**Things to Know**

- After finishing his round nearly two hours before regulation play ended, **Luke List** defeats **Will Zalatoris** on the first hole of sudden death with a tap-in birdie at the par-5 18<sup>th</sup>, his first career TOUR victory
- Marks the second playoff of the 2021-22 PGA TOUR Season (Hideki Matsuyama defeated Russell Henley after one hole at the Sony Open in Hawaii)
- Marks the 18<sup>th</sup> playoff in event history and first since Jason Day defeated Alex Noren and Ryan Palmer in 2018
- **Will Zalatoris** was seeking his first PGA TOUR title in his 40<sup>th</sup> start at the site of his first professional start on TOUR
- 2015, 2018 Farmers Insurance Open champion **Jason Day** was looking to become the first player to win three times at the same venue since the 2014-15 PGA TOUR season
- 2017 tournament champion **Jon Rahm** comes up just shy of becoming the first player to win on TOUR while ranked as World No. 1 since Dustin Johnson (2020 Masters Tournament)
- **Patrick Reed** finished T46 in bid to become the first player successfully defend the tournament's title since Tiger Woods in 2008

- Birdied four of his first six holes and two of his last three to close with a 6-under 66, resulting in sudden death with Will Zalatoris
- With a tap-in birdie on the first extra hole, the par-5 18<sup>th</sup>, claimed his first career TOUR title in his 206<sup>th</sup> start at the age of 37 years, 15 days
- Moves to 1-1 in PGA TOUR playoffs (lost to Justin Thomas after one extra hole at the 2018 Honda Classic)
- With the win, collects 500 FedExCup points and moves to No. 4 in the standings
- With the win, earns a second berth into the Masters Tournament (T33/2005) and first start at the 2023 Sentry Tournament of Champions, among other events
- Becomes the first player in the last four years of the event to begin the week on the South Course
- Closed with final-round 6-under 66 for the second consecutive year (T10/2021) to become only the second player since 1999 to post multiple final-round scores of 66 or better in the event (Tiger Woods/3)

- The win marks his 23<sup>rd</sup> top-10 finish on TOUR and supplants two runner-up finishes (T2/2016 Sanderson Farms Championship, P2/2018 Honda Classic)
- Win comes in his ninth start of the season and marks his third top-10 (T7/ZOZO CHAMPIONSHIP, T10/The RSM Classic)
- Joins Lucas Herbert (Butterfield Bermuda Championship) and Talor Gooch (The RSM Classic) as first-time PGA TOUR winners this season

#### **Will Zalatoris (P2/-15)**

- 54-hole co-leader closed with a 1-under 71, before dropping to 0-1 in PGA TOUR playoffs
- Runner-up finish comes in his third appearance at Farmers Insurance Open (MC/2018, T7/2021); his first professional start on TOUR came at this event in 2018
- Other runner-up finish came at the 2021 Masters Tournament
- The finish at Torrey Pines comes off a T6 finish at last week's The American Express following a second-round 11-under 61
- Was seeking first TOUR title in 40<sup>th</sup> start

#### **Additional Player Notes**

- Looking to become the first World No. 1 to win on the PGA TOUR since Dustin Johnson at the 2020 Masters Tournament, 2017 Farmers Insurance Open champion **Jon Rahm** (T3/-14) offset three bogeys with four birdies to close with a 1-under 71
- Looking to join Tiger Woods (7) and Phil Mickelson (3) as players with three or more titles at this event, 2015 and 2018 Farmers Insurance Open champion **Jason Day** (T3/-14) closed his 13<sup>th</sup> start in the event with an even-par 72, highlighted by an eagle-2 from 118 yards at the par-4 14<sup>th</sup>; last of 12 wins on TOUR was 2018 Wells Fargo Championship
- **Cameron Tringale** (T3/-14) birdied the 72<sup>nd</sup> hole to finish with a 2-under 70 in his 13<sup>th</sup> Farmers Insurance Open start; marks his second top-10 finish in the event (T4/2012)
- Making his 100<sup>th</sup> start on TOUR, **Joaquin Niemann** (T6/-13) offset two bogeys with seven birdies to post a 5-under 67 in his third start in the event (T49/2020, T72/2019)
- 2018 FedExCup champion and 2019 Farmers Insurance Open winner **Justin Rose** (T6/-13) closed his 12<sup>th</sup> start in the event with a 4-under 68; was in search of his 11<sup>th</sup> TOUR title and first since the 2019 Farmers Insurance Open
- Making his 20<sup>th</sup> start in the event, Torrey Pines High School grad **Pat Perez** (T6/-13) holed his second shot from 167 yards at the par-4 seventh en route to a 4-under 68; marks his fourth top-10 finish in the event (T6/2005, T2/2014, T4/2017); father, Tony, was a first-tee starter for the event for more than two decades
- In his bid to become the first player to successfully defend a Farmers Insurance Open title since Tiger Woods in 2008, **Patrick Reed** finished T46 at 5-under 283
