Things to Know

- Seeking his first career PGA TOUR title in his 107th start, Wyndham Clark gets up and down for par from a greenside bunker at No. 18 to maintain a one-stroke lead headed into the weekend
- Following his 6-under 64 in round one, England's Matt Fitzpatrick plays his last five holes in 4-over and trails Clark by a stroke for the second straight day
- Defending champion Rory McIlroy sits T2 in bid to successfully defend a PGA TOUR title for the first time
- World No. 1 and FedExCup leader Scottie Scheffler will begin round three just three strokes back at 4-under 136
- At 2-under 138, Nick Taylor and Aaron Cockerill lead the contingent of 19 Canadians in the field
- The RBC Canadian Open is being played for the first time since 2019 after two cancellations due to COVID-19

Wyndham Clark (1st/-7)

- After tying the second-lowest score of his PGA TOUR career with a 63 in round one, carded an even-par 70 to maintain a one-stroke lead for the second straight day
- Played his first 29 holes bogey-free, before taking three on his last seven holes in round two
- After hitting 16-of-18 greens in regulation in round one, found just eight in round two
- Takes a 36-hole lead/co-lead on the PGA TOUR for a second time (2020 Butterfield Bermuda Championship, finished P2)
- One top-10 this season (T10/Zurich Classic of New Orleans with partner Cameron Tringale)
- Best career finish on TOUR: P2, 2020 Bermuda Championship (lost in playoff to Brian Gay)

Miscellaneous notes

- Defending RBC Canadian Open champion **Rory McIlroy** offset two bogeys with six birdies to post a 2-under 68 and move to T2 at 6-under 134; in 14 prior attempts on TOUR, has yet to successfully defend a title; seeks a 21st career PGA TOUR title and second of the season (THE CJ CUP @ SUMMIT)
- After tying his career-low score on the PGA TOUR of 64 in round one, Matt Fitzpatrick (T2/-6) records a double-bogey-6 at No. 14 and bogeys on his last three holes en route to an even-par 70; in only previous RBC Canadian Open start, missed the cut at Glen Abbey GC in 2016; two of six top-10 finishes on TOUR this season came in his last three starts: T2/Wells Fargo Championship, T5/PGA Championship (MC/the Memorial Tournament presented by Workday)
- Coming off a T18 at last week's Memorial Tournament presented by Workday, **Keith Mitchell** (T2/-6) opened with a pair of 3-under 67s; seeks a fifth top-10 finish this season and second career PGA TOUR title (2019 Honda Classic)
- With matching 3-under 67s to open his first RBC Canadian Open, PGA TOUR rookie **Alex Smalley** (T2/-6) seeks his third top-10 finish of the season (T2/Corales Puntacana Championship, T6/Mexico Open at Vidanta); 2019 Duke University grad made his way to the TOUR this season via the Top 50 from the 2020-21 Korn Ferry Tour category
- Making his second start in the RBC Canadian Open (T56/2019), Jim Knous looks to improve on his best finish of the season, T11 at the Fortinet Championship; remains in search of his first win in his 37th career TOUR start
- Scottie Scheffler (T8/-4), Sam Burns (T8/-4) and Cameron Smith (T56/+1), Nos. 1-3 in the FedExCup standings, were grouped together for the first two rounds; Scheffler and Burns are making their first start since the Charles Schwab Challenge, where Burns defeated Scheffler in a playoff to earn his third win of the season (Scheffler: 4)
- **Cameron Smith** followed an opening-round 6-over 76 with a 5-under 65, marking the third time in his career to make a second-round improvement of 10-or-more strokes; entered round two at T135 and made the cut on the number
- Of the 20 Canadians who began this week's RBC Canadian Open, Nick Taylor and Aaron Cockerill are positioned best at 2-under 138 (T21)
