Things to Know

- Jason Kokrak wins for a second time in the state of Texas in the 2021 calendar year (Charles Schwab Challenge)
- Kevin Tway birdies 72nd hole to claim best career TOUR finish since lone victory at the 2018 Fortinet Championship
- After setting the course record of 8-under 62 in round two, Scottie Scheffler claims career-best finish on the PGA TOUR in stroke play and second top-5 in as many starts (4th/World Wide Technology Championship at Mayakoba)
- Martin Trainer capitalizes on 10th made cut in last 71 starts with his second career top-10 finish
- Matthew Wolff records first ace on the PGA TOUR en route to his third top-15 finish of the season

- Closed with a 5-under 65 to claim his third career PGA TOUR title at the age of 36 years, 5 months, 23 days in his 260th start; previously won the 2020 THE CJ CUP @ SUMMIT and the 2021 Charles Schwab Challenge (Colonial Country Club in Fort Worth)
- To offset one bogey in the final round, made six birdies, including four-straight on Nos. 13-16
- With the win, collects 500 FedExCup points and moves to No. 7 in the standings
- His victory moves him from No. 29 in the Official World Golf Ranking to a projected position inside the top 25
- Wins in his eighth Hewlett Packard Enterprise Houston Open start; lone previous top-10 finish in the event was T9 in 2013 (Redstone Golf Club); in most recent start in the event before this week, missed the 54-hole cut in 2018 (Golf Club of Houston)
- Wins in his third start of the season (MC/Shriners Children's Open, T54/THE CJ CUP @ SUMMIT)

• Becomes the sixth player this season to come from behind in the final round to win and first since Lucas Herbert at the Butterfield Bermuda Championship

Additional Player Notes

- Making his third start at the Hewlett Packard Enterprise Houston Open (T32/2018, MC/2020), **Kevin Tway** (T2/-8) birdied his 72nd hole to claim his best finish since notching his lone career TOUR title (2018 Fortinet Championship); this week marks his ninth TOUR top-10 finish and first since the 2019 Travelers Championship (T5)
- After setting the course record of 8-under 62 during round two, 54-hole leader **Scottie Scheffler** (T2/-8) closed with birdies on two of his last three holes to post a 1-under 69 and claim his career-best finish on the PGA TOUR in a stroke-play event; comes off a solo-fourth at last week's World Wide Technology Championship at Mayakoba; was making his third start at the Hewlett Packard Enterprise Houston Open (T28/2019, T32/2020)
- Kramer Hickok (4th/-7) birdied two of his last three holes to finish with a 1-under 69 in his bid for a first career TOUR title in his 78th start; best TOUR finish is runner-up via an 8-hole playoff loss to Harris English at the 2021 Travelers Championship
- Highlighted by a 71'1" putt for birdie at the par-3 11th, Martin Trainer (T5/-6) sank 188' 1" total feet of putts in the final round en route to an even-par 70; T5 finish comes after missed cuts in two previous Hewlett Packard Enterprise Houston Open starts (2019, 2020); this week marks his 10th made-cut in 71 starts since his maiden victory at the 2019 Puerto Rico Open; best showing in that time frame in a full-field TOUR event before this week was T41/2019 THE PLAYERS Championship
- Looking to become the first multiple winner in the 2021-22 season (Sanderson Farms Championship), Sam Burns (T7/-5) closed with a 3-under 67 in his third consecutive Hewlett Packard Enterprise Houston Open start; after missing the cut in 2019, finished T7 last season; this week marks his fourth straight top-15 finish in as many starts (1st/Sanderson Farms Championship, T14/Shriners Children's Open, T5/THE CJ CUP @ SUMMIT)
- Making his first start in the event and fourth of the season, Matthew Wolff (T11/-4) used an ace at the par-3 ninth
 from 187 yards to get in with a 2-over 72; marks his first career ace on the PGA TOUR; was seeking his second
 career PGA TOUR title in his 53rd TOUR start (2019 3M Open); this week comes off a T2 at the Shriners Children's
 Open and T5 at last week's World Wide Technology Championship at Mayakoba in his last two TOUR starts
