Things to Know

- J.T. Poston wins the John Deere Classic by three strokes to earn his second PGA TOUR victory and first since 2019
- Poston records the third wire-to-wire victory in tournament history and second on TOUR this season
- Christiaan Bezuidenhout and Emiliano Grillo finish runner-up in their John Deere Classic debuts
- Poston, Bezuidenhout and Grillo earn spots in The Open Championship via the Open Qualifying Series

- Wins his second career PGA TOUR victory in his 155th start (2019 Wyndham Championship)
- Collects 500 points and moves from No. 66 to No. 22 in the FedExCup standings
- Third wire-to-wire victor in tournament history and first since David Frost in 1992

- Second wire-to-wire winner on TOUR this season (Joaquin Niemann/The Genesis Invitational)
- Moves to 1-for-3 with the 54-hole lead/co-lead on TOUR

- Becomes the 15th player to convert a 54-hole lead/co-lead on TOUR into victory this season and third in as many weeks (Matt Fitzpatrick/U.S. Open, Xander Schauffele/Travelers Championship)
- With the win and a T2 at last week's Travelers Championship, becomes the first player to finish runner-up and win the following week since Dustin Johnson in 2020 (T2/Houston Open, Won/Masters Tournament)

- Additional highlights this week include matching his lowest 18-hole score on TOUR with a 62 in round one (R1/2019 Barbasol Championship/T29, R4/2019 Wyndham Championship/Won, R1/2022 Travelers Championship/T2)
- Led the field in Strokes Gained: Tee To Green (13.410) and Strokes Gained: Around the Green (5.950)
- Wins in his fifth John Deere Classic appearance and marks first event top-10 (previous best: T64/2017)
- Fourth top-10 in 24 starts this season: T3/RBC Heritage, T9/Wells Fargo Championship, T2/Travelers Championship

Open Qualifying Series (OQS)

- The top three players not otherwise exempt in the top 10 and ties qualify for the 150th Open Championship
- J.T. Poston, Christiaan Bezuidenhout and Emiliano Grillo (both T2) received the exemptions
- The John Deere Classic is one of five events in the 2021-22 PGA TOUR Season that is part of the OQS
- Talor Gooch and Chris Kirk qualified at the Arnold Palmer Invitational presented by Mastercard
- Keith Mitchell and Wyndham Clark received exemptions at the RBC Canadian Open
- Remaining events: Genesis Scottish Open (3, top 10) and Barbasol Championship (1, top 5)

Additional Notes

- Making his John Deere Classic debut, Christiaan Bezuidenhout (T2/-18) posted a bogey-free final round 5-under 66
 to finish runner-up with a career-best finish on TOUR (previous: 7th/Arnold Palmer Invitational presented by
 Mastercard)
- In search of his second PGA TOUR victory and first since the 2015 Fortinet Championship, **Emiliano Grillo** (T2/-18) earns his sixth career runner-up on TOUR and first since T2 at 2021 RBC Heritage
- 2018 University of Illinois Graduate and PGA TOUR rookie **Nick Hardy** (T30/-10) records the low round of the day with a 7-under 64; was making his third tournament start (T55/2017, T43/2018, T30/2022)
- **Kevin Streelman** (T41/-9) made a hole-in-one at No. 12, a 189-yard par-3 for his second ace on TOUR and first since the 2008 AT&T Byron Nelson
- In his 20th consecutive start in the John Deere Classic, 2012 champion and John Deere Classic Board member **Zach Johnson** finished T60 at 5-under 279
