TOURNAMENT STORYLINES

Returning to Canada: The RBC Canadian Open returns after two years of cancellations due to the COVID-19 pandemic and will be contested at St. George's Golf & Country Club in Toronto. The tournament was last played in 2019 at Hamilton G&CC in Hamilton, Ontario, where Rory McIlroy carded a final-round 61 to win by seven strokes en route to his second FedExCup title.

For perspective: Three of the top 10 players in the current Official World Golf Ranking had not yet joined the PGA TOUR the last time the event was played. World No. 1 Scottie Scheffler missed the cut at the previous week's REX Hospital Open on the Korn Ferry Tour, No. 5 Collin Morikawa made his professional debut that week competing on a sponsor exemption and No. 7 Viktor Hovland earned low amateur honors the following week at the U.S. Open (T12).

Back at St. George's: St. George's Golf & Country Club has hosted the RBC Canadian Open five times before: 1933, 1949, 1960, 1968 and 2010. In 2010, Carl Pettersson won by one stroke over Dean Wilson. During the first and second rounds, groups will start on Nos. 1 and 9 (rather than 1 and 10) for logistical reasons and the golf course features five par 3s and three par 5s (par 70 total).

Rory defends his title: 2019 RBC Canadian Open champion Rory McIlroy seeks his first successful title defense on the PGA TOUR. McIlroy, a 20-time PGA TOUR winner, has played in 14 TOUR events to date as the defending champion and has finished in the top five three times, including in May at the Wells Fargo Championship (4th/2016 WGC-Dell Technologies Match Play, T4/2016 Wells Fargo Championship, 5th/2022 Wells Fargo Championship). McIlroy won three TOUR events in the 2019 calendar year that were canceled in 2020 (THE PLAYERS Championship returned in 2021; RBC Canadian Open, WGC-HSBC Champions were canceled in 2020 and 2021).

20 Canadians in the field: 20 players competing under the flag of Canada are scheduled to tee it up, with Canadians making up more than 12 percent of the field. The 2021-22 PGA TOUR member roster includes 10 players from Canada, third-most of any country outside the United States (14/England, 12/Australia). There are currently two Canadians in the top 100 of the Official World Golf Ranking: No. 31 Corey Conners and No. 77 Mackenzie Hughes. More information on the Canadians in the field can be found on the second page.

Open Qualifying Series: The RBC Canadian Open is one of five events in the 2021-22 PGA TOUR Season that is part of The Open Qualifying Series. The top two players not otherwise exempt in the top eight and ties will qualify for the 150th Open Championship at St Andrews. The first QOS event this season was the Arnold Palmer Invitational presented by Mastercard (Chris Kirk and Talor Gooch qualified). Remaining events: John Deere Classic, Genesis Scottish Open, Barbasol Championship.

Shane Lowry finished T2 at the 2019 RBC Canadian Open. Three worldwide starts later, Lowry won his first career major championship title at the Open Championship.

The Korn Ferry Tour's **Trevor Werbylo** is competing on a sponsor exemption. Werbylo is No. 8 on the Korn Ferry Tour Regular Season Points List, with the top 25 at the end of the Regular Season earning PGA TOUR cards. This is Werbylo's third career start on the PGA TOUR, with the previous two coming this season (MC/Fortinet Championship, 68th/Puerto Rico Open).

2022 Jack Nicklaus Award winner **Christopher Gotterup**, who just completed his senior season at the University of Oklahoma, is making his professional debut. Gotterup finished No. 7 in the 2022 PGA TOUR University Velocity Global Ranking, earning status on an international tour sanctioned by the PGA TOUR (either PGA TOUR Canada or PGA TOUR Latinoamerica).

FEDEXCUP and SEASON STORYLINES

Last time out: Billy Horschel earned his seventh career PGA TOUR title, winning the Memorial Tournament presented by Workday by four strokes over Aaron Wise. With the victory, Horschel moved into the top 10 of the FedExCup standings (No. 10) and United States team Presidents Cup standings (No. 8), and vaulted to a career-high 11th in the Official World Golf Ranking.

Rookie Update: There are three rookies in the top 30 of the FedExCup, each who have three or more top-10s: Cameron Young (No. 16), Davis Riley (No. 21) and Mito Pereira (No. 26). There has not been a PGA TOUR season in the FedExCup era (est. 2007) in which three or more rookies advanced to the TOUR Championship. Chad Ramey, No. 48 in the FedExCup, is the only rookie winner of the season.

Young kings: Two players have won three or more times this season: 25-year-olds Scottie Scheffler (4) and Sam Burns (3). This is the first season in which two players age 25 or younger have each won three or more times since 2017-18 (Justin Thomas, Bryson DeChambeau).

No. 1: FedExCup leader and World No. 1 Scottie Scheffler has won four times in his last 10 starts. Scheffler earned his first major championship title at the Masters Tournament, becoming the first player since Jason Day in 2015 to win four times in a six-start stretch. Scheffler joined Tiger Woods (eight times) as players to win four times in a PGA TOUR season, including a major and a World Golf Championships event. With his third TOUR victory at the WGC-Dell Technologies Match Play, Scheffler took over the No. 1 position in the OWGR on March 27 for the first time in his career. The last player to win five times in a season was Justin Thomas (2016-17).
