeking his eighth top-10 finish in 10 starts at the Charles Schwab Challenge, 2016 champion and Dallas resident **Jordan Spieth** closed with an even-par 70 to finish T7; in addition to his 2016 win, finished runner-up in 2015, 2017 and 2021
- Defending champion **Jason Kokrak** finished 67<sup>th</sup> at 8-over 288
