Things to Know

- World No. 2 Jon Rahm, highest-ranked player in the field, leads by two-strokes at midway point
- Rahm holds the 36-hole lead/co-lead for the seventh time in his career and is 0-for-6 to date converting to victory
- Eight players within four shots of the lead through two rounds seek their first career TOUR victory
- Four of the five Major champions in the field advance to the weekend
- Alvaro Ortiz (T25) is best of the 10 Mexican players in the field this week and one of the three to make the cut

- Owns four top-10s this season (most recent: T9/World Golf Championships-Dell Technologies Match Play)
- Six-time PGA TOUR winner: 2017 Farmers Insurance Open, 2018 The American Express, 2019 Zurich Classic of New Orleans (with Ryan Palmer), 2020 the Memorial Tournament presented by Workday, 2020 BMW Championship, 2021 U.S. Open

• PGA TOUR rookie **Alex Smalley** (2nd/-10) records back-to-back rounds of 66; seeks first TOUR title in 25th career start and with a victory would become 10th first-time winner this season (best: T2/2022 Corales Puntacana Championship)

- Entering the week, **Adam Long** (T3/-9) had the lowest scoring average of any player in Mexico since the inception of the World Wide Technology Championship at Mayakoba in 2007 (67.00)
- 133 total represents **Andrew Novak's** (T3/-9) career-best opening 36-hole score on TOUR; shot 135 through the opening two rounds of the 2019 A Military Tribute at The Greenbrier (T36)
- Cameron Champ (T3/-9) leads the field in driving distance (326.1) through 36 holes; ranks first on TOUR this season (321.1)
- Six first-round co-leaders through 36 holes: Jon Rahm (1st/-12), Trey Mullinax (T3/-9), Jonathan Byrd (T9/-8), Kurt Kitayama (T9/-8), Bryson Nimmer (T37/-4), Brendon Todd (T37/-4)
