Things to Know

- The Mexico Open at Vidanta, previously known as Abierto Mexicano de Golf and hosted by multiple Tours, dates to 1944
- World No. 2 Jon Rahm holds first-round lead/co-lead for ninth time on PGA TOUR
- Monday qualifier Bryson Nimmer is one of six first-round co-leaders
- Kurt Kitayama is the only first-round co-leader who played in the afternoon wave
- First six-way tie for the lead after any round on TOUR since 2019 Travelers Championship (R1)
- 10 players from Mexico are in the field, the most on record in any PGA TOUR event

Jonathan Byrd: Sixth time with first-round lead/co-lead, converting for one win (2011 Sentry Tournament of Champions)

Jon Rahm: Ninth time with first-round lead/co-lead, converting for one win (2018 American Express)

Brendon Todd: Second time with first-round lead/co-lead (2020 PGA Championship/T17) **Trey Mullinax**: Second time with first round lead/co-lead (2017 Puerto Rico Open/T44)

Bryson Nimmer: First time with a lead/co-lead after any round on TOUR

Kurt Kitayama: Second time with first-round lead/co-lead on TOUR (2022 Honda Classic/3rd)

Jonathan Byrd (T1/-7)

- Posts front-nine 29 (-6) en route to opening-round 64 (-7)
- Marks second round of 64 this season (64/R1/The RSM Classic/T37)
- One top-10 finish in 11 starts this season (T9/AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am)
- Most recent of five TOUR titles was 2011 Sentry Tournament of Champions
- Playing out of past champion beyond 150 in 2020-21 FedExCup category

Jon Rahm (T1/-7)

- Hit 12 of 13 fairways and 15 of 18 greens with 28 putts en route to his 18th round of 64 or better on TOUR (427 rounds)
- Bogey-free 64 included five birdies and an eagle at the 311-yard par-4 7th hole, where he drove the green and holed a putt from 41 feet, 8 inches; marks his 43rd bogey-free round on TOUR
- For the eighth time since 2018, fires an opening round of 64 or better, most of any player on TOUR in that period

Brendon Todd (T1/-7)

- Posts seven birdies for bogey-free 64, including four consecutive birdies on Nos. 4-7
- Marks his lowest first-round score on TOUR since 64 at 2020 WGC-FedEx St. Jude Invitational/T15
- Lone top-10 in 16 starts this season came at Valero Texas Open (T8)
- Most recent of three PGA TOUR titles came in Mexico (2020 World Wide Technology Championship at Mayakoba)

Trey Mullinax (T1/-7)

- Highlight of his 7-under 64 was eagle at par-4 7th hole when his tee shot finished 7 feet, 7 inches from the hole
- 64 marks his second-lowest opening-round score in his 99th TOUR start (63/2017 Puerto Rico Open/T44)
- Makes 17th start with six made cuts in 16 prior starts this season; T4 at Sanderson Farms Championship his lone top-10
- Matches his low round of the season (64/R3/Sanderson Farms Championship)

Bryson Nimmer (T1/-7)

- Monday qualified in Texas on April 18 with a round of 65 to get into the field this week
- After starting on No. 10, dropped shots on Nos. 1 and 2 before playing his last five holes 5-under en route to 64, his lowest score in 27 rounds on the PGA TOUR
- Making his ninth TOUR start and fourth this season; prior starts this season include Puerto Rico Open (69th), Corales Puntacana Championship (T11 after he successfully Monday qualified) and RBC Heritage (MC)
- Made his TOUR debut at 2019 Puerto Rico Open (T47) as an amateur

Kurt Kitayama (T1/-7)

- First-year PGA TOUR member has made five cuts in 13 starts this season; seeks second career top-10 on TOUR (3rd/2022 Honda Classic)
- Also shot 64 in opening round of 2022 Honda Classic where he finished third, his lone top-10 on TOUR
- Californian is a two-time DP World Tour winner (2018 AfrAsia Bank Mauritius Open, 2019 Oman Open); was one of six players in a sudden-death playoff at 2019 Turkish Airlines Open, eventually won by Tyrrell Hatton
- UNLV product turned professional in 2015 and competed on the Korn Ferry Tour, posting T13 in his first-ever event with rounds of 67-69-63 at the Air Capital Classic
- PGA TOUR debut came at 2016 Shriners Children's Open (MC) after making nine birdies to shoot 63 and advance via Monday qualifying

Miscellaneous notes

- Aaron Rai (T7/-6) comes into this week off a T4 at last week's Zurich Classic of New Orleans (partnering David Lipsky), one of two top-10 results on TOUR (T6/2022 Farmers Insurance Open)
- Aaron Wise (T7/-6) owns two opening rounds of 65 or better this season both in Mexico (63/World Wide Technology Championship at Mayakoba)
- PGA TOUR rookie **Sahith Theegala** (T7/-6) matches his lowest opening round on TOUR (64/2021 Sanderson Farms Championship/T8)
- **Scott Brown**'s (T7/-6) best result in seven starts this season is T28 at Corales Puntacana Championship; since joining the TOUR in 2012 he has never gone a season without posting at least one top-10 finish
- Scott Gutschewski (T21/-4) aced No. 5 with a 7-iron, his second hole-in-one on TOUR (2009 Turning Stone Resort Championship)
- After starting the tournament double bogey, bogey **Kiradech Aphibarnrat** (T61/-1) aced the 189-yard fifth hole with a 5-iron for his first hole-in-one on the PGA TOUR; played the five par-3s in 4-under
- Major champions in the field: Jon Rahm (T1/-7), Patrick Reed (T21/-4), Gary Woodland (T21/-4), Graeme McDowell (T61/-1), Jason Dufner (T96/+1)
