**STORYLINES: THE PLAYOFFS START HERE**

The FedEx St. Jude Championship, the first event of the FedExCup Playoffs, will be held at TPC Southwind, which has now hosted a standard PGA TOUR event (FedEx St. Jude Classic), a World Golf Championships event (WGC-FedEx St. Jude Invitational) and a Playoffs event. The 2022 FedExCup Champion will receive a bonus of \$18 million.

World No. 1 and FedExCup leader **Scottie Scheffler** is making his third appearance in the FedExCup Playoffs, advancing to the TOUR Championship in each of his first two seasons on TOUR (No. 5 in 2019-20, No. 22 in 2020-21). Scheffler is making his fifth start on TOUR at TPC Southwind, having played the FedEx St. Jude Classic twice on a sponsor exemption (MC/2014, T43/2018). Scheffler has won four times this season, including the Masters Tournament, and looks to become the second player to win the Masters and the FedExCup in the same season (Jordan Spieth, 2014-15). Scheffler received a \$4 million bonus via the Comcast Business TOUR TOP 10 for holding the top spot in the FedExCup standings at the end of the FedExCup Regular Season and a \$1 million bonus for winning the Aon Risk Reward Challenge. The bonuses do not count towards his official money total of \$13,176,910 million, the largest in a single season in PGA TOUR history. His total of 3,556 FedExCup points during the Regular Season was the second-highest since the points format changed in 2009 (most: 4,169, Jordan Spieth, 2014-15).

Two players have qualified for the FedExCup Playoffs in each season since the inception of the FedExCup in 2007: **Matt Kuchar**, who enters the week No. 54 in the standings, and **Adam Scott** (No. 77). Four other players missed the Playoffs this season for the first time in the FedExCup era: Charley Hoffman, Phil Mickelson, Brandt Snedeker and Bubba Watson.

**Tony Finau** has won each of his last two starts on the PGA TOUR and is also the defending champion this week, winning the first event of the FedExCup Playoffs in 2021 at Liberty National Golf Club. Finau is one of three players this season to win in back-to-back starts, along with Scottie Scheffler and Xander Schauffele. The last player to win in three consecutive starts on TOUR was Dustin Johnson during the 2016-17 season (The Genesis Invitational, WGC-Mexico Championship, WGC-Dell Technologies Match Play).

**Joohyung Kim** won last week's Wyndham Championship by five strokes, joining the PGA TOUR as a full-time member and qualifying for the FedExCup Playoffs (enters the Playoffs at No. 34 in the FedExCup). At age 20 years, 1 month, 17 days, Kim became the second-youngest winner on the PGA TOUR since World War II (youngest: Jordan Spieth, 2013 John Deere Classic) and the first player born in the 2000s to win on TOUR. Kim, who will make his first start as a member this week, is eligible for the Arnold Palmer Award as PGA TOUR Rookie of the Year. There are now five rookies in the top 40 in the FedExCup standings: **Cameron Young** (No. 9), **Davis Riley** (No. 23), Kim (No. 34), **Mito Pereira** (No. 38) and **Sahith Theegala** (No. 39).

The FedExCup Playoffs changed from a four-tournament series to three in 2019, with the BMW Championship moving up to the second event. Since then, an average of 5.33 players per year have entered the first Playoffs event outside the top 70 in the FedExCup standings and gone on to qualify for the BMW Championship (4 in 2019, 6 in 2020, 6 in 2021). **Harry Higgs** (missed Playoffs) and **Alex Noren** (No. 59) both did so in 2020 and 2021.

**BMW CHAMPIONSHIP BUBBLE**

The finish listed next to a player's name is the minimum finish required for that player to have a chance to move inside the top 70 and qualify for next week's BMW Championship.

### ADDITIONAL STORYLINES

2021 runner-up **Cameron Smith** is making his first start since winning The Open Championship. Three players have won in back-to-back starts this season: Scottie Scheffler, Xander Schauffele and Tony Finau. Smith lost to Finau in a playoff at Liberty National in 2021 and carded a 60 in the third round, his career-low on TOUR (had a 12-foot, 10-inch birdie putt at No. 18 for 59).

