TOURNAMENT STORYLINES

Six weeks remaining: Eight events over the next six weeks remain until the start of the FedExCup Playoffs. With 76 of the top 125 in the FedExCup standings not competing this week, the John Deere Classic provides an opportunity for players outside the top 125 to make a move before the end of the FedExCup Regular Season.

Sponsor exemptions: The John Deere Classic has a long history of offering sponsor exemptions to up-and-coming players. There are 17 players in the field this week that competed at the event on a sponsor exemption prior to joining the PGA TOUR:

Open Qualifying Series: The John Deere Classic is one of five events in the 2021-22 PGA TOUR Season that is part of The Open Qualifying Series. The top three players not otherwise exempt in the top 10 and ties will qualify for the 150th Open Championship at St Andrews. The first OQS event this season was the Arnold Palmer Invitational presented by Mastercard (Chris Kirk and Talor Gooch qualified) followed by the RBC Canadian Open (Wyndham Clark, Keith Mitchell). Next week, spots will be available at the Genesis Scottish Open (3, top 10) and Barbasol Championship (1, top 5).

PLAYER STORYLINES

2012 John Deere Classic champion **Zach Johnson** is making his 20th consecutive start at the John Deere Classic. Johnson, who serves on the tournament's Board of Directors, is a native of Cedar Rapids, Iowa, and played collegiately at Drake University in Des Moines.

2018 University of Illinois Graduate and PGA TOUR rookie **Nick Hardy** is making his third start in the event after competing as a sponsor exemption in 2017 and 2018. Hardy returned from a wrist injury at the RBC Canadian Open after six weeks off and has moved from No. 194 to No. 137 in the FedExCup standings since returning, as he tries to qualify for the FedExCup Playoffs for the first time. He is coming off his first career top-10 on TOUR at last week's Travelers Championship (T8).

Jason Day, who made his PGA TOUR debut at the 2006 John Deere Classic, is making his first start in the event since 2011. Day is currently No. 108 in the FedExCup standings, has qualified for the FedExCup Playoffs in each season since joining the PGA TOUR in 2008 (14 straight seasons).

Three-time John Deere Classic champion **Steve Stricker** was scheduled to compete but withdrew on Tuesday of tournament week; his unrescinded sponsor exemption went to **Morgan Hoffmann**. Hoffmann lost his status on the PGA TOUR last week after failing to reach the minimum number of points to retain his card (68th/Travelers Championship) and has since moved to the 151-200 category on the Korn Ferry Tour.

Maverick McNealy, who competed at the 2017 John Deere Classic as an amateur (T44), is No. 42 in the FedExCup standings, the second-highest position of any player in the field. McNealy has qualified for the BMW Championship in each of his first two seasons on TOUR but has never advanced to the TOUR Championship. A two-time runner-up on TOUR, McNealy is in search of his first career victory and would move to No. 17 in the FedExCup standings with a win.

Six players have qualified for the FedExCup Playoffs in each season since the inception in 2007, and two of the six are in the field this week: **Brandt Snedeker** and **Charley Hoffman**. Both players are currently outside the top 125 in the FedExCup standings and have six weeks remaining to move up and keep their streaks alive. Snedeker enters the week at No. 170 in the FedExCup standings, while Hoffman is No. 178.

Two players have won this season on TOUR: **Ryan Brehm** and **Chad Ramey**. Brehm won the Puerto Rico Open by six strokes, the largest margin of victory by any player this season, while Ramey, a PGA TOUR rookie, won the Corales Puntacana Championship. Seven players have won multiple titles this season, including Xander Schauffele, who earned his second at last week's Travelers Championship. Schauffele is also the most recent player to win twice in his rookie season, doing so in 2016-17.

FEDEXCUP and SEASON STORYLINES

Last time out: Xander Schauffele won the Travelers Championship by two strokes over Sahith Theegala and J.T. Poston, earning his sixth career PGA TOUR title and second of the season. Theegala, who recorded the best finish of his PGA TOUR career, made a double bogey at the 72nd hole to fall out of the lead.

No. 1: World No. 1 and FedExCup leader Scottie Scheffler finished T2 at the U.S. Open to set the PGA TOUR record for most official money earned in a season at \$12,896,849 (previous: \$12,030,465/Jordan Spieth/2014-15). With his third runner-up finish of the season, the four-time TOUR winner became the fourth player (eighth instance) since the start of the 2000 season to record four or more wins and three or more runner-up finishes in a season, joining Tiger Woods (4), Phil Mickelson (2) and Jordan Spieth.
