Things to Know

- Xander Schauffele cards a final-round even-par 70 to defeat Kurt Kitayama by one stroke at the Genesis Scottish Open
- Schauffele earns his seventh PGA TOUR win in his 135th start at the age of 28 years, 8 months, 15 days; he joins Scottie Scheffler (4) and Sam Burns (3) with three or more wins this season
- A recent winner of the Travelers Championship, Schuaffele wins back-to-back starts for the second time in his career
- Schauffele improves to 2-for-6 when attempting to convert a 54-hole lead on the PGA TOUR
- Kitayama, a two-time DP World Tour winner, finishes runner-up for the second time this season on the PGA TOUR
- As the top three players not otherwise exempt who finished in the top 10 this week, Kitayama, Brandon Wu and Jamie Donaldson gain entry into The Open Championship
- The par-4 18th hole played at 4.617 this week, the toughest hole in a non-major since 2007 (No. 18/Doral/2007/4.625)

- Earns his seventh PGA TOUR title in his 135th start at the age of 28 years, 8 months, 15 days
- With the win, collects 500 FedExCup points and moves from No. 8 to No. 3 in the FedExCup standings
- Following his win at the Travelers Championship, wins in back-to-back starts for the second time in his career (2018 WGC-HSBC Champions, 2019 Sentry Tournament of Champions)
- PGA TOUR wins (7): 2017 A Military Tribute at The Greenbrier, 2017 TOUR Championship, 2018 WGC-HSBC Champions, 2019 Sentry Tournament of Champions, 2022 Zurich Classic of New Orleans (with Patrick Cantlay), 2022 Travelers Championship, 2022 Genesis Scottish Open
- Is one of seven multiple winners this season and joins Scottie Scheffler (4) and Sam Burns (3) with three or more wins
- Becomes the fifth American winner of the Genesis Scottish Open, joining Michael Allen (1989), Tom Lehman (1997), Phil Mickelson (2013) and Rickie Fowler (2015)
- Improves to 2-for-6 with the 54-hole lead/co-lead (2022 Travelers Championship, 2022 Genesis Scottish Open)
- Becomes the first player to win in back-to-back starts on TOUR since Scottie Scheffler (2022 WGC-Dell Technologies Match Play, Masters Tournament)
- Victory is his seventh consecutive top 20 finish on TOUR
- Becomes the sixth third-round leader/co-leader to win the Genesis Scottish Open since 2010
- Becomes the 16th third-round leader/co-leader to win an individual stroke-play event on TOUR this season
- Won the JP McManus Pro-Am on Tuesday before his arrival at The Renaissance Club

- As the top three players not otherwise exempt who finished in the top 10 this week, **Kurt Kitayama** (2nd), **Brandon Wu** (T6) and **Jamie Donaldson** (T6) gain entry into The Open Championship
- Two-time DP World Tour winner **Kurt Kitayama** finishes one stroke behind Schauffele for his second runner-up finish on TOUR (T2/2022 Mexico Open at Vidanta)
- **Joohyung Kim** finishes a career-best third, two strokes behind Schauffele; previous-best finish on TOUR was T15 at the 2021 Puerto Rico Open
- First- and second-round leader Cameron Tringale (T6) picks up his career-high fifth top-10 finish of the season
- Reigning U.S. Open champion **Matt Fitzpatrick** (T6) has been inside the top 10 on the leaderboard in 17 of his last 21 rounds on TOUR
- **Jordan Smith** (T24) played the par-3 17th hole in 5-under this week (birdie-eagle-birdie-birdie); week highlighted by his second-round ace that resulted in a Genesis GV70; his caddie, Sam Matton, received a GV60
