Things to Know

- Will Zalatoris earns first career PGA TOUR win in 56th TOUR start and moves to No. 1 in the FedExCup
- Zalatoris becomes the second player to make a FedExCup Playoffs event his maiden TOUR title
- Zalatoris wins on third sudden-death hole, becoming the first player since 2011 to win with a bogey
- Marks the eighth playoff this season and first since the Charles Schwab Challenge; fifth playoff at the FedEx St. Jude Championship in the FedExCup era (2007-present); most recent: Tony Finau defeated Cameron Smith at Liberty National Golf Club in 2021
- Four players who entered the week outside of the top 70 move inside the top 70 to qualify for next week's BMW Championship: Lucas Glover (T3), Adam Scott (T5), Andrew Putnam (T5) and Wyndham Clark (T28); Of players who made the cut, Brendon Todd finished 67th to move outside the top 70

- Wins first career PGA TOUR win in 56th TOUR start at the age of 25 years, 11 months, 29 days in first FedExCup Playoffs appearance; Becomes the second player to win a FedExCup Playoffs event in first Playoffs appearance (other: Xander Schauffele, 2017 TOUR Championship)
- Moves to 1-2 in playoff appearances on TOUR; among three runner-ups this season, lost in playoffs at the Farmers Insurance Open and PGA Championship; one of two players with multiple playoff losses in 2021-22 (other: Patrick Cantlay, WM Phoenix Open, RBC Heritage)

^{*}Defeated Sepp Straka on the third playoff hole (par-3 No.11) with a bogey-4

- First player since 2011 to win a sudden-death playoff with a bogey (Sean O'Hair defeated Kris Blanks on first playoff hole of the 2011 RBC Canadian Open)
- First player to make the FedEx St. Jude Championship (FedExCup-era) his maiden PGA TOUR win
- Second player to win first TOUR title in a FedExCup Playoffs event (other: Camilo Villegas, 2008 BMW Championship); Villegas went on to win the TOUR Championship in his next start
- 13th first-time winner of the season, the most in a season since 2018-19 (14)
- In one previous start at TPC Southwind, finished T8 at the 2021 WGC-FedEx St. Jude Invitational after rounds of 66-66-67-69
- Ninth top-10 of the season, second-most of any player (10, Patrick Cantlay, Matt Fitzpatrick)
- Led the field in Strokes Gained: Tee to Green (9.391) Strokes Gained: Approach The Green (7.733)
- Reigning Arnold Palmer Award winner for PGA TOUR Rookie of the Year, was not eligible for the FedExCup
 Playoffs in 2020-21; Joined the PGA TOUR as a Special Temporary Member and collected enough non-member
 FedExCup points to earn full-time membership for the 2021-22 season (only a win would have made him eligible
 for the Playoffs)

Miscellaneous Notes

- In his first playoff on TOUR, **Sepp Straka** finishes runner-up for his fourth top-10 of the season, moving to No. 8 in the FedExCup; has never made it past the first FedExCup Playoffs event in three previous seasons; missed six straight cuts entering the week; reaches four top-10s on a season for the first time in his career; was seeking to become the ninth multiple winner this season
- Adam Scott (T5), who entered the week No. 77 in the FedExCup, moves to No. 45 to advance to next week's BMW Championship for the first time since 2020; T5 marks his 19th top-10 in a FedExCup Playoffs event, the second most of any player (23, Dustin Johnson); seeks to qualify for the TOUR Championship for the ninth time and first since 2019
- **Trey Mullinax** (T5), who entered the week No. 70, moved to No. 40 in the FedExCup and will make his first start in the BMW Championship in his second Playoffs berth
- Tony Finau (T5) posts 68 for his 13th consecutive round in the 60s on TOUR and moves to No. 5 in the FedExCup; was seeking to become the first player to win three straight starts on TOUR since Dustin Johnson in the 2016-17 season (The Genesis Invitational, WGC-Mexico Championship, WGC-Dell Technologies Match Play
- **Collin Morikawa** (T5) records four rounds in the 60s for the first time since The Genesis Invitational in February; T5 marks his eighth top-10 of the season and he moves to No. 20 in the FedExCup
- Matt Fitzpatrick (T5) records 10th top-10 of the season to tie Patrick Cantlay for most top-10s this season
- Prior to the start of the final round, Cameron Smith (T13) was assessed a two-stroke penalty for a breach of Rule 14.7 (playing ball from the wrong place) on hole No. 4 during the third round as he was operating under Rule 17.1 (when ball is in penalty area). Smith's score was adjusted from 199 (-11) to 201 (-9). Smith finished T13 in his first start since winning The Open Championship, his third win of the season
