New tournament: The Mexico Open at Vidanta is an official FedExCup event, added to the PGA TOUR schedule in 2021-22, and the third official event in the modern era of the TOUR to be held in Mexico.

Rahm in the field: World No. 2 Jon Rahm, the highest-ranked player in the field, is making his 11th start of the season and first since the Masters Tournament (T27). Rahm's career-low score on the PGA TOUR came at the 2020 WGC-Mexico Championship (61/R3/Club de Golf Chapultepec), which he matched at the 2022 Sentry Tournament of Champions (R3).

Ancer back in Mexico: Abraham Ancer, the highest-ranked player from Mexico in the Official World Golf Ranking (No. 20), is one of four players from Mexico to win on TOUR (Victor Regalado, Cesar Sanudo, Carlos Ortiz). He has three top-10s in seven starts at the World Wide Technology Championship and made three starts at the WGC-Mexico Championship (best: T12/2020).

Record number from Mexico: 10 players from Mexico are in the field, the most of any PGA TOUR event on record (1983-present), including both active PGA TOUR members from Mexico (Abraham Ancer, Carlos Ortiz). Isidro Benitez, Santiago De la Fuente*, Roberto Diaz, Armando Favela, Manuel Inman*, Jose Cristobal Islas*, Alvaro Ortiz and Jose Antonio Safa* received sponsor exemptions (* = PGA TOUR debut). Alvaro Ortiz, brother of Carlos, won the Mexico Open in 2021 as a PGA TOUR Latinoamerica event and currently plays on the Korn Ferry Tour. The Ortiz brothers have competed in the same PGA TOUR event six times, most recently at the 2021 U.S. Open (both MC). One of Carlos' two career runner-ups on TOUR came with Alvaro in the field (2019 World Wide Technology Championship).

PGA TOUR winners in Mexico: There are six players in the field that have won PGA TOUR events in Mexico, including Patrick Reed, who won the 2020 WGC-Mexico Championship, and five winners of the World Wide Technology Championship at Mayakoba (Johnson Wagner/2011, John Huh/2012, Graeme McDowell/2015, Pat Perez/2016 and Brendon Todd/2019).

PLAYER STORYLINES

Carlos Ortiz is 83-under when playing in Mexico, the second-best of any player since the start of the 2014-15 season (Justin Thomas/-90). **Abraham Ancer** is third at 78-under.

Charles Howell III has made 15 starts in Mexico since the inception of the World Wide Technology Championship at Mayakoba in 2007, the most of any player in that span.

Adam Long (67.00) has the lowest scoring average of any player in Mexico since the inception of the World Wide Technology Championship at Mayakoba in 2007. Viktor Hovland, who won back-to-back at Mayakoba (2020, 2021), is second at 67.17.

15 players have made at least one start in Mexico on the PGA TOUR, the Korn Ferry Tour and PGA TOUR Latinoamerica.

Three players in the field earned their first career top-five finish on the PGA TOUR last week at the Zurich Classic of New Orleans (all T4): **Taylor Moore**, with partner Matthew NeSmith, and **David Lipsky** and **Aaron Rai**, who played together.

Patrick Flavin, one of the four Open Qualifiers for the event, is making his fourth start on the PGA TOUR this season (fifth career) and TOUR-best third this season as an Open Qualifier. He has made the cut in all three starts this season, including both as an Open Qualifier (Butterfield Bermuda Championship/T17 and Puerto Rico Open/T22) and one as a sponsor exemption (Corales Puntacana Championship/T54). All four of Flavin's starts this season have come outside the United States. A 2018 graduate of Miami (Ohio) University, Flavin won the 2019 Bupa Match Play in Riviera Maya, Mexico, on PGA TOUR Latinoamerica.

Three players in the field are competing out of the Major Medical Extension category. **Seung-Yul Noh** has two starts remaining to earn 217 FedExCup points; **Jonas Blixt** has five remaining to earn 237 points. **Danny Lee** is competing out of the category for the remainder of the season after earning the required number of points earlier in the season.

The last man in the field is **Derek Ernst** (No. 35 in the Reorder Category).

FEDEXCUP and SEASON STORYLINES

Last time out: Patrick Cantlay and Xander Schauffele teamed up to win the Zurich Classic of New Orleans, becoming the first team to win the event wire-to-wire. Cantlay had lost in a playoff the week prior, becoming the first player to lose in a playoff one week and win a tournament the next since Dustin Johnson in 2020 (BMW Champ, TOUR Champ).

No. 1: FedExCup leader and World No. 1 Scottie Scheffler has won four times in his last seven starts. Scheffler earned his first major championship title at the Masters Tournament, becoming the first player since Jason Day in 2015 to win four times in a six-start stretch. Scheffler joined Tiger Woods (eight times) as players to win four times in a PGA TOUR season, including a major and a World Golf Championships event. With his third TOUR victory at the WGC-Dell Technologies Match Play, Scheffler took over the No. 1 position in the Official World Golf Ranking on March 27 for the first time in his career. Scheffler is the 25th player to hold the World No. 1 title (est. 1986) and sixth-youngest. Scheffler also holds the lead in the FedExCup standings, becoming the first FedExCup leader to win on TOUR (outside of the TOUR Championship) since Justin Thomas at the 2020 WGC-FedEx St. Jude Invitational.

Youth movement: On March 6 (and March 13), all of the top five in the Official World Golf Ranking were younger than 30 for the first time (est. 1986). No. 5 Patrick Cantlay has since turned 30.

Top players taking the title: 14 of the 27 PGA TOUR events this season have been won by players who began the tournament in the top 25 of the Official World Golf Ranking (most recent: Patrick Cantlay/4 and Xander Schauffele/12, Zurich Classic of New Orleans), with the highest ranking by a winner this season at the Masters Tournament, where Scottie Scheffler became the first World No. 1 to win on TOUR since 2020.

First-time winners: Nine players have earned their first PGA TOUR victory this season, including seven in the last 13 weeks. Most recently, J.J. Spaun won the Valero Texas Open, winning on TOUR for the first time in his 147th career start.
