**Today** – Any lingering areas of valley fog likely erodes by 7:30am with a mix of clouds and sun much of the day. Some thicker cloud cover is possible between 10am-4pm as a disturbance passes well south of the Quad Cities, however precipitation is not expected. Temperatures will reach the middle 80s this afternoon with southeasterly winds up to 10 mph. **Sunrise: 5:32am / Sunset: 8:39pm**

**Extended forecast** – Dry conditions expected tonight with some areas of fog possible again within the nearby river valleys. Limited concerns on Sunday as a warm front lifts north of the area. While moisture and instability will increase, the lack of a triggering mechanism likely keeps the day dry. The threat for precipitation likely returns on Monday with a potential T-storm complex moving into the region. Right now, the highest threat for precipitation resides north of the Quad Cities.
