Things to Know

- FedExCup leader and World No. 1 Scottie Scheffler holds a three-stroke lead over PLAYERS Championship winner Cameron Smith entering the final round of the Masters Tournament
- Both players in the final pairing (Scheffler and Smith) are in the top 10 in the Official World Golf Ranking and top five in the FedExCup; both have won multiple times on TOUR this season
- Scheffler has three wins in his last five starts on TOUR
- Five players have won the Masters after entering the week No. 1 in the Official World Golf Ranking
- Five players have won on TOUR in their first start as World No. 1
- 82-time PGA TOUR winner and five-time Masters Tournament champion Tiger Woods records a third-round 78, his highest score in 93 career rounds at the Masters

Final pairing in the final round: Scottie Scheffler (-9) and Cameron Smith (-6)

- Both players are:
 In the top 10 in the Official World Golf Ranking
 In the top five in the FedExCup standings
 Winners of multiple PGA TOUR events this season
- The last time the final group in the final round of a major championship met any of these criteria was at the 2015 PGA Championship, which met all three:

- There have been 15 PGA TOUR events played in the calendar year 2022; Scheffler and Smith have combined to win five of them

Third-Round Lead Notes

- 48 Third-round leaders/co-leaders to win the Masters Tournament (most recent: Hideki Matsuyama, 2021)
- 8 Third-round leaders/co-leaders to win on TOUR in 2021-22 (most recent: J.J. Spaun, Valero Texas Open)

Scottie Scheffler (1st/-9)

Leads by three strokes after 54 holes

- Third consecutive year that a player has entered the final round of the Masters with a lead of three strokes or more
 2022: 3, Scottie Scheffler

2021: 4, Hideki Matsuyama (won by 1)

2020: 4, Dustin Johnson (won by 5)

- Third career 54-hole lead/co-lead on TOUR and first in a major (0-for-2 to date: 2020 American Express, 2021 Houston Open)
- In the top 10 after each of the last 10 major championship rounds (R2-R4/2021 U.S. Open, R1-R4/2021 Open Championship, R1-R3/2022 Masters Tournament)
- Only player with three under-par scores through three rounds (69-67-71)

Three-time winner this season

- Leads the PGA TOUR with three wins this season; all three have come in his last five starts (WM Phoenix Open, Arnold Palmer Invitational presented by Mastercard, WGC-Dell Technologies Match Play)
- Last player to win on the PGA TOUR and win a major in his next start: Jordan Spieth, 2017 Travelers Championship and Open Championship
- Last player to win four times in a six-start stretch on the PGA TOUR: Jason Day, 2015 (4 in 6: RBC Canadian Open, PGA Championship, FedEx St. Jude Championship, BMW Championship)
- Last player to win in consecutive PGA TOUR starts: Patrick Cantlay, 2021 BMW Championship and TOUR Championship
- Last player to win in consecutive PGA TOUR starts during the FedExCup Regular Season: Brendon Todd, 2019 Bermuda Championship and World Wide Technology Championship at Mayakoba

FedExCup leader and World No. 1

- No. 1 in both the FedExCup standings and Official World Golf Ranking (first start as World No. 1)
- Fourth time World No. 1 has held at least a share of the lead after a round on TOUR this season (Jon Rahm/R3/Sentry Tournament of Champions, Rahm/R2/Farmers Insurance Open, Scheffler/R2-R3/Masters Tournament)
- Sixth time in the last 11 rounds at the Masters that World No. 1 has held at least a share of the lead (Dustin Johnson/R1-R4/2020, Scheffler/R2-R3/2022)
- World No. 1 has won the Masters five times: Ian Woosnam/1991, Fred Couples/1992, Tiger Woods/2001, Woods/2002, Dustin Johnson/2020
- Last World No. 1 to win on TOUR: Dustin Johnson, 2020 Masters Tournament
- Five players have won in their first start as World No. 1 (including one at the Masters):
Dustin Johnson, 2017 WGC-Mexico Championship
Adam Scott, 2014 Charles Schwab Challenge
Vijay Singh, 2004 RBC Canadian Open
David Duval, 1999 BellSouth Classic
Ian Woosnam, 1991 Masters Tournament
- No Masters Tournament winner has entered the week No. 1 in the FedExCup standings
- Last FedExCup leader to win on TOUR: Scheffler, two weeks ago at the WGC-Dell Technologies Match Play

Cameron Smith (2nd/-6)

- Finished T2 at the 2020 Masters (held a share of the second-round lead)
- Three top-10s in his last four starts at the event (T5/2018, T2/2020, T10/2021)
- Two wins on the PGA TOUR this season: Sentry Tournament of Champions and THE PLAYERS Championship (most recent start)
- One of four players with multiple wins on the PGA TOUR this season, along with Scottie Scheffler (3), Sam Burns (2) and Hideki Matsuyama (2)
- Tiger Woods (2001) is the only player to win THE PLAYERS Championship and the Masters in the same year
- Last player to win on the PGA TOUR and win a major in his next start: Jordan Spieth, 2017 Travelers Championship and Open Championship
- Last player to win in consecutive PGA TOUR starts: Patrick Cantlay, 2021 BMW Championship and TOUR Championship
- Last player to win in consecutive PGA TOUR starts during the FedExCup Regular Season: Brendon Todd, 2019 Bermuda Championship and World Wide Technology Championship at Mayakoba

Miscellaneous notes

- 82-time PGA TOUR winner and five-time Masters champion Tiger Woods enters the final round T41 following a third-round 78, his highest score in 93 career rounds at the event
- Defending champion **Hideki Matsuyama** enters the final round T14; last player to successfully defend title at the Masters: Tiger Woods (2002)
