TOURNAMENT STORYLINES

Quality winners in biggest events: 10 events that award 600 FedExCup points to the winner have been played since the start of the 2019-20 season, with two PLAYERS Championships and eight majors contested in that span. Nine of the 10 winners entered the week inside the top 25 of the Official World Golf Ranking (Phil Mickelson at 2021 PGA Championship: 115) and five entered the week No. 4 or higher. The average OWGR position of the 10 winners is 18.3 (76 without Mickelson).

Woods in the field: Tiger Woods, who returned from injury at the Masters Tournament in April for his first TOUR start since the 2020 Masters, is set to compete. Woods, who won the 2007 PGA Championship at Southern Hills Country Club the last time it hosted a major, is tied for the most PGA TOUR wins of all-time (82) and trails Jack Nicklaus' record of 18 major championships by three. Woods enters the week No. 237 in the FedExCup standings and No. 818 in the Official World Golf Ranking.

Heating up: 30 of the 44 events in the FedExCup Regular Season have concluded, with fewer than a third of the Regular Season remaining before the start of the FedExCup Playoffs. Among the six players that have qualified for the FedExCup Playoffs in each season since the inception in 2007, four are outside the top 125 in the standings with 12 weeks (14 events) to go (**bold** in field): Charley Hoffman, Phil Mickelson, Brandt Snedeker and **Bubba Watson** (others: **Matt Kuchar** and **Adam Scott**). Other notables outside the top 125 include **Justin Rose**, **Webb Simpson**, **Cameron Champ**, **Louis Oosthuizen**, **Bryson DeChambeau**, Harris English, and **Tiger Woods**.

PLAYER STORYLINES

The PGA of America announced on Saturday, May 14, that 2021 champion **Phil Mickelson** will not compete. The last time a defending champion did not play in a major was Rory McIlroy at the 2015 Open Championship. Mickelson last played on TOUR at the 2022 Farmers Insurance Open (MC).

Five players have won the Career Grand Slam and **Jordan Spieth** can become the sixth with a win. Spieth won the 2015 Masters Tournament, 2015 U.S. Open and 2017 Open Championship, and is making his sixth start in the PGA Championship since the 2017 Open (T28/2017, T12/2018, T3/2019, T71/2020, T30/2021).

Spieth, who has a win (RBC Heritage) and a runner-up (AT&T Byron Nelson) in his last two starts, enters the week No. 8 in the Official World Golf Ranking, his highest position since August 18, 2018 (8).

Brooks Koepka and **Rory McIlroy** have each recorded two PGA Championship titles and four major championship victories. Five players in history have won the PGA Championship three times or more: Jack Nicklaus (5), Walter Hagen (5), Tiger Woods (4), Sam Snead (3) and Gene Sarazen (3). 19 have won five or more majors (last player to reach that mark: Phil Mickelson).

Scottie Scheffler has 2,842 FedExCup points, the sixth-highest total during the FedExCup Regular Season since the points format changed in 2009. With a win, he would move to second-highest (3,442), trailing Jordan Spieth in 2014-15 (4,169).

For the second consecutive year, **K.H. Lee** is entering the PGA Championship having won the previous week's AT&T Byron Nelson. The last player to win a major and the week before was Rory McIlroy in 2014 (WGC-Bridgestone Inv., PGA Championship).

Five players are making their first major championship appearance of their careers, including three PGA TOUR members (denoted by an asterisk): **Kramer Hickok***, **Sadom Kaewkanjana**, **Jinichiro Kozuma**, **Chad Ramey*** and **Adam Schenk***. Hickok and Schenk both got into the field as alternates. k

FEDEXCUP and SEASON STORYLINES

Last time out: K.H. Lee won the AT&T Byron Nelson for the second consecutive year, becoming the third player this season to successfully defend a title. Lee is the first player to earn his first two victories on TOUR at the same tournament back-to-back since Daniel Berger (2016 and 2017 FedEx St. Jude Classic).

Top players taking the title: 15 of the 30 PGA TOUR events this season have been won by players who began the tournament in the top 25 of the Official World Golf Ranking (most recent: Jon Rahm, No. 2, Mexico Open at Vidanta), including nine of the last 13. The highest ranking by a winner this season came at the Masters Tournament, where Scottie Scheffler became the first World No. 1 to win on TOUR since 2020.

No. 1: FedExCup leader and World No. 1 Scottie Scheffler has won four times in his last eight starts. Scheffler earned his first major championship title at the Masters Tournament, becoming the first player since Jason Day in 2015 to win four times in a six-start stretch. Scheffler joined Tiger Woods (eight times) as players to win four times in a PGA TOUR season, including a major and a World Golf Championships event. With his third TOUR victory at the WGC-Dell Technologies Match Play, Scheffler took over the No. 1 position in the Official World Golf Ranking on March 27 for the first time in his career. Scheffler is the 25th player to hold the World No. 1 title (est. 1986) and sixth-youngest. Scheffler also holds the lead in the FedExCup standings, becoming the first FedExCup leader to win on TOUR (outside of the TOUR Championship) since Justin Thomas at the 2020 WGC-FedEx St. Jude Invitational.

Youth movement: On March 6 (and March 13), all of the top five in the Official World Golf Ranking were younger than 30 for the first time (est. 1986). No. 5 Patrick Cantlay has since turned 30.

First-time winners: Nine players have earned their first PGA TOUR victory this season, including seven in the last 16 weeks. Most recently, J.J. Spaun won the Valero Texas Open, winning on TOUR for the first time in his 147th career start.