Two-time FedExCup Champion **Rory McIlroy** enters the week No. 6 in the FedExCup standings and looks to become the first player to win the season-long race three times. McIlroy has five wins in FedExCup Playoffs events, the second-most of any player (6, Dustin Johnson).

Defending FedExCup Champion **Patrick Cantlay** finished the Regular Season No. 5 in the FedExCup standings and leads the PGA TOUR with 10 top-10s this season. Cantlay has three consecutive top-10s and eight results of T14 or better in his last nine starts, most recently finishing T2 at the Rocket Mortgage Classic. If Cantlay goes on to win the FedExCup title, he would be the first to win the season-long race in back-to-back years and third player to win it multiple times (Tiger Woods, Rory McIlroy).

**Jon Rahm** enters the week at No. 6 in the Official World Golf Ranking, falling out of the top five for the first time since September 14, 2019. In that span, Rahm spent 43 weeks as World No. 1 and won his first major championship title (2021 U.S. Open). Rahm has the lowest Scoring Average in FedExCup Playoffs history (min. 20 rounds) with an average of 68.14. He has four top-10s in five starts at the first FedExCup Playoffs event, including third-place finishes in 2017, 2019 and 2021.

**Hideki Matsuyama** has qualified for the TOUR Championship in each of the last eight seasons, the longest active streak among players in the field. **Justin Thomas** (6), **Tony Finau** (5), **Jon Rahm** (5) and **Xander Schauffele** (5) are the only other players in the field with active streaks of five seasons or more.

Rookie **Callum Tarren** missed his first eight cuts of the season and earned his first FedExCup points of the season at The Honda Classic with a T30. He went on to finish T5 at the Puerto Rico Open the following week and recorded additional top-10s at the John Deere Classic (T6) and 3M Open (T7), qualifying for the FedExCup Playoffs and securing his TOUR card for next season. **Ryan Brehm**, who made his first start of the season at the Puerto Rico Open and won, is the only other player that entered The Honda Classic with no FedExCup points and went on to qualify for the Playoffs.

At Liberty National Golf Club in 2021, **Keith Mitchell** made birdie at each of the final three holes in the final round to finish T8, moving into the top 70 and qualifying for the BMW Championship. Mitchell, who enters the FedExCup Playoffs at No. 37 in the standings, is looking to qualify for the TOUR Championship for the first time in his career.

**Marc Leishman** has qualified for the BMW Championship 12 times in the FedExCup era, tied for third-most of any player in that span. Leishman, who enters the week No. 62 in the standings, can move into a tie for second with Dustin Johnson if he qualifies this season (most: 14, Phil Mickelson).

## FEDEXCUP and SEASON STORYLINES

Each of the last two PGA TOUR events have been won by a margin of five strokes: Tony Finau at the Rocket Mortgage Classic and Joohyung Kim at the Wyndham Championship. The last time back-to-back tournaments on the TOUR schedule were decided by five strokes or more was during the 2017-18 season when there were three straight: Francesco Molinari, Quicken Loans National (8); Kevin Na, The Greenbrier Classic (5); Michael Kim, John Deere Classic (8).

Several official money records have been set this season, led by Scottie Scheffler earning \$13,176,910, the most official money earned in a single season in PGA TOUR history (previous: \$12,030,465, Jordan Spieth, 2014-15). Will Zalatoris (\$6,705,082) and Cameron Young (\$6,308,211) have both surpassed the previous record for most official money earned in a single season without a victory (\$6,306,679, Louis Oosthuizen, 2020-21), while Young's mark is the most by a rookie in history (\$4,312,674, Xander Schauffele, 2016-17).

Five PGA TOUR rookies are currently in the top 40 of the FedExCup standings as they attempt to qualify for the TOUR Championship in their first season on TOUR. There has not been a season in the FedExCup era in which more than two rookies qualified for the TOUR Championship (seasons with 2: 2015-16, 2016-17, 2019-20). Two rookies have won this season (Chad Ramey/Corales Puntacana Championship, Joohyung Kim/Wyndham Championship).
