Things to Know

- FedExCup leader and World No. 1 Scottie Scheffler wins the Masters Tournament, earning his first major championship title and fourth career PGA TOUR victory; all four wins have come in his last six starts
- Scheffler becomes the first player to win four times in a six-start stretch on the PGA TOUR since Jason Day in 2015
- Scheffler becomes the sixth player to win in his first PGA TOUR start as World No. 1 and sixth World No. 1 to win the Masters
- 82-time PGA TOUR winner and five-time Masters champion Tiger Woods finishes 47th in his first start on the PGA TOUR since the 2020 Masters
- In his eighth attempt at completing the Career Grand Slam, Rory McIlroy finishes runner-up (best result in 14 appearances at the event) and records his low 18-hole score at the Masters (64)

Four-time winner this season

- First player to win in consecutive PGA TOUR starts during the FedExCup Regular Season since Brendon Todd at the 2019 Bermuda Championship and World Wide Technology Championship at Mayakoba

Miscellaneous notes

- **Scottie Scheffler** became the second player in the ShotLink era to four-putt the 72nd hole and win the event, joining David Toms (2003 Wells Fargo Championship)
- 82-time PGA TOUR winner and five-time Masters champion **Tiger Woods** finishes 47th in his first start on the PGA TOUR since the 2020 Masters Tournament (508 days passed between the final round in 2020 and first round in 2022, the second-longest break between official PGA TOUR rounds of Woods' career)
- **Rory McIlroy** (2nd/-7) records an 8-under 64, tying the lowest final-round score in tournament history (eighth instance; first since Jordan Spieth in 2018); marks McIlroy's best finish at the Masters and best in a major since a runner-up at the 2018 Open Championship
- McIlroy was T9 and 10 strokes back of the lead entering the final round
- Playing in the final pairing, 2022 PLAYERS Championship winner **Cameron Smith** records a final-round 73 to finish T3, his fourth consecutive top-10 at the Masters; Smith moves to No. 2 in the FedExCup standings
- Defending champion **Hideki Matsuyama** finishes T14; last player to successfully defend title at the Masters: Tiger Woods (2002)
