Things to Know

- A day removed from his 30th birthday, Adam Schenk birdies eight straight holes (Nos. 4-11) en route to a career-low 10-under 62; eight marks the event's longest birdie streak since 2003 and is one shy of the PGA TOUR record
- World No. 1 and 2017 Farmers Insurance Open champion **Jon Rahm** birdies three of his first four and three of his last four holes to shoot 7-under 65
- 2017 FedExCup Champion **Justin Thomas** fires a bogey-free 9-under 63 in bid for a third consecutive top-5 finish this season
- In search of his second TOUR title (2015 Sanderson Farms Championship), **Peter Malnati** is the only player bogey-free through 36 holes
- After opening in 9-under 63 on the North Course, Billy Horschel drops back to T12 with a 1-over 73 in round two
- Patrick Reed rallies from an even-par 72 in round two with a bogey-free 6-under 66 in bid to become the first to successfully defend the tournament's title since Tiger Woods (2005-2008)

- 4 Second-round leaders/co-leaders to win on TOUR in 2021-22 (Cameron Smith/Sentry Tournament of Champions)

Adam Schenk (T1/-13) SC-NC

• A day removed from his 30th birthday, strung together eight consecutive birdies on Nos. 4-11 en route to a career-low 10-under 62

- Eight straight birdies are the most at the Farmers Insurance Open since 2003 and falls one shy of the all-time PGA TOUR record (Kevin Chappell/2019 Greenbrier, Mark Calcavecchia/2009 RBC Canadian Open)
- Ten birdies ties his career-most in a round on TOUR (2018 RBC Canadian Open/R1)
- Hit 4-of-14 fairways in regulation in round two to become the first player on TOUR to hit four-or-fewer fairways and shoot 62 (or better) since John Huh (2016 Shriners Children's Open/R1)
- Marks his first 36-hole lead/co-lead on TOUR; previous best was T2/2019 Valero Texas Open (finished T7)
- Is making his fourth Farmers Insurance Open start (2018/MC, 2019/T57, 2021/MC)
- Best TOUR finish in 124 starts before this week was T3 at the 2021 Shriners Children's Open

Jon Rahm (T1/-13) SC-NC

- World No. 1 and 2017 Farmers Insurance Open birdied three of his first four holes and three of his last four on the North Course, good for a 7-under 65
- Marks his sixth 36-hole lead/co-lead; best finish among the five previous was third at the first of three FedExCup Playoffs events in 2021 (FedEx St. Jude Championship)
- Best finish in three previous starts this season was solo-second at the Sentry Tournament of Champions
- In addition to winning his first career TOUR event at Torrey Pines at the 2017 Farmers Insurance, won the 2021 U.S. Open at Torrey Pines

Justin Thomas (T1/-13) SC-NC

- 2017 FedExCup champion made nine birdies and no bogeys to post a 9-under 63
- When holding a 36-hole lead/co-lead before this week, has converted for the win on six of 12 occasions
- Is making his third start in the Farmers Insurance Open and first since 2015 (MC); finished T10 in his first start of 2014
- Seeks a third consecutive top-5 finish this season (3rd/World Wide Technology Championship at Mayakoba, T5/Sentry Tournament of Champions)
- Seeks a 15th career PGA TOUR title and first since the 2021 PLAYERS Championship

Additional Player Notes

- Playing the North Course, Cameron Tringale offset one bogey (par-4 18th) with six birdies and an eagle (par-5 fifth) to post a 7-under 65; lone top-10 finish in 12 previous Farmers Insurance Open starts was T4 in 2012; four-time TOUR runner-up remains in search of his title in his 318th start this week
- Following missed cuts in four of his last five starts, **Peter Malnati** sits alone in fifth place at 11-under 133 following a 6-under 66 on the North Course in round two; only player bogey-free through 36 holes; prior to last year's T10 in the event, missed the cut in first four starts; lone PGA TOUR victory came at the 2015 Sanderson Farms Championship
- Following his 9-under 63 on the North Course, 18-hole leader **Billy Horschel** posted a 1-over 73 on the South Course in round two and sits T12 at 8-under 136
- Making his third career start on the PGA TOUR, former UNLV golfer Taylor Montgomery (T12/-8) followed an
 even-par 72 on the South Course with an 8-under 64 in round two; finished T57 at 2021 U.S. Open held at Torrey
 Pines in his second TOUR appearance
- Making second start of the 2021-22 season and first of the year, **Dustin Johnson** (T17/-7) made five birdies against two bogeys, good for a 3-under 69; lone top-10 finish in nine starts at the event before this week was T3 in 2011
- Coming off four consecutive top-25 finishes in the event (T23/2018, T13/2019, T6/2020, Won/2021), defending champion Patrick Reed (T23/-6) improved from an even-par 72 on the South Course in round one with a bogey-free 6-under 66 in round two; last player to win consecutive Farmers Insurance Opens was Tiger Woods (2005-2008)
- Three-time Farmers Insurance Open winner **Phil Mickelson** (SC-NC) followed a 4-over 76 in round one with a 1-under 71 to miss his second cut in as many weeks; last time he missed cuts in back-to-back starts on TOUR was at the 2020 Genesis Invitational and 2020 Arnold Palmer Invitational; also missed cuts in consecutive weeks at The American Express and Farmers Insurance Open in 2020
